**TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF
DEARBORN HEIGHTS:**

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that an election will be held in Dearborn Heights on Tuesday, November 4, 2025. Any qualified elector of Dearborn Heights, who is not already registered, may register to vote at the office of the Dearborn Heights City Clerk; the office of the County Clerk; a Secretary of State Branch office, or other designated state agency. Registration forms may also be completed online at www.michigan.gov/vote, mailed to the Dearborn Heights City Clerk or emailed to clerks@dearbornheightsmi.gov. Voters who are already registered may update their registration at www.expressSOS.com.

The last day to register in any manner other than in-person with the local clerk is Monday, October 20, 2025.

After this date, anyone who qualifies as an elector may register to vote in person with proof of residency (MCL 168.497) at the Dearborn Heights Clerk's Office, located at 6045 Fenton, Dearborn Heights, MI 48127 at the following times:

- Regular business hours: Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.
- Saturday, November 1, 2025 from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m.
- Election Day, Tuesday, November 4, 2025 from 7:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m.

And the following proposals:

DEARBORN HEIGHTS SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 7 BUILDING AND SITE SINKING FUND RENEWAL PROPOSAL;

This proposal will renew and restore the authority last approved by the electors in 2016 and which expires with the 2025 levy for the School District to levy a building and site sinking fund millage, the proceeds of which will be used to make improvements and repairs to the School District's facilities. Pursuant to State law, the expenditure of the building and site sinking fund millage proceeds must be audited, and the proceeds cannot be used for teacher, administrator or employee salaries, maintenance or other operating expenses.

Shall the Dearborn Heights School District No. 7, County of Wayne, Michigan, be authorized to levy 4.6682 mills (\$4.6682 per \$1,000 of taxable valuation) for a period of ten (10) years, being the years 2026 to 2035, inclusive, to maintain a sinking fund to be used for the construction or repair of school buildings, school security improvements, the acquisition or upgrading of technology, the acquisition of student transportation vehicles, trucks and vans and parts, supplies and equipment used for the maintenance of these vehicles and for any other purposes permitted by law? This millage if approved and levied would provide estimated revenues to the School District of approximately \$1,388,632.00 in the first year that it is levied.

WAYNE-WESTLAND COMMUNITY SCHOOLS SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT BOND PROPOSITION; Shall the Wayne-Westland Community Schools, County of Wayne, State of Michigan, borrow the sum of not to exceed One Hundred Twenty-Five Million Dollars (\$125,000,000) and issue its general obligation unlimited tax bonds, in one or more series, to pay the cost of the following projects to create a modern learning environment for students and for health, safety, security, energy conservation and other purposes:

- Remodeling, equipping, re-equipping, furnishing, re-furnishing school buildings and other facilities;
- Acquiring and installing instructional technology infrastructure and equipment in school buildings and other facilities; and
- Preparing, developing and improving sites at school buildings and other facilities?

The annual debt millage required to retire all bonds of the School District currently outstanding and proposed pursuant to this ballot is expected to be at or below 4.48 mills which is a 0 mill increase from the annual debt millage levied in 2025. The maximum number of years any series of bonds may be outstanding, exclusive of refunding, is not more than twenty-five (25) years; the estimated millage that will be levied to pay the proposed bonds in the first year is 2.29 mills (which is equal to \$2.29 per \$1,000 of taxable value); and the estimated simple average annual millage that will be required to retire each series of bonds is 2.58 mills annually (\$2.58 per \$1,000 of taxable value).

If approved by the voters, the bonds will be guaranteed by the State under the School Bond Qualification and Loan Program (the "Program"). The School District currently has \$105,575,000 of qualified bonds outstanding and \$0 of qualified loans outstanding under the Program. The School District does not expect to borrow from the Program to pay debt service on these bonds. The estimated computed millage rate required to be levied to pay the proposed bonds may change in the future based on changes in certain circumstances.

(Pursuant to State law, expenditure of bond proceeds must be audited, and the proceeds cannot be used for teacher, administrator or employee salaries, repair or maintenance costs or other operating expenses.)
