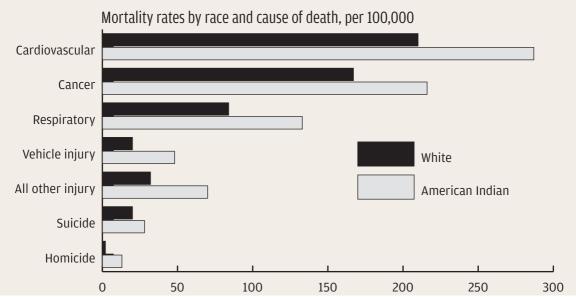
Montana American Indians die 20 years sooner because of health disparities
