Nobel Prize Winning Drug Used to Fight Covid19 Worldwide Banned in Louisiana

BATON ROUGE — There is a war on the drug Ivermectin. The La. Board of Pharmacy under Gov. Edwards has attempted to ban pharmacists from filling prescriptions for Ivermectin. The La. Department of Health has stopped allowing prescriptions for Ivermectin to be filled for Medicaid recipients.

The *Advocate* has run many articles critical of Ivermectin, debunking it as a horse de-wormer. Facebook censors posts about Ivermectin, and Sen. Bill Cassidy has urged people not to take it.

You would never know that the inventor of Ivermectin won the Nobel Prize for his work or that it has saved tens of millions of human lives around the world. You would not know that thousands of physicians across the U.S. say Ivermectin is almost 100 percent effective in treating COVID and preventing death. What's the truth? The Cen-

Dr. Holmes Overstates Deaths Among Central's School Staff

CENTRAL — During a debate on whether students in Central schools should be required to wear masks eight hours a day, Central School Board member Dr. Keith Holmes told his fellow board members that 4 percent of the members of Central's school staff had died be-

cause of COVID. He said the main purpose of masks was to protect teachers, not students. However, his numbers were wrong. Only 4/10ths of 1 percent of the Central staff died because of COVID, or about the national average.

School Board Ignored Warning That Vaccine Mandates Were Coming

Central School Board Refuses to Protect Teachers, Staff from Vaccination Mandate

Board President Says Board Won't Go Along With Vaccine Mandate "Unless It's the Law"

CENTRAL — On Aug. 25, the Central School Board held a public hearing on a proposal by parent Kim Powers that would have protected Central teachers and school employees from being terminated if they refused to take a COVID-19 vaccine. Ms. Powers warned that vaccine mandates were coming soon and the board should act immediately. After an hour-long hearing, the board unanimously rejected the proposal. A few days later, President Biden issued a "mandate" purporting to require employers of 100 or more to force

MIXED MESSAGE ON VACCINE MANDATE — Members of the Central School Board gave local parents mixed messages about whether they would go along with requiring teachers and other school system employees to be vaccinated in order to keep their jobs. Parent Kim Powers told the board vaccine mandates were coming soon and offered the board a series of amendments to the Employee Handbook to prevent employees from being coerced. However, although the board was critical of vaccine mandates, they refused to take any action to protect teachers. Board president Dr. Jim Gardner said they would not require vaccination "unless it's the law."
