Istrouma Indians, Off to 4-0 Start, Recall Glory Days Of Seasons Past

BATON ROUGE - Istrouma High School's fledgling football program is off to an impressive start. After going 4-1 last year, Istrouma is 4-0 so far this season with four games remaining. Last week, the Indians defeated Broadmoor handily 37-6, thereby avenging its only loss last year. Enrollment at Istrouma is skyrocketing, increasing from 452 students in May to 852 in September. By next year, Istrouma Reginald Douglas expects enrollment to top 1,100 and Istrouma to begin the 2019 season in class 4A.
