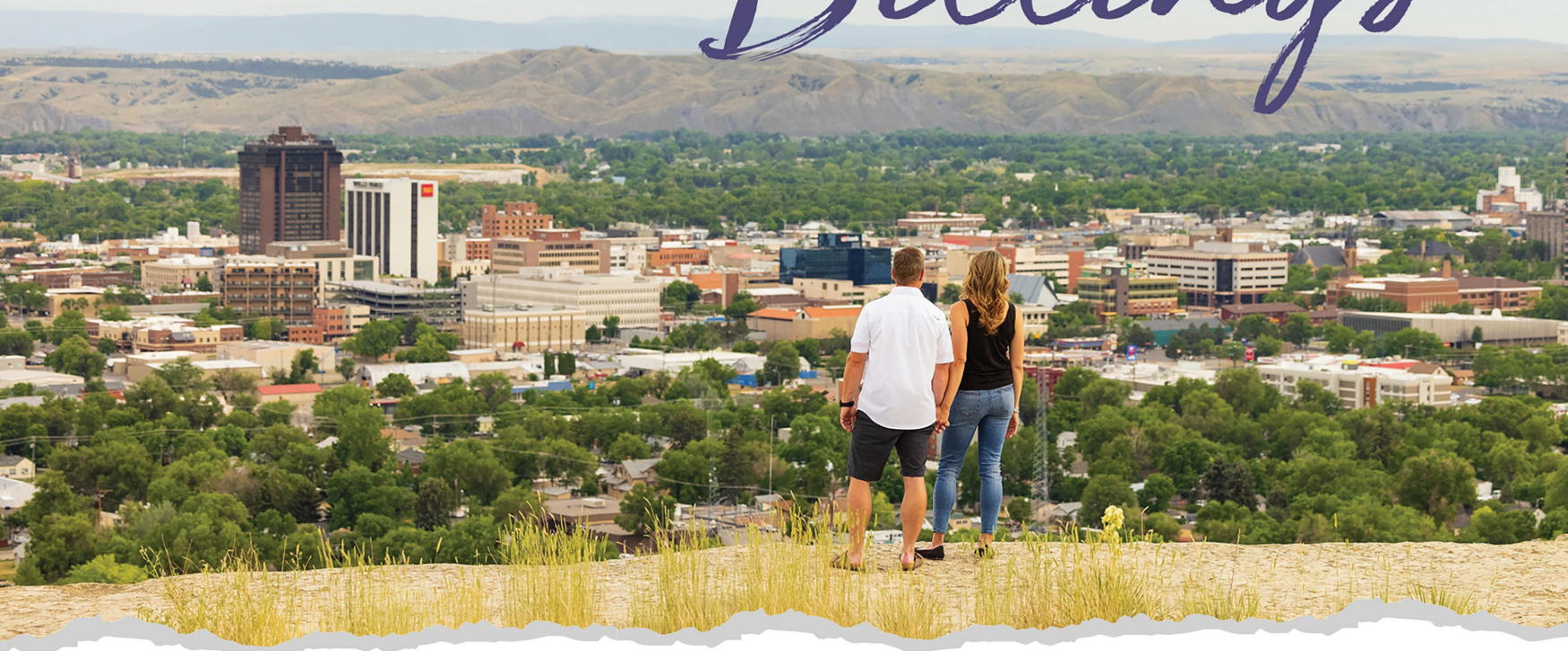

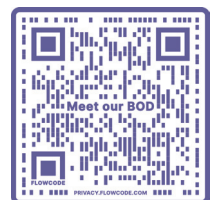
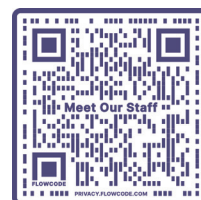

Resources

To make it smooth and efficient for you as you relocate to the Billings area, we have gathered the following resources to make your transition simple and efficient. For information about relocating to Montana, visit the state's website at montana.gov/residents. You can also reach out to the Billings Chamber of Commerce at (406) 245-4111 for additional information and guidance.

VEHICLE REGISTRATION

Under state law, all motor vehicles including motor homes; motorcycles and quadri-cycles; travel trailers; utility trailers; all-terrain vehicles; sailboats over 12 feet in length; motorboats, jet skis and other motorized vessels; and snowmobiles must be registered with the state. Pickup campers are an exception—they must be titled, but are not registered. For appointments in Yellowstone County call the Motor Vehicle Department at (406) 256-2833 or visit dojmt.gov/driving.

DRIVER'S LICENSE

Individuals with out-of-state licenses who wish to obtain a Montana driver license must apply within the first 60 days of living in Montana for a standard driver's license and within 30 days for a commercial license. You can renew or replace your license and find more information at dojmt.gov/driving/driverservices. If you are an active duty, reserve, or honorably discharged

member of the U.S. Armed Services, the Montana Motor Vehicle Division offers a unique number of services and benefits. Please visit dojmt.gov/driving/military-services for more information.

HUNTING & TRAPPING LICENSES

Hunting and trapping licenses are issued by Montana Fish, Wildlife, & Parks (FWP) and many resources are available on their website to help you get what you need – including information on regulations, maps of available hunting land, and licensing and permitting. A list of available licenses, restrictions, associated costs, and application deadlines is available on the FWP website at fwp.mt.gov/hunting/licenses/all. FISHING LICENSES

A valid fishing license is required for all types of fishing on state waters. To purchase a fishing license, you must be a Montana resident and live in the state of Montana for a minimum of 120 days per year and present a valid driver's license or a valid photo ID. More information is available on the Montana FWP website at fwp.mt.gov/fish/license/default.html or by calling (406) 247-2940.

BILLINGS PUBLIC SCHOOL REGISTRATION

Billings Public Schools has moved to an online enrollment process. Use the BPS Locator Tool at billingsschools.org/parent-portal/school-locator to determine your school based on your home address and then use the Enrollment Express Portal at ecollect.accelaschool.com/billings#! to register a student in Billings Public Schools.

You may need the following documents to finalize enrollment:

1. Child's birth certificate or passport
2. Proof of address (utility bill, lease agreement, buy/sell agreement)
3. Proof of immunizations or exemption forms
4. Transcript or current grades if enrolling for high school

5. Current IEP (If applicable)
For more information, visit the Billings Public Schools Enrollment & Registration page at billingsschools.org/our-schools/enrollment-registration. For higher education, a student must reside in Montana for one year immediately preceding registration to meet the requirement as a Montana resident. Attendance as a full-time student is not sufficient to qualify as a resident.

REGISTERING TO VOTE

Voter registration is done at the county level. Voters wishing to register to vote, change a registration or request an absentee ballot in Yellowstone County can do so in person – at the County Elections office in Room 217 of the Yellowstone County Courthouse at 217 N. 27th St. Late registration must be done in person. To complete by mail, voters must fill out the appropriate form and mail to the Election Administration, Yellowstone County Election Office, PO Box 35002, Billings, MT 59107. Forms can be found at app.mt.gov/voterinfo.

Once registered, you will be eligible to vote in all elections that are relevant to your address, including primary, general, City Council,

School Board, and special elections. If an absentee ballot is requested, the ballots will automatically be mailed in advance of those elections. There are no restrictions on who may vote by absentee ballot in Yellowstone County and once you are enrolled to receive an absentee ballot, you will automatically receive one before every election until you remove your registration. Please note that there is a deadline before each election to receive an absentee ballot in time to vote by absentee ballot.

To check the status of your voter registration in Montana, visit the My Voter Page on the MT Secretary of State website at app.mt.gov/voterinfo. Voters can also verify that an absentee ballot has been received and counted through the My Voter Page.

LOCAL GOVERNMENT

Billings City Government operates on the Council-Manager model, in which City Council oversees the general administration, makes policy, and sets budget. The council appoints a professional city manager to carry out day-to-day administrative operations. Billings has two councilmembers for each of its five wards and a separately elected mayor who chairs council meetings and has a vote on City Council. Councilmembers serve four-year terms and are limited to two consecutive terms. Members must reside within the ward from which they are elected and must be qualified voters of the City of Billings. Elections take place every two years on odd numbered years and the terms of Councilmembers are staggered such that half of council seats are up for election in every term. City Council meetings are open to the public and take place every Monday at 5:30 p.m. Agendas and minutes can be found at ci.billings.mt.us.

Economy

ECONOMIC HISTORY

Billings was named after Frederick

Billings who was the president of the Northern Pacific Railroad from 1879 to 1881. More than a century later, Billings is a vibrant city with a population that nearly doubles every thirty years with excellent rail, road and air transportation, allowing industry to thrive. At Montana's Trailhead, you will experience a community that is the center of progressive regional commerce.

ENERGY RESOURCES

Continental Oil began selling products in Billings (then "Coulson") in 1876. The first refinery opened in 1949. Today, the Billings area is home to three refineries producing around 180,000 barrels of oil per day from oil operations in Montana, Wyoming, and primarily Canada. This oil is distributed to nine western states. A wealth of long-term energy resources yields utility rates that

are among some of the lowest in the nation. Coal is a rich natural resource and water is plentiful and of excellent quality. With drilling in the Bakken Oil Play, Canadian Tar Sands, and other lucrative locations in motion, Billings is positioned as the regional hub for the energy industry of the northwest United States. Billings' area oil refineries and the rich coal and oil deposits in the region position the community as the heart of a regional economy focused on energy development, servicing and transportation that extends 325 miles to the heart of the Bakken Oil Play in Williston, ND.

MANUFACTURING

Among the many diverse sectors of the Yellowstone County economy is a robust manufacturing industry. According to Montana Manufacturing Extension Center, there are more than 400 different enterprises engaged

in some level of manufacturing within Yellowstone County. Among them are numerous businesses that support Montana's agricultural industry, specializing in the manufacture of everything from prepared feeds and feed ingredients to the processing of meats and grains that are harvested from the area, and a diverse group of manufacturers that specialize in all types of metal fabrication, many of which are distributed throughout the US and beyond. Billings also has a large contingency making products to support the area's thriving medical and construction industries, and the manufacturing list would not be complete without mentioning Billings' brewers and distilleries, with an incredible selection of some of the finest quality micro brews in the country.

AGRICULTURE

Montana's number one industry is agriculture and it plays a crucial role in the Billings economy. From wheat, corn and barley to sugar beet farms and cattle ranches, we take great pride in our local agricultural industry.

EDUCATION

The educational community in Billings provides tremendous opportunities for residents within the city as well as the outlying communities. Quality education can be found at all levels of curriculum, from pre-schools to secondary education, Billings offers a full spectrum of quality institutions.

HEALTHCARE

Billings' medical corridor provides the most advanced healthcare services in a four-state area, including Wyoming and the Dakotas. Two fully equipped and modern hospitals and over 40 medical clinics offer quality care and a complete range of medical, surgical, and emergency services. Our healthcare staff, doctors and specialists

have received national attention for their medical achievements.

TAXES

Montana is one of a few states in the United States without a state sales tax. While Montana has no general sales tax, property taxes are collected to primarily fund county government, the state's university system and Billings School District #2. All property, except agricultural land, has an assessed value equal to its market value as determined by the Department of Revenue. Agricultural land is valued based upon its productivity level.

ECONOMIC CLIMATE

In 2022, Phoebes ranked Billings 9th in the top 15 U.S. cities to start a business, and in 2020 AdvisorSmith ranked Billings 6th in the top 50 mid-sized cities in the U.S. for starting a new business. Billings' housing, schools, cultural and recreational attractions, quality of labor force, taxes and regulatory climate make the city competitive for businesses big and small. Our city is a successful investing ground for new and expanding businesses. Billings' housing market is red hot, ranking 9th in the nation for 2022 as one of the top 20 emerging housing markets by Wall Street Journal/Realtor.com. And in 2024, Livability ranked Billings in the "Top 100 Best Places to Live" in the United States, based on thousands of data points measuring economics, housing, amenities, infrastructure, demographics, social and civic capital, education, health care, diversity and inclusion. Ultimately Livability decided that these top 100 cities, including Billings, were "unique, welcoming, affordable and bursting with opportunities".

AGRICULTURE

Driving through Billings, it is easy to see the presence of industries like healthcare, energy, and education; however, the equally essential agriculture industry cannot be overlooked. Agriculture is Montana's leading industry, contributing more monetary value (\$4.6 billion) to the state's economy than any other industry.

This industry isn't made up of just farmers and ranchers who raise our food and the fiber used in our clothing, but includes businesses like agriculture supply stores, implement dealers, agricultural broadcasting, seed suppliers, banks, agrichemical manufacturers, and others also contribute to the industry. For every 10 jobs on farms and ranches, 14 additional jobs are generated in the county.

Each dollar of value-added in agriculture by a farmer or rancher contributes an additional \$3.41 of value-added in other sectors of the county's economy. This significant contribution to the local economy is because Billings is an economic hub for southern Montana.

Though Billings and our county are rapidly growing, it is important to know that 95 percent of the land is still classified for agriculture use, a majority of which is rangeland or pasture that raises the high-quality beef cattle that Montana proudly raises and provides beef nationwide. Yellowstone County is geographically diverse, with some of the most developed farming systems in the state. The Yellowstone River runs the length of the county and separates the dryland farming areas to the north and south. The areas east and west of Billings, along the river, showcase the fertile irrigated lands. The median farm size is 60 acres. If you live outside the city limits, chances are good that you will be near some form of agriculture.

The primary income drivers of the agriculture industry in Yellowstone County agriculture are crop and livestock production, with livestock-related revenue comprising 80 percent of total crop and livestock sales. Wheat, hay and haylage, barley, corn, alfalfa and sugar beets are the major crops grown in the county. Montana barley is some of the best in the country and used nationwide for products like beer from companies such as Molson Coors whose elevators are located in Huntley. Sugar beets are relatively unique to our area and state. They are made into high quality sugar that can be purchased in grocery stores state and nationwide. Livestock production is comprised of cattle, chickens, sheep, dairy, and hogs; with cattle ranking third in the state. A growing number of restaurants throughout our city and county are serving locally raised meat and vegetables, bringing the farm to fork concept to consumers.



Transportation

AIR SERVICE

Billings Logan International Airport (BIL) completed a \$60 million terminal expansion and renovation in 2024 to best serve visitors to Montana and northern Wyoming.

BIL is the gateway to the big sky and offers convenient flight options to major U.S. cities several times daily. Carriers include Delta Airlines, United Airlines, American Airlines, Allegiant Air, Alaska Air, Sun Country, and Cape Air all with direct flights to cities including Denver, Salt Lake City, Chicago, Minneapolis, Dallas, Seattle, Los Angeles and Portland.

BIL also offers access to two fixed-based operators, Edwards Jet Center: (406) 252-0508 and Beacon Air Group: (800) 700-5107 ext#1. BIL is a crucial airfreight hub for the west with approximately 12 cargo and mail carriers including UPS and FedEx. BIL is currently adding a Cargo Ramp #5 for large aircraft, which will provide the opportunity to increase air cargo operation for the Airport. In 2023, UPS and FedEx loaded and unloaded approximately 75 million pounds of freight in 2023, which makes BIL the busiest cargo airport in Montana.

PUBLIC TRANSPORTATION

MET Transit is the city's public transportation system. It provides fixed-route and paratransit bus service and is the primary mode of transportation for many residents of Billings. Use of MET Transit promotes cleaner air, helps to mitigate traffic congestion problems, and provides a safe and reliable transportation alternative for all.

Billings also offers bus connections through Jefferson Lines with numerous daily arrivals and departures, to every state in the continental United States as well as Canada and Mexico.

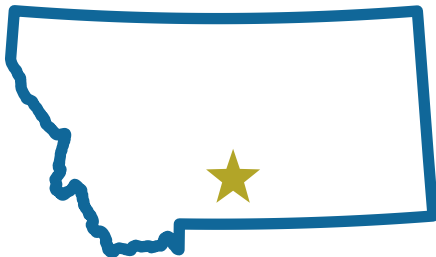

A natural park located south of Billings along the Yellowstone River. There is a parking lot with a restroom and bridge access to the island and numerous gravel trails. Several trails wind around the ponds and berms that have been created within the Montana Audubon Center area along the channel.

Zimmerman Park

A county park located west of Zimmerman Trail with parking access south off of Hwy. 3. This is a scenic, natural park area with numerous dirt trails overlooking the city along the face of the Rims. There is also a short hard surface trail that directs visitors to a historic, informational kiosk.

Phipps Park

Located on the southwest side of Molt Road on the west end of Billings. There is a parking lot on the south side of the road just west of the railroad underpass. This is a natural park area with access to the top of the Rims and numerous trails with spectacular views of the Yellowstone Valley and Billings. Trail use includes hiking, mountain biking, horseback riding and a challenging Disc Golf Course.

PARKS & RECREATION

HARD SURFACE TRAILS

Swords Park Trail

The trail is two miles long and is located along the Rims south of Airport Road and east of the N 27th Street Airport entrance. It is a beautiful section of trail as it meanders across the Rims and provides spectacular vistas of the city and the Yellowstone River Valley.

Skyline Trail

This trail is 3 miles long and is located along the Rims south of Airport Road and west of the N 27th Street Airport Entrance. It is a compliment to the Swords Park Trail with spectacular views stretching out to Zimmerman Park.

Jim Dutcher Trail

This trail starts in the Heights on Mary Street on the old railroad bed east of Bench Boulevard. It extends approximately 6.5 miles, passing by Two Moon Park and trailhead, dropping down off the Rims by MetraPark, along the Yellowstone River through Coulson Park and ending in Mystic Park, past the City Public Utilities water treatment plant. The Two Moon Trailhead provides parking with water and restroom facilities and there is also water and restrooms located just south of the public utilities area. Parking is also available on the back northeast lot of MetraPark, with an access trail to the main path by Alkali Creek Bridge/Falls.

SPECIALTY PARKS

Landon's Miracle Field

Landon's Legacy Foundation has partnered with Billings Kiwanis and Billings Parks and Recreation to create our communities first special needs baseball field. Billings Parks and Recreation has generously donated the land for the baseball field at The Poly Vista Baseball Complex located at 38th and Poly Drive. This field is known as a "Miracle League" Baseball field. It is a custom designed latex free rubberized turf field that accommodates wheelchairs and other adaptive equipment. The Miracle League field serves children and adults who suffer from any physical or mental disabilities which causes them to be

excluded from other baseball leagues and is the second Miracle Field in Montana. Find out more information at landonslegacy.com or at billingsparks.org/program/miracle-league.

PROGRAMS

The Parks and Recreation Department offers over 143 unique recreation program offerings to citizens of all ages. The division offers year-round recreational programs ranging from special interest classes, adult sports, youth sports and youth camps to early learning programs and active older adult programs. The wide range of activities the Recreation Division offers ensures there are opportunities for participants of all ages. Staff takes pride in providing affordable programs that are accessible to all members of the community. A full list of current Recreation Program offerings can be found at billingsparks.org.

COMMUNITY EVENTS

The Parks and Recreation Department currently hosts two large volunteer events, Arbor Day and Refresh the Rims. They also have a fun

end-of summer event called Dog Days of Summer at Rose Park Pool. Additionally, the Parks and Recreation works with dozens of organizations throughout the community to host events in the Parks. Some notable events include the Big Sky State Games, Movies in the Park, Billings Symphony in the Park, Montana Shakespeare in the Park, Saturday Live and Summer Fair, to name a handful

Arbor Day

A worldwide celebration of trees held in the early spring. This award-winning Arbor Day celebration brings community members together for a day of tree planting, volunteer projects, educational booths, and of course, a ceremonial tree planting to commemorate the day. The event attracts over 150 volunteers and around 450 local 4th grade students who take part in the education booths and tree planting ceremony.

Refresh the Rims

The annual fall volunteer event in which community volunteers fan out across parkland on top of the Billings Rims to help clean up and beautify

one of Billings' defining landmarks. The event typically draws around 150 - 200 volunteers who clean over 4.5 miles of trails and natural parkland areas of trash and debris.

Dog Days of Summer

Held on the last day of summer just before the closure of Rose Park Pool. On this day, they close swimming to humans and open the pool to furry four-legged companions with over 300 dogs enjoying the pool! Community members are encouraged to use the Park Finder function at billingsparks.org/park-finder. This tool allows the user to see a map of all of the parks in our park system as well as search for and filter parks based on activity, facilities, and amenities.

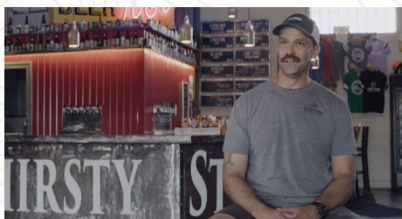
BRAD TILDEN, RAND'S HATS

NOTABLE FIGURES

The Moss Mansion

PRESTON BOYD MOSS

Arriving in town in 1892, Preston Boyd Moss, known as P.B., was a prominent figure in Billings' business development. He was a well-known banker and entrepreneur who founded a newspaper that was a forerunner to the *Billings Gazette* and started the Billings Utility Company—along with many other companies. His legacy and impact on Billings' early years is undeniable.

FREDERICK BILLINGS

Frederick Billings made a name for himself during the gold rush, eventually becoming California's first Attorney General. Billings purchased one of the original twelfth interests in the Northern Pacific Railway and served as its president. As the railway expanded, his legacy left a lasting impression. So much so, Billings, Montana was named after him.

YELLOWSTONE KELLY

Luther Sage "Yellowstone" Kelly was one of the most notable American veterans. Kelly was laid to rest in June of 1929 with full military honors overlooking the Yellowstone Valley. Today, the Yellowstone Kelly Interpretive Site sits atop Swords Rimrock Park and overlooks Downtown Billings. The site serves as a memorial to honor Kelly's name and significant contributions.



AGRICULTURE IS MONTANA'S #1 INDUSTRY

One of the most important economic factors in Billings is its agriculture industry. Continuing to forge a path of growth, Billings' diverse climate and fertile soil help farmers and ranchers produce a wide variety of quality food products, including the top two commodities — beef and wheat.

HAZEL HUNKINS-HALLINAN

Born in the late 19th century, Hunkins-Hallinan was a Billings native, women's rights activist and suffragist. After being denied the opportunity to teach chemistry because she was a woman, despite having earned her master's degree in the subject, she joined the National Women's Party that had been organizing in Montana and dedicated her life to equality for women.

KEVIN RED STAR

Renowned for his authentic works of art depicting Native American culture, Kevin Red Star grew up on the Crow reservation outside of Billings. His work has been featured at the Smithsonian's National Museum of the American Indian, the Heard Museum in Phoenix (AZ), and the Whitney Western Art Museum.

TRAILS YOU DON'T WANT TO MISS

APPROXIMATELY 7 MILES OF TRAILS ARE ALONG THE LEGENDARY YELLOWSTONE RIVER. BRING A PICNIC LUNCH AND DIP YOUR TOES IN THE WATER.

The stretch of trail along the **RIMROCKS** off Airport Road (Highway 3) is a fantastic place to gaze out upon the mountains. These sandstone bluffs surround the city and are estimated to be at least 70 million years old. On a clear day, five mountain ranges can be seen from the trail: Pryor, Big Horn, Bull, Crazy and Absaroka-Beartooth. For history buffs, this stretch of trail is a historic mecca. View Yellowstone Kelly Interpretive Site, the legends of Black Otter Trail, Boothill Cemetery and much more!

Billings has 39 city parks and several excellent wild land parks outside city limits. With everything from pools to trails, from tennis to basketball, from picnic tables to playgrounds, there's a park for everyone in Billings. Pick the park for you at billingsparks.org. Take in history and architecture with a ride, walk or run through **DOWNTOWN BILLINGS**. Discover buildings like the Western Heritage Center (the original Parmly Billings Library) and the Historic Train Depot along Montana Avenue. Dive in a little deeper and explore the historic buildings and businesses that began Billings' legacy along with the modern updates that keep Montana's City buzzing today.

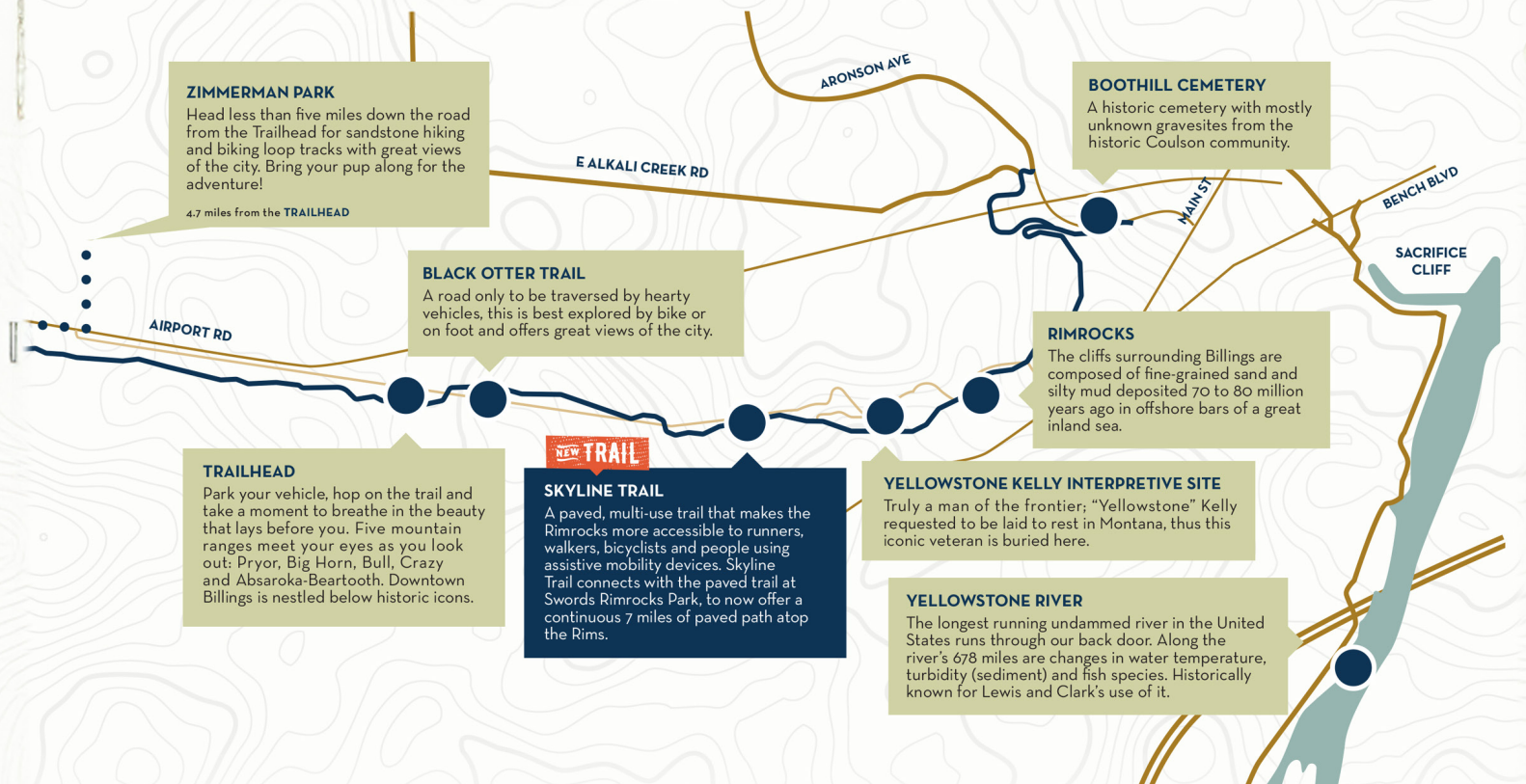

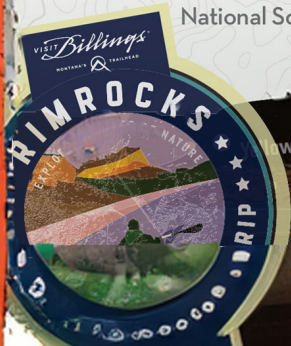
If you're going to make just one road-trip adventure during your stay in Billings, make sure it's along **THE BEARTOOTH HIGHWAY**.

STARGAZING

Montana is known for its big skies during the day and stellar stargazing opportunities at night. Nothing compares to the moment you first see, with your naked eye, the billions of stars that make up the Milky Way. Because of light pollution, less than 500 stars are visible in urban areas. This means, the farther from city lights, the greater the view. Eastern Montana's largely rural area provides the perfect backdrop to watch the stars come out.

Stargazing presents magnificent year-round opportunities, and, in fact, some of the best stargazing is done during crisp, cold nights when skies are exceptionally clear. With a fair bit of luck and some planning with an aurora borealis forecast, you might witness the northern lights, one of the most spectacular sights on earth.

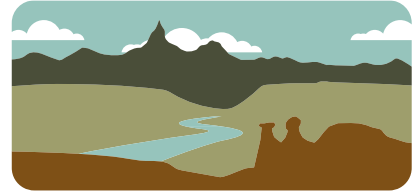

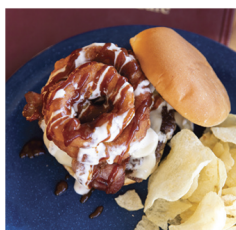

4. WAGON WHEEL CAFÉ | EKALAKA

The name of this burger speaks for itself, Ekalaka’s Favorite *Cowboy Burger*. This ¼ lb. patty is paired with substantial crispy onion rings, thick-cut bacon, jalapeños, Swiss cheese and drenched in locally-made honey barbecue chipotle sauce.



2. BW GRILL & BAR | HYSHAM

If you are craving a classic burger, this joint won’t let you down. The namesake, *BW Burger*, is served with all the essentials on a 1/3 lb. patty, sourced locally at Cowboy Meats, and drizzled with their house-made concoction, BW sauce. We’d be remiss to not mention their popular tater tots—or gems, as they’re often called out here.



5. VINTAGE & RUSTICS IN MONTANA | MILES CITY

Alongside antique booths and home goods, this retro diner is filled with colorful vintage counters and booths, taking you back to the 1950s. Their *Bleu’s Burger* is made up of American Kobe-style beef, topped with strawberry jam, Bleu cheese and crunchy onions, all on fresh-baked roll.



3. BLUE CAT BAR & GRILL | HUNTLEY

The *Big Ass Blue Cat Burger* is exactly what it sounds like—a monstrous number that brings the heat. It’s loaded with diced jalapenos, topped with bacon and pepper jack cheese over a freshly ground ½ lb. patty. If you stop for a burger over the weekend, make sure to ask about their wildly popular Loaded Bloody Mary.
