"Tall grasses" shall mean all weeds not contained in North Dakota Administrative Code Section 7-06-01-02 in excess of eight (8) inches in height and all grasses in excess of eight (8) inches in height. Tall grasses may be used for ornamental plantings subject to the following conditions:

a. Tall grasses may not be used as lawn

b. Tall grasses may not be planted on the public right-of-way without the written permission of the city traffic engineer. c. Tall grasses may not be planted or main

tained within a sight triangle, as defined by Section 14-02-03, in excess of thirty-six (36) inches in height above the adjacent curb
