Today, Town Pump partners with 85 food banks in 72 Montana communities.

Town Pump understands a food bank does not keep its doors open through food donations alone. This is why we have committed to bring much needed cash funds to assist with expenses such as building rent, utilities, purchasing bulk food items and perishable food including meat, produce, dairy and bread.

In 2019 over \$400,000 was donated by Town Pump’s generous customers at

Nearly **\$4 million** was raised for food banks in 2019. In 18 years, more than **\$33 million** has been given to the food banks of Montana, including \$6.75 million in matching funds committed by Town Pump.

Backpack food programs provide nutritious, non-perishable, easy-to-prepare food to children

It is 65 hours from the time school is dismissed on Friday afternoon until the bell rings on Monday morning. Often, children in Montana go hungry on the weekends. Research by the Montana Food Bank Network finds that 1 in 6 children live in homes that struggle to keep food on the table.

(e.g. two breakfast options, two lunch options, two snack options, a can of fruit and a can of vegetables).

Federal reimbursement is not available for the food provided by backpack programs. Most Montana backpack programs are run through food banks, food pantries, and other volunteer organizations that are already providing emergency and supplemental food assistance for families in need.

In 2019 the Town Pump Charitable Foundations, "Meals for Backpacks" program provided 72 grants totaling over \$450,000 to food banks, food pantries, schools and other organizations that provide weekend meal programs to Montana students. Since the inception of the "Meals for Backpacks" program in 2016, the Town Pump Charitable Foundation has granted over \$1.4 million to backpack programs.

The Town Pump Charitable Foundation is in awe of the efforts of our food banks, food pantries and other partners that provide backpack meals in their communities.





Backpack programs vary from one community to another. Generally a "backpack" will include enough food to replace the meals that children would receive at school

BREAKFAST AFTER THE BELL

Breakfast after the Bell is an initiative to fight childhood hunger in Montana.

No child in Montana should be hungry. Breakfast after the Bell encourages schools across the state to implement breakfast programs, or to switch to an alternative breakfast model that increases student participation.

School breakfast programs reduce

childhood hunger, and research shows that students who eat breakfast have increased attentiveness, improved behavior, higher attendance, and less sick and tardy days. These kids also have fewer disciplinary referrals. In short, breakfast is important for ensuring the success of our students.


Often the only thing standing in the way of a school implementing a breakfast program or switching to a breakfast model that increases

student participation is money for startup costs.

The Town Pump Charitable Foundation has provided funding for 20 schools across Montana to receive grants for necessary start-up equipment costs (additional coolers, refrigerators, waste cans, food carts, etc.).

Reading programs help students retain reading skills

Educators refer to the summer months as the “academically vulnerable summer months.” Often times the children experience what is called the summer slide; where the skills they learned during the school year start to diminish. To combat this, schools and public libraries across the state conduct summer reading programs to help the students retain their reading skills.

In Billings the program is called Reading Rocks and last year Reading Rocks held 45 sessions in six city parks and distributed 3,417 books. The children also receive a snack or meal. This summer the Bridger Public Library had

a 2019 theme of “Space...A Celebration of the 50th Anniversary of the Apollo Moon Landing.” The program is open to children 3 – 12 and included the use of space-themed books, an inflatable solar system and kits for DIY papier-mache telescopes.

The Town Pump Charitable Foundation supports summer reading programs. The grants these communities receive support the mission of the foundation by providing financial support to Montana charitable or governmental organizations with a priority of supporting/meeting basic needs and education for Montana citizens.

Montana has one of the highest per capita Veteran populations in the United States. Approximately 1 in 10 Montana residents are veterans. Over 70% of the Montana veteran population live in rural Montana.

Our Town Pump family cannot say thank you enough to our veterans for their service to our country.

For many veterans, assimilating back into civilian life can be difficult. High rates of homelessness, traumatic brain injuries, post-traumatic stress and a military culture that can be resistant to seeking help are all aggravating factors for veterans.

The Town Pump Charitable Foundation works with many groups across the state to support our veterans as they return back to Montana.

Town Pump recognizes the importance of firefighters and their dedication to helping others. The demand for equipment such as thermal imaging cameras, protective equipment, water tanks and more is enormous. In 2019 grants provided funding for a variety of needs including personal protective equipment (PPE), self-contained breathing apparatus (SCBA), hoses, tank lifts, automated external defibrillators (AED) units - used for people experiencing cardiac arrest, radios, water pumps and gas monitors.

\$25,000 matching grant saves patients 100s of miles of travel

3D Mammography is a revolutionary breast x-ray that has an increased detection rate of invasive cancers by 41%. The 3D part of the exam allows radiologists to examine breast tissue one thin layer at a time in seconds, like flipping pages of a book.

The Town Pump Charitable Foundation was pleased to partner with the Central Montana Medical Center Foundation with a \$25,000 match grant for the purchase of a 3D Mammography machine for the Central Montana Medical Center (Lewistown). The Central Montana Medical Center Foundation raised \$48,000 during the match campaign.

This equipment will allow patients not to have to travel 110 miles for this revolutionary breast x-ray, allowing for healthcare close to home.
