**C-W golfers complete HON schedule, Hayward wins title**

The 2021 Chetek-Weyerhaeuser girls' golf team played in the Heart O'North Conference Tournament at Cumberland Golf Club on Wednesday, Sept. 22. The Bulldogs finished the season in eighth place in the conference standings, while the Hayward Hurricanes won the conference championship.

A canceled meet was how C-W's week began with a storm sweeping through the area on Monday, Sept. 20. It was the final home meet of the season against a Northwestern Tigers team that the girls had defeated in a couple

of golf invitationals this season. That meet was rescheduled to be played as part of the conference tournament in Cumberland on Sept. 22.

Unfortunately for the Bulldogs, illness and other issues left the team without a full contingent in the conference tournament.

In what the C-W girls had hoped would be a battle for sixth place in the overall conference standings turned out to be a gift to Northwestern, St. Croix Falls, Luck-Unity-Frederic, and Cumberland as the Bulldogs could not post a team score. This resulted in C-W dropping two places in the overall standings and settling in 8th place

out of 10 teams.

Sophomore Emma Haselhuhn led the team, as she has most of the year, with a score of 114 that included 3 bogeys. Emma ended with 22 points in the race for all conference (top ten) team mentions, finishing in 14th place overall in the conference. Fellow sophomore Lauren Hayes played some fine golf at the end of the season completing a 3 bogey and one par round of 124. Lauren has shown vast improvement in ball striking over the last 3 weeks. Both of these sophomores (along with Wren Candler) should provide a solid nucleus for next year's team.

Hayward senior Gillian

Johnson led all players at the meet with a great score of 84 to lead her team to the conference title. Tara Eckes and Macey Reier followed her with 96 and 98 as Hayward had three of the top four scores in the meet. Michelle Wallin of Ladysmith was player of the year in the conference with 57 points—she was second in the meet with a 95. Local players Brooke Vergin and Kami Zurn of Barron made the top 10 in the conference.

C-W was playing in the regional meet at Prescott on Wednesday, Sept. 29. All of the other conference teams travel to Hidden Greens Golf Course in Solon Springs.

**BULLDOGS: C-W wins two, loses four in week's action**

"After losing Kendal Evans for the season, it has taken time to figure out how we move forward as a team and be successful without her. When our junior outside hitter, Mariah Mitchell, went down early in the second set with a knee injury, I was a little unsure how we would respond. Mariah was having an outstanding match, arguably one of her best performances of the season, and she was leading our team in both serving and hitting percentage up until she went out of the match and was unable to return. It was a big loss for us when she went down. But in the face of adversity, the girls didn't panic and instead really stepped up as players and leaders on the court. They immediately rallied around Sophomore Anastasia Mujwid, who replaced Mitchell in the lineup, and we managed to hang on to the second set to go up 2-0. Anastasia did a phenomenal job. It is a lot of pressure stepping into the varsity lineup, and she really held her own," Bohl continued. "As a team we really came together and took Cumberland, an undefeated team in conference play, to five sets. Seeing the girls persevere with grit and mental toughness throughout the match was definitely a highlight of the night and our season thus far. I feel like the tides

are turning for us. Although we have had some big setbacks, we are clawing our way in the right direction and getting better as a team every single day."

Against Cumberland, C-W had a serving percentage of 90.1%. Three players finished the night perfect from the service line: Jorstad (16 attempts—team high, 2 aces), Mitchell (5 attempts) and Kora Claflin (10 attempts). Nichols (92.9%, 14 attempts, 1 ace) and Bilodeau (91.7%, 12 attempts, 2 aces) both also had a superb night serving the ball. Schofield (2) and Anastasia Mujwid (1) each also contributed ace serves.

The Bulldogs averaged a 1.65 on serve receive. Mitchell, once again, led our team in serve receive average at 2.4 (5 attempts), followed by Kora Claflin at 1.83 (23 attempts), and Olivia Schofield at 1.65 (23 attempts).

In this match, C-W finished with a positive hitting percentage at .020. Mitchell led the 'Dogs in hitting at .250 (3 kills, 8 attempts), followed by Jorstad at .133 (13 kills, 45 attempts) and Mujwid at .111 (2 kills, 9 attempts). Nichols also had an effective night attacking at .053 with 5 kills (19 attempts). Schofield finished second on the team in kills with 9, while Bilodeau contributed 5 kills, and Widiker had 1 kill. Nichols had a team high 18 assists, followed by Greta Jorstad with 8.

Claflin and Jorstad also led

the team in digs with 15 each, followed by Schofield with 11 and Bilodeau and Anastasia Mujwid each had 8 digs. Bilodeau posted a team high 3 blocks, followed by Jorstad with 2, and Schofield and Widiker had 1 block each.

To wrap up the week, C-W played in the Northwestern Tournament on Saturday, Sept. 25. Overall, C-W finished the tourney with a 2-2 record. They won their first two matches in pool play against Drummond and Luck, but lost to the eventual tournament champion Turtle Lake Lakers and to Mercer in gold bracket play.

Against Drummond, the Bulldogs won in two sets, winning by scores of 25-11 and 25-22.

C-W kept the momentum rolling into its second match, downing Luck in three sets. The Bulldogs lost set one 25-17, but clawed their way back to wins in set two and three by scores of 25-20 and 15-10.

The Bulldgos played well against Turtle Lake, but the Lakers came out on top defeating the 'Dogs 25-21 and 25-18.

C-W's final match of the day was against Mercer, which also won in two sets when it downed C-W 25-14 and 25-21.

"We had a very fun day of volleyball and did some amazing things on the court at Northwestern. The girls brought a lot of energy throughout the day, and we were excited to come out of pool play undefeated to have a chance to play against the best teams in the tournament. With Mitchell still out with an injury, we rotated Mujwid, Ali Jenson, and Taya Whittenberger throughout the day in Mitchell's spot,

and all three girls had solid performances for us," coach Bohl said.

Claflin led the team in serving at 94.1% (3 aces, 17 attempts), followed by Whittenberger at 92.3% (2 aces, 13 attempts) and Jorstad at 91.4% (8 aces, 35 attempts—both led the team). Bilodeau (7), Jenson (4), Schofield (3) and Nichols (1) also each contributed ace serves. Widiker had a perfect pass rating on her only serve receive attempt, followed by Whittenberger at 2 (7 attempts), Mujwid 1.83 (6 attempts), Claflin 1.72 (43 attempts—team high), Jorstad 1.66 (38 attempts) and Schofield 1.62 (37 attempts).

Jenson finished with the best hitting percentage on the team at .214 (5 kills, 14 attempts), followed by Jorstad at .157 (28 kills, 89 attempts—both led the team) and Bilodeau at .039 (13 kills, 51 attempts). Schofield (8), Nichols (7), Widiker (3) and Whittenberger (1) also contributed kills. Nichols led C-W in assists with 28, followed by Jorstad with 18, Bilodeau (3), Widiker (3), Jenson (2), Whittenberger (2) and Claflin (1) assist.

Schofield had the most digs on the day for C-W with 29, followed by Jorstad with 23, Nichols (17), Claflin (17), Bilodeau (10), Jenson (9), Widiker (3), Whittenberger (3) and Mujwid (2). Jorstad led the team in blocks with 10, followed by Widiker (6), Bilodeau (3), Jenson (2), Nichols (2) and Whittenberger (1).

Youth Night coincided with C-W's homecoming week when the 'Dogs hosted Hayward on Tuesday, Sept. 28. The Bulldogs will have a weeklong break and travel to Spooner on Tuesday, Oct. 5.
