NOTICE OF MEASURE
GENERAL MUNICIPAL ELECTION

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that the following measure will be voted on at the General Municipal Election, to be held in the City of Chino, on Tuesday, November 3, 2026.

Without taxing residents, and to support general city services such as 911/police response; protect local drinking water sources; retain/attract local businesses; shall the measure be adopted to reform City of Chino's outdated business license ordinance with rates of \$0.60 - \$1.50 per \$1,000 of gross receipts for larger businesses based on business category; and only \$25 for smaller businesses (under \$75,000), generating approximately \$4,800,000 annually until ended by voters; with audits, spending disclosure, funds locally controlled?

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that pursuant to Sections 9280 through 9287 of the California Elections Code, arguments for or against the measure and rebuttal arguments shall be submitted and selected as follows:

Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 9282, the City Council or any member thereof authorized by the City Council may prepare and file a written argument in favor of the proposed measure, not to exceed three hundred (300) words, on behalf of the City Council. In the event that an argument is filed against any of the measure, the Mayor is authorized to prepare a rebuttal argument on behalf of the City Council, which may also be signed by members of the City Council or bona fide associations or by individual voters who are eligible to vote on the measure.

The last day for submission of primary arguments for or against the measure shall be August 10, 2026 at 5:30 p.m. pursuant to Election Code Section 9286 and shall be accompanied by Statement Form 9600 pursuant to Elections Code Section 9600. All primary arguments may be changed or withdrawn until and including the last day for submission of primary arguments, after which time no arguments for or against the aforementioned measure may be submitted to the City Clerk. Primary arguments shall not exceed three hundred (300) words and shall be signed by not more than five persons.

Pursuant to California Elections Code Section 9285, when the City Clerk has selected the arguments for and against the measure, which will be printed and distributed to the voters, the City Clerk shall send copies of the argument in favor of the measure to the authors of the argument against, and copies of the argument against to the authors of the argument in favor. Rebuttal arguments shall be printed in the same manner as the primary arguments. Each rebuttal argument shall immediately follow the primary argument that it seeks to rebut.

The last day for submission of rebuttal arguments for or against the measure shall be August 20, 2026 at 5:30 p.m. pursuant to Election Code Section 9285 and shall be accompanied by Statement Form 9600 pursuant to Elections Code Section 9600. Rebuttal arguments shall not exceed two hundred fifty (250) words and shall be signed by not more than five persons.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that any ordinance, impartial analysis, or direct argument filed under the authority of the Elections Code will be available for public examination in the Office of the City Clerk for not less than 10-calendar days from the deadline for the filing of the arguments and analysis. Any rebuttal argument filed under the authority of the Elections Code will be available for public examination in the City Clerk's Office for not less than 10-calendar days from the deadline for filing rebuttal arguments.
