AQUINAS CATHOLIC SUPER SENIOR // ROWDY TRUKSA

David City Aquinas Catholic defensive lineman Rowdy Truksa has always wanted to play on defense.

“I like hitting people and chasing the ball handler,” he said. “My favorite part is running around, firing off the ball and hitting people.”

Opposing offenses felt Truksa’s presence last season. He was second on the team with 81 tackles and led the Monarchs with 12 tackles for loss.

Despite the numbers he’s put up, he said he believes there’s untapped potential.

“I haven’t exceeded my expectations,” Truksa said. “I’m always looking to get better, better myself and help others become better by leading them, too.”

While he doesn’t see himself as a superstar, his impact on the Monarchs was evident. The team allowed just 14.6 points per game last season. Aquinas went 7-3 and reached the quarterfinals of the Class C2 playoffs. Truksa’s side of the ball limited three offenses to seven points or fewer and produced one shutout.

“I think our team works together well and we just all work together to get the job done,” Truksa said.

Being in the trenches is tough business, and Truksa has had his share of injuries. In his sophomore season, he injured his left knee. Last year in the playoffs against Ord, Truksa was on the receiving end of a blindside hit. The hit resulted in a torn ACL, torn meniscus and a dislocated kneecap.

“That was pretty rough. The toughest part was being laid up for so long. I couldn’t really work out or get better,” he

said. “I couldn’t walk for about a month to let my meniscus heal, so that took a lot of time off not being able to train and everything. That was difficult. Obviously, it took forever to get back with physical therapy and everything so it just took a long time.”

Truksa said the toughest part of rehabbing from the injuries was the competitions he was slated to miss the rest of the high school sports season.

“I missed out on the Class B state powerlifting. I had a pretty good chance of doing good on that,” he said. “I was on track to break four state records in powerlifting. I also couldn’t do track or wrestling.”

The whole experience put everything in perspective for him.

“It taught me to not take everything for granted,” Truksa said. “You never know when your last play is going to be. Go 100% while you can.”

Off the gridiron, Truksa enjoys hunting and fishing, spending time with his family and working on cars with his father.

He enjoys the escape the outdoors provide.

“You’re just kind of out and outside,” Truksa said. “It’s kind of peaceful and quiet.”

As his senior season fast approaches, Truksa is setting lofty expectations before he rides off into the sunset.

“Hopefully, I make two-time All-State, break 100 tackles and lead our class with tackles for defensive linemen,” he said.

CLARKSON/LEIGH SUPER SENIOR // MAKENNA HELD

Clarkson/Leigh volleyball had one of its best seasons in program history last year. The Patriots went 21-7, reached the Class C-2 state semifinals and were one set away from playing for a title.

Makenna Held was a key contributor on that run to Lincoln. As a junior, she finished with a school record-breaking 828 assists. Clarkson/Leigh had 886 as a team. It was the most assists posted in a single season in school history.

“Beating the assists record meant a lot to me,” Held said. “It just showed that my hard work that I put in has really helped me and it’s paid off a lot.”

Held started volleyball in third grade when her parents put her in a youth program. Her passion for the sport only grew from there.

“My love for the sport just started after that,” she said. “I’ve been in some club teams that I really enjoyed playing with. I just love the sport.”

The team aspect, going all out to save a ball, celebrating points and spending weekends together on the bus and in different gyms during tournaments are all aspects of the game that Held simply can’t get enough of.

Clarkson/Leigh graduated five from last year’s historic group but has designs on maintaining that level of success thanks in large part to the return of Held. Bringing back the setter from any group, but even more so a successful one, is the most crucial of all positions to have back on the court.

But now a senior and in a position of leadership, Held said she’s had to learn to grow into the role. Last year’s class was a big help.

“A lot of the older girls, I just took things they did and used that to be a better leader,” she said.

That includes constant encouragement regardless of the results and being a good teammate on and off the court. Held’s never had a problem expressing herself and plans to use that to her advantage.

“I would describe myself as talkative and pretty outgoing,” she said. “I’m a good communicator.”

Off the court, Held enjoys hanging out with friends, going shopping and watching movies. When it comes to her future plans, she’ll be attending Nebraska and majoring in accounting.

While the team has had some moments that will always stand out, Held’s favorite memory was last season winning the subdistrict tournament and defeating Howells-Dodge in the state quarterfinals.

The team goal for the Patriots is to make it back to state. Coupled with that, Held has her eyes set on breaking her own

assists record again. It won’t be easy with a lot of new faces, but she still thinks it’s attainable.

“We have some good passers coming up and our hitters will really help me break that record, putting the ball again in successful places and just overall a team effort,” Held said. “I think that we can definitely do a lot of good things this year, which will help me beat my own record.”

The graduation of so many contributors, plus the unlikelihood of setting the record again provide Held the spark to light the flame. If there are any doubters in either regard, she’s ready to prove them wrong.

“It’s a goal for me to try to break the record this year because I want to prove to myself and to other people that we can be better than we were last year and do bigger things,” Held said. “Also, it’s just a sense of pride for myself that I can do that.”

DAVID CITY SUPER SENIOR – NEELY BEHRNS

Growing up, David City’s Neely Behrns had to choose between volleyball or softball.

She made the decision before entering middle school. The choice to go with volleyball came without conflict. The hard-court always had a pull she couldn’t deny.

“I just enjoyed it (volleyball) so much,” Behrns said. “I think a lot of it was also that all my friends and all of my teammates were going to be playing volleyball and that’s what made me really enjoy it a lot more. I enjoyed it myself and it helped that all my teammates were going to be playing with it.”

Playing volleyball has presented numerous opportunities, including playing on the Scouts’ varsity team all four years of her career.

“I’ve always been given the opportunity to play varsity, which is something maybe not everybody gets to do, but I’ve been able to do that for four years now,” Behrns said.

Behrns relishes the rollercoaster of emotions volleyball presents.

“It’s such a game of highs and lows. Even if you lose, there’s so many small highs in each individual game,” she said. “Each point is either a celebration or a loss, but then you get over that and you try to win the next point and it’s just so exciting.”

The mental side part of the game, not getting too high or too low is how she’s tried to conduct herself on the court.

“You have to battle through struggles throughout the game and try to overcome it,” Behrns said. “I think it’s such a great accomplishment when you win, and even if you don’t win, there’s so many things that you can look back on and be like, ‘Yeah, I did good on that.’”

The Scouts went 21-9 last season, their most wins in five years, behind a senior-laden group. Behrns led the team with 233 digs, was second in aces with 31 and third with 147 kills.

After the graduation of six seniors, she’s has taken on the role as a leader. That’s not a new role for her.

“I think I’ve always kind of been a leader,” she said. “I’ve certainly had to grow into a different role from last year because there were a lot of seniors last year, but I think I’ve kind of held some type of leadership role in a lot of the things I’ve done, so it’s kind of been natural.”

Communication and encouragement are two leadership qualities that Behrns values highly. She’s usually one of the loudest on the court, using her volume to encourage others. Constant communication also allows her to stay in the moment whether the Scouts are work-

ing their way out of the lows or enjoying the highs.

Being the leader of a team comes responsibilities. With a young roster coming in this year, Behrns understands the challenge ahead.

“This year is certainly adversity for me a little bit because last year, we had a bunch of experience with a whole bunch of older people. This year we’re kind of facing a very different circumstance with a lot of younger people coming up to play with us,” Behrns said. “I think it’s sort of a challenge for me, especially, to just have some patience and understanding that things will get better. People are learning. I just have had to learn to be the main person and have everyone build around me.”

Behrns hopes to improve her contributions and serve as a role model.

“I am a leader of the team, so I hope to be able to keep the team together and achieve that unity that will be necessary for us to be successful,” she said.

After her varsity career, she’ll be going to college with a focus on physical therapy, but she’s unsure where she’ll be attending. What does seem certain is that this is the end of the road in volleyball. That being the case, she’s going to relish every moment over the next few months.

“I’m trying not to think about it too much, but I just hope to make the best of it with everyone that I love playing with,” Behrns said.

SCHUYLER SUPER SENIOR – MARISOL DEANDA

An invite from her fifth grade teacher set the wheels in motion for Schuyler cross country runner Marisol Deanda.

“She (teacher) saw that I was faster than most of the other kids,” Deanda said. “She saw I was interested in it so she invited me to do a race with her and that’s how I kind of started.”

Deanda remembered that her mom was asked by the teacher if it was OK for Deanda to come along.

She said it was a short run around the park, with the teacher and a friend at the time, until the friend got tired. They finished the run by walking home.

Fast forward to this fall and Deanda couldn’t imagine where she’d be had that door not been opened for her.

“Honestly, it was just exciting for me to be getting into it,” Deanda said. “I never knew that was the start of something bigger.”

Following the brief run around the park, the teacher suggested Deanda enter the Columbus Downtown Runaround. If she remembers correctly, it was at about 11 years old when she took part in the event and completed the first competitive run of her life.

“I remember thinking, ‘Oh wow. I’m going to be racing against other people,’ and that was kind of exciting,” she said. “I remember I actually did pretty good in that. I was pretty excited about that, too.”

Deanda has competed at the Class B state championship meet in Kearney the last two years, placing in the top 30 both times. As a sophomore in 2019, Deanda was 18th with a time of 20 minutes and 57.2 seconds.

In her junior season, she shaved eight seconds off her previous mark and finished in 28th. In a few months she’s hoping her varsity career ends with a third straight trip to Kearney and an invitation to the medal stand.

“I’ve gone the past two years, but haven’t really medaled, and I was pretty close my sophomore year,” Deanda said.

In addition to running cross country in the fall, Deanda also runs track and field in the spring. She ran the 3200 meters, the 1600 and the 400-meter relay at the Class B district meet.

Deanda said her time at Schuyler Central High School has gone by really fast, but it hasn’t always been easy for her.

“It had its ups and downs,” she said. “Sometimes you just want to quit, but obviously I’m still here going at it.”

One of the main things she’s learned over her time is that not every race is going to go her way.

“I feel like just accepting that I’m probably not going to win every race,” Deanda said. “I feel like that’s probably

one of the hardest things that I had to face, but I feel like I’m getting better at it.”

In middle school, Deanda had a nagging knee injury and it limited her work during the summer, but she was good to go once she started running in high school.

However, when she had a bad race, negative thoughts crept in. She wondered if her future running opportunities were fading away.

“There’s just some other times when I have a bad race, I’m like, ‘Ugh, do I want to keep doing this or not?’” Deanda said. “At the end of the day, I always came back to it.”

With success had come responsibility. In her case, Deanda has been set as an example to follow. Over time she’s grown into that position.

“I honestly feel a lot of pressure, like my family, like my teammates, like my coaches,” she said. “They usually use me as a leader type of person, so I couldn’t let the rest of my teammates see me as a quitter or anything like that.”

Deanda said including everyone on the team, being supportive and always having a positive mentality are important leadership qualities for her. Heading into her final cross country season, she sees herself as a leader. There’s nothing that can prevent her will from achieving her goals.

“I’ve always been a pretty determined person once I think I want to do something. I just work until I get there,” Deanda said. “I feel like that’s really important.”

COLUMBUS HIGH SUPER SENIOR // ERNEST HAUSMANN

By returning to his past, Columbus High linebacker Ernest Hausmann is finding a clear path to the future.

For those who haven’t heard the story, the abbreviated version goes like this: Hausmann was born the son of Olive and Paul in Uganda, Africa. He grew up as part of a family he estimates had 12-15 siblings at the time of his birth. Olive and Paul have AIDS and were unable to provide for the family, often leaving Ernest without clothing.

A mutual friend who knew Hausmann’s uncle and Teresa Hausmann introduced the two and inspired an adoption process that took two years and two trips to Africa for Teresa’s husband, Bob. Eventually, after roadblocks and paperwork, Ernest arrived in Columbus when he was 5 and became part of the Hausmann family in 2008.

Thirteen years later he’s accepted a scholarship offer from Nebraska football and gone from third-world hunger to big-time

college football.

“It’s something that motivates me every day,” Hausmann says. “From where I was at, to where I am today, to where I want to be, it’s something I always use for motivation.”

That motivation has led to a completely new perspective on the game of football. Hausmann always loved competing on the gridiron, but the last year with time off for an injury, and considering the road he’s traveled, he’s found true love between the lines.

During basketball season a nagging injury from football reappeared and put him on the shelf. It didn’t necessarily happen in football, but that’s when it was getting more and more aggravated. In essence, it was a sports hernia. Better described, Hausmann was growing faster than his body could keep up with.

So, off the court and considering his future, he returned to his past, and as he mentioned, where he came from, where he is, how he got here and what it all means.

“This was the year I kind of started finding my path and my direction,” Hausmann says. “Because when you first get (to America) it’s about adapting and trying to be normal with everyone else. This year, I’ve made my own path, and I’m sticking to it.”

Hausmann was always athletically gifted regardless of where he chose to apply those talents. He started as a freshman on the Columbus High basketball team then did the same just months later in the fall of his sophomore football season. But what was in his future?

It doesn’t hurt when a D-I football program comes calling to internally validate your confidence, but as much as that helped, the time alone was even more valuable.

Putting all of his life into perspective, Hausmann discovered football wasn’t just something he did or something he enjoyed; it was something he loved. Had Nebraska not come calling, Hausmann says he still would

have found a way to keep playing.

But perhaps more importantly, off the field he learned that he didn’t have all the answers, and that’s fine.

“I’m a believer in God. He has a purpose in why he brought me here, why it was me out of all

my siblings that he brought me here,” Hausmann said. “I have a purpose here. I don’t know what it is, but I’m always searching. When I find it, I’m going to go all into it. I know there’s something big for me here.”

LAKEVIEW SUPER SENIOR // LILLY ROWE

There’s no shortage of fist-pumping arm raising or celebratory yelling on the Lakeview volleyball roster. But when it comes to the player who might be the leader in that regard, the emotional barometer if you will, Lilly Rowe always seems to stand out the most.

A six-rotation player who can put the ball away, dig it up, serve an ace and send a block to the floor, Rowe was an instrumental part of Lakeview’s historic run to last year’s third-place finish at the state tournament.

The Lady Vikes return every starter but the setter from that group and have more experience on the roster than almost every other squad in Class C-1. But while there’s certainly expectation surrounding the program, Rowe will make sure that it doesn’t turn into entitlement.

She’s coming off an ACL injury during basketball season and had to consider the possibility that she might not have been back to start the volleyball season, and even if she

was, might be just a shadow of herself.

As Lakeview prepares to take the court this fall, that’s not the case. Rowe began taking full reps in July and looks to be as ready as ever.

She confronted her fears about what could have been and takes an attitude of gratitude into the new season. It’s an outlook that comes with a big assist from grandma.

“I definitely think (the attitude) is something my parents taught me at a young age. My grandma, Diane Rowe, always tells me I need to keep a positive attitude with everything I do,” Rowe said before practice a few weeks back. “That and the Lakeview program really teaches you to keep a good mindset, be grateful for what you can do and what you do have.”

Following the historic volleyball season, Rowe started to come on as a contributor in the paint when fall became winter. She had found her place as a rebounder and a second option

down low to Reese Janssen.

Then came a mishap in a road game at Grand Island Northwest. The Lady Vikes were 7-3 at the time then went 2-10 down the stretch. Rowe’s loss wasn’t the only reason the season collapsed. She had surgery and began the rehab process with the long term in mind. Yes, there were questions, very unpleasant, often frightening questions. But Rowe never let her fears get the best of her. If there was ever a chance of that, she used it when doing all the meticulous, sometimes tedious exercises that come with getting back to full health.

When Lakeview made its traditional summer trip to a team camp in Northern Colorado, Rowe started out limited but quickly returned to almost full strength. She and the Lady Vikes won every match.

Like a pitcher in the middle of a no-hitter, Scotus Central Catholic senior Garrett Oakley prefers to mostly be left alone when he’s in the zone. These days, he’s in that zone quite often.

No, it’s not on the field where Oakley can be seen high-fiving and celebrating with teammates after a big play. It’s in all the minutes and hours he’s put into his craft in the weight room, running routes, catching passes, practicing blocks and other methods of preparation.

Since last summer, Oakley has spent much of his offseason time with former teammate Eric Mustard, a fullback and linebacker for the 2019 Scotus playoff team when Oakley was a sophomore. Mustard helped Oakley find a new direction in training, one with a much more focused, serious approach.

It’s something that not many of his teammates can keep up with, and something that he, sort of, prefers to be mostly private. It’s where he gets in the zone and finds his happy place.

Oakley, who has interest from Division-I college football, and has given a verbal commitment to Northern Illinois, has come a long way on his journey to big-time football. He’s not wasting any time ensuring he’s at his best for the Shamrocks and whatever the future may hold.

“It’s been crazy. Playing college football has always been a dream of mine, but playing at the highest level is really an honor,” Oakley said while taking photos in July. “It’s always been a goal, but now I’m striving for a bigger goal to compete and be at my best.”

Oakley’s summertime training usually consists of a two-hour session followed by running routes. He’s also in the weight room with the guys leading and doing his best to be a good teammate.

He’s put more on his shoulders than many teenagers his age, trying to put himself in the best position possible to be successful. Those days that he wakes up sore or unmotivated, he concentrates

on a Scotus motto: “Be the best.”

“Be the best person you can, be the best teammate you can, be the best worker you can; overall just be the best,” he said. “It’s a really good feeling when you know you’re out there outworking people.”

Oakley has played defensive back and wideout in his first three seasons. A wide receiver isn’t the most utilized position at Scotus, but Oakley has been finding ways other than catching passes to make a difference.

He was on the field as a freshman, pretty certain he wouldn’t be getting the ball, but knew he was out there for a reason. That reason became his ability to block on the edge and spring big plays.

It was an experience that has served him well. From a no-name freshman whose only purpose was to set up plays for others to now as the most recognizable athlete on the roster, Oakley hasn’t changed his outlook much.

He’s moving to tight end this
