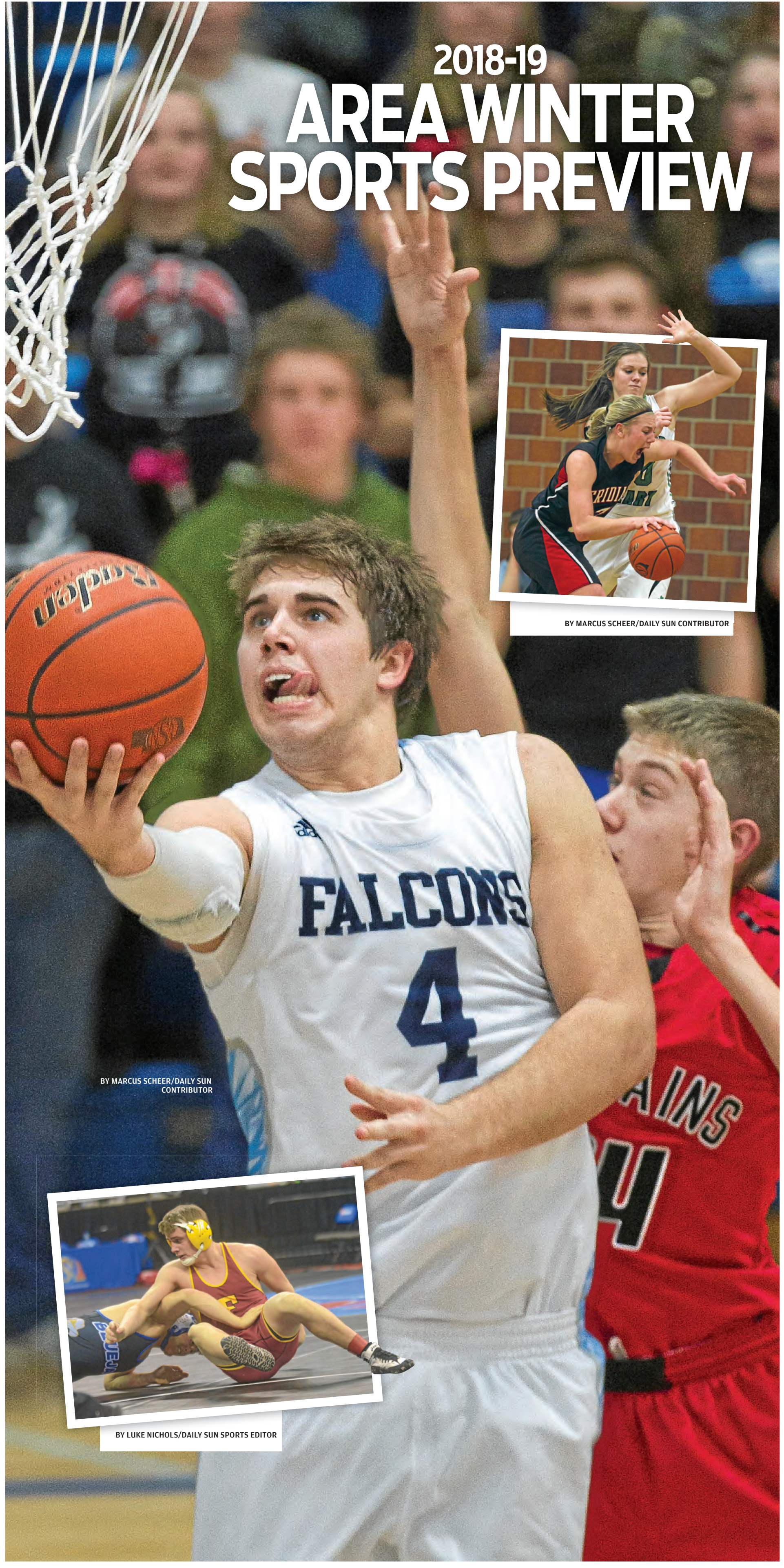

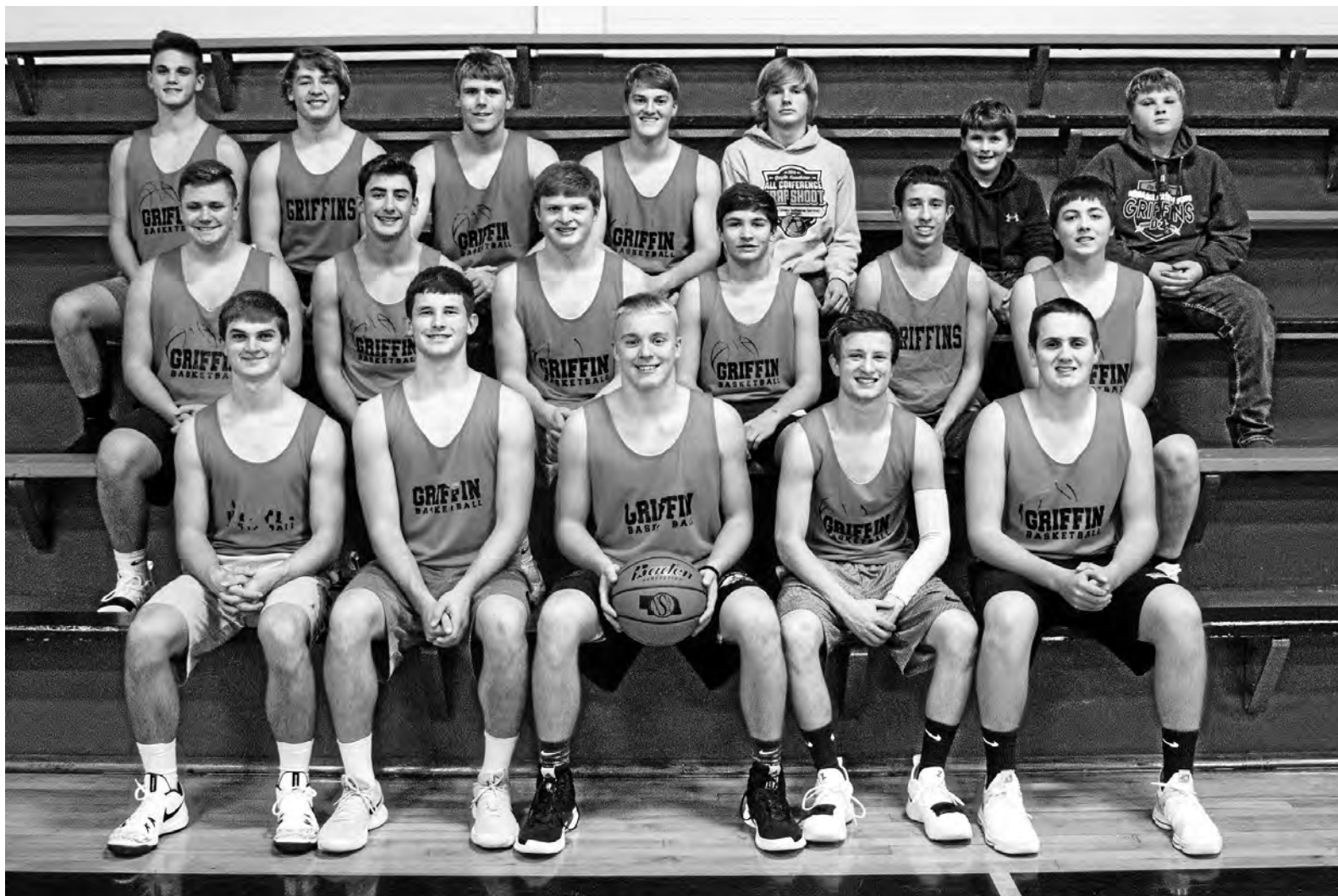

2018-19 outlook

The Diller-Odell boys basketball team will be under new leadership for the 2018-19 season.

Dylan Hinrichs takes over for long-time coach Eric

McMurray and he inherits a team that fell just short of a winning record last season.

Key returning players from that team will be William McLaughlin, Ryan Arnold and Bryston Warren.

"They have played a lot of minutes for the Griffins but now they will have to

be key cogs and not just role players," Hinrichs said. "They will be so important because they will be my leaders and it's important as a first year coach to have some important seniors."

Hinrichs also expects sophomore Austin Jurgens to make big strides.

"A strength of our team is we are very versatile," Hinrichs said. "We are mostly about 6' to 6'3 in five of our top seven players. Our weaknesses is that it will be interesting who steps up as a scorer for this team."

Hinrichs said their schedule will be difficult because

it includes arguably two of the top teams in Class D2 in Johnson-Brock and Falls City. He said Freeman and Tri County will also be difficult challenges.

"Our main goal is to win our subdistrict and have a shot in a district final," Hinrichs said.

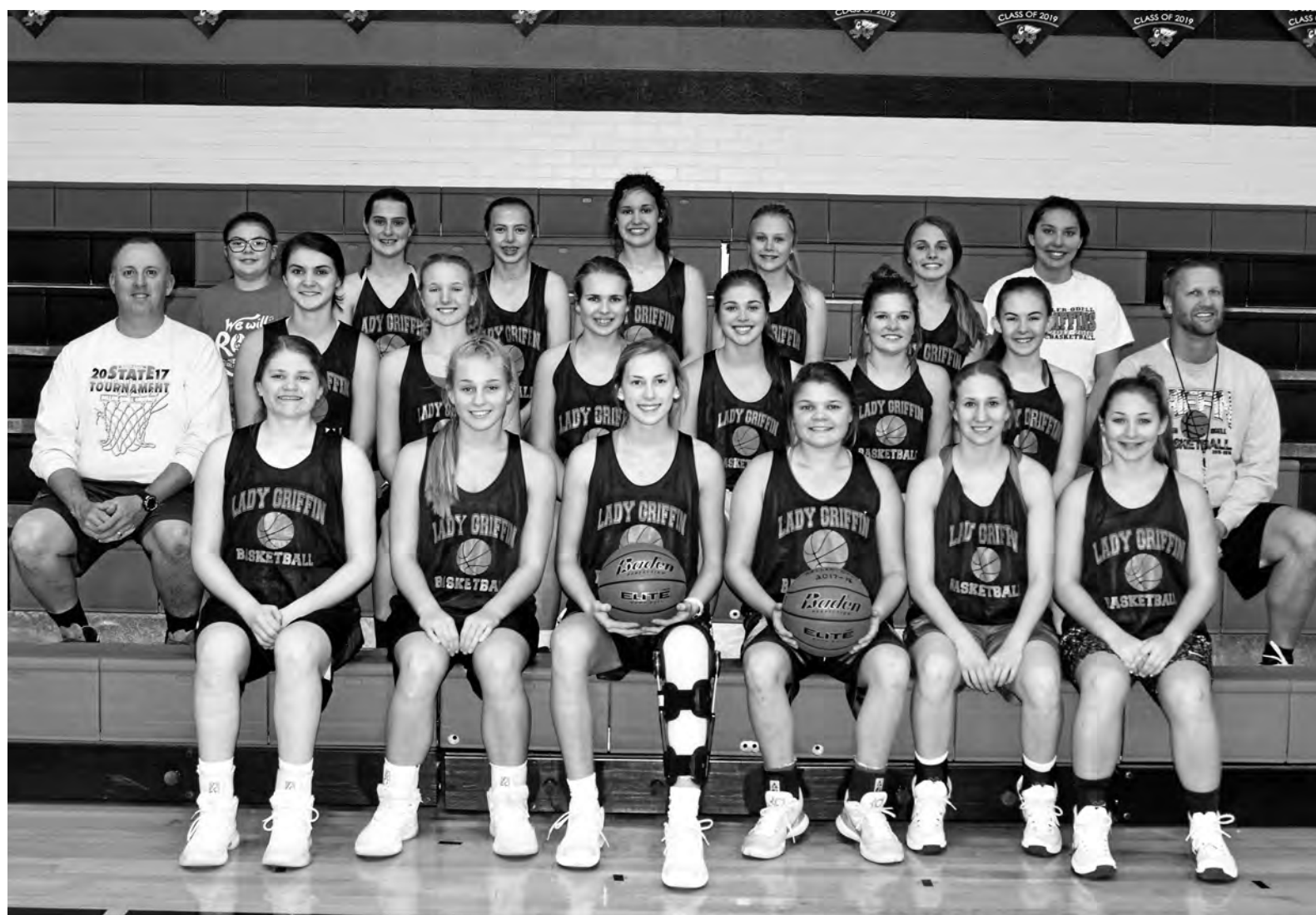

2018-19 outlook

The Diller-Odell girls basketball team will be a little more experienced this season after having a completely new starting lineup last season.

The Lady Griffins did lose Hayley Denner to graduation and have been dealt a big blow this year as returning leading scorer Kirsten Bures went down with a torn ACL during volleyball.

Diller-Odell does return four other girls with significant varsity experience. Camaryn Gydesen is the lone senior returning and will resume her role as the starting point guard.

Junior Emily Swanson averaged 5.3 points and 4 rebounds per game while junior Mackenzie Vitosh averaged 5.5 rebounds and 4.6 points per game.

They also return sophomore Addison Heidemann, who was the second leading scorer for the Griffins last year with 5.7 points per game.

Diller-Odell coach John Mohr said he's happy they'll have more experience this year, but still considers his team young with only one senior.

"Hopefully, we learned a lot last year about overcoming adversity and how a team has to work together for success," Mohr said. "These ladies are fairly athletic across the board, so I hope we can press our opponents into mistakes and run the floor in transition to

set-up our offense."

Mohr said they'll have to improve on shooting and ball-handling, which he considered weaknesses last year.

"These ladies need to be more aggressive attacking the basket on offense," Mohr said. "So even if they don't score, they may get to the free throw line. Finding a couple of reliable scorers will be a must for this team."

Mohr said their goals are to have a winning record and compete for championships in the MUDECAS and Pioneer Conference Tournaments.

"We want to be playing our best basketball in late February so we can potentially advance to sub-state with a trip to the State Tournament in Lincoln on the line," Mohr said.

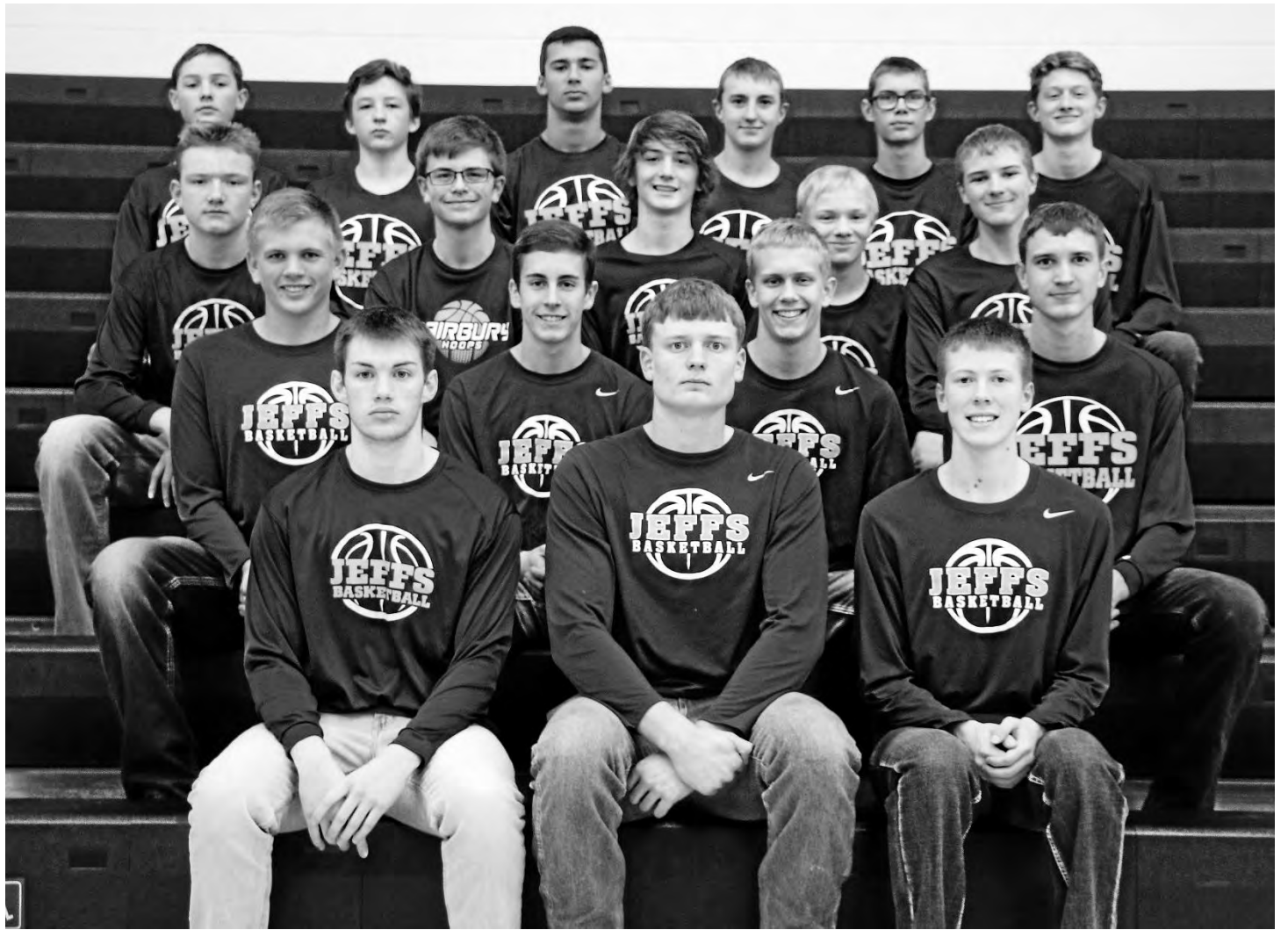

Lyle Thompson takes over the Fairbury girls basketball head coaching position and he inherits a team that finished just under .500 last year. Four letterwinners re-

turn from that team, including senior Jessa Eden, who average 9.8 points and 6.3 rebounds last year. Junior Sara Huss averaged 9.4 points and 11.7 rebounds last year. Junior Jaelle Johnson also returns after averaging 7.3 points and junior Cara DeBoer averaged 3.7 points.

Newcomers expected to contribute this year include sophomore Ellie Ohlde, junior Claire Shumard and freshman Karley McCord. "I think we have a chance to be very competitive," Thompson said. "We are young, but we have a lot of experience returning."

The Fairbury wrestling team tied the school record with eight state qualifiers last year and they return three state qualifiers, including one state medalist.

Carson York returns after earning a medal at state last year and he will be joined by fellow returning qualifiers Seth Firmanik and Ace York.

"We have a good mixture of veteran leaders and young talented kids," said Fairbury Coach Derek Garfield. "We know Class B is a juggernaut, but we are always up for the challenge of competing in the toughest class in high school wrestling."

Garfield said their strength will be their upperclassmen leadership, but said he considers his team young and inexperienced. Garfield believes the younger kids have the talent to be successful, though, and they will need to develop fast as Fairbury faces one of the toughest schedules in the state.

"My philosophy is that when we get to Districts and State we want our kids to be battle tested," Garfield said. "We will

continue to seek out the toughest competition that we can."
