

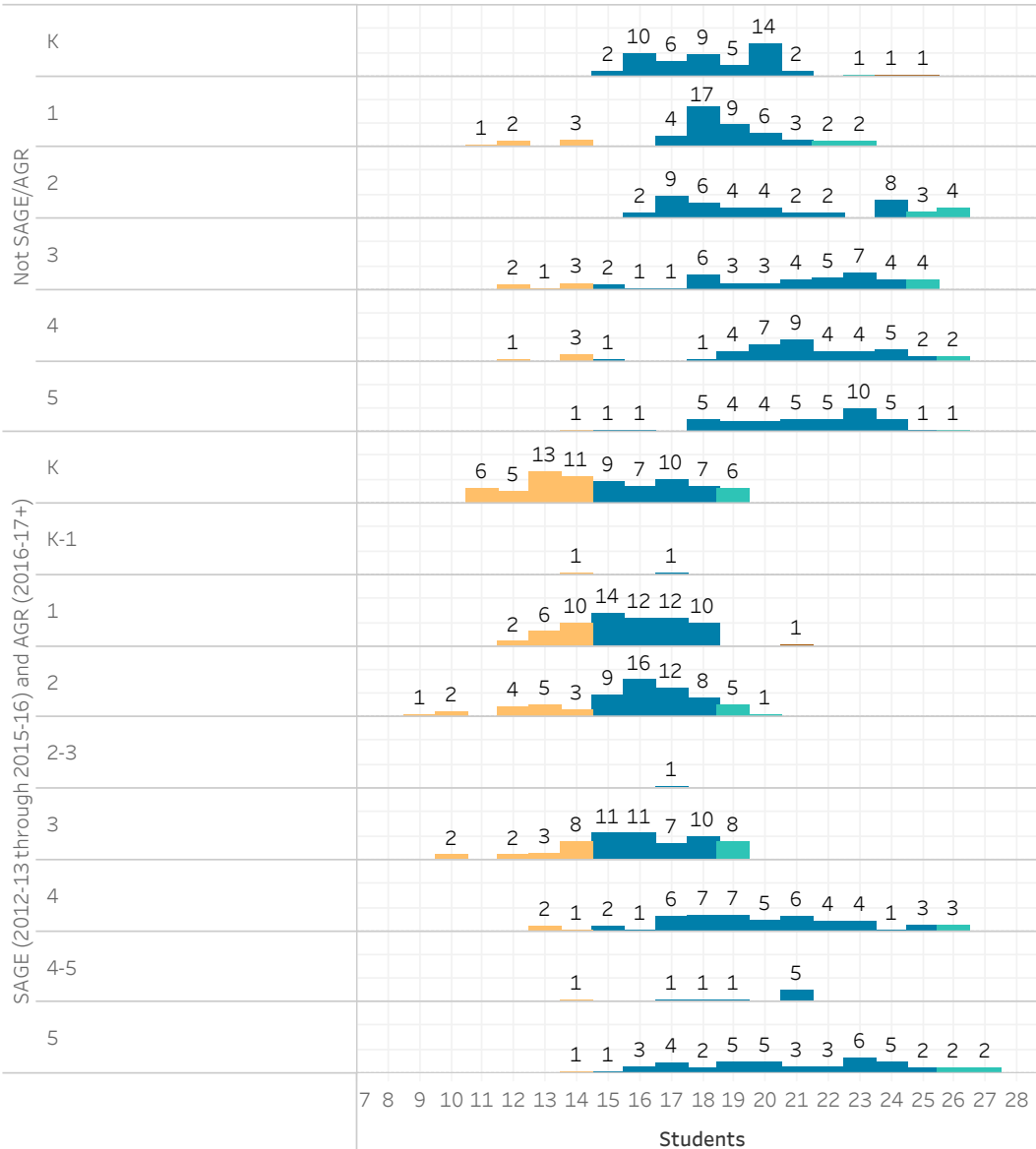
# Elementary Homeroom Sizes

## October 2018

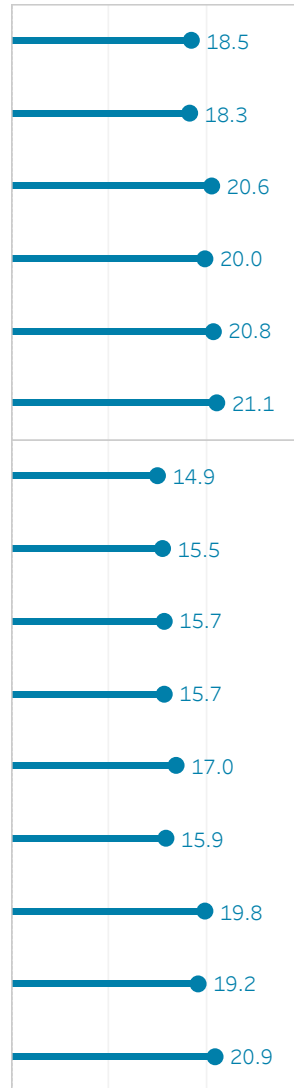

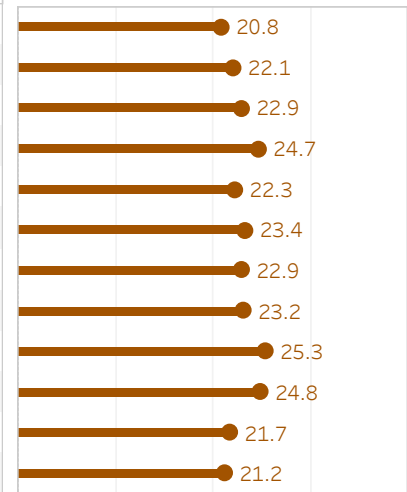
