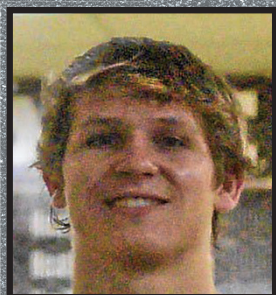
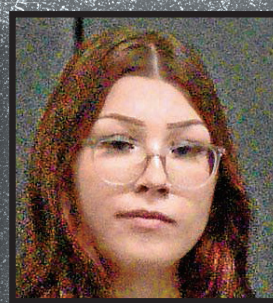

Columbus High Super Senior // Brenyn Delano

Brenyn Delano enters his final season at Columbus High seeking one of the few things he hasn't won — a wrestling state title.

The senior has made it to state his first three years with the program and has medaled all three years taking fourth as a freshman, third as a sophomore and sixth last season.

"My first expectation overall is to be state champion and to get that title finally here in my last shot," Delano said. "I'm one of the older kids. I'm a senior now, in the lighter weights of wrestling against some younger kids, so winning in dominant fashion is great. I know I can beat everybody I wrestle, nobody's better than me when I wrestle them, like, toe to toe, and I know I can go with anybody in the state."

Delano got his start in the sport through the Columbus Wrestling Organization.

"None of my family really wrestled besides a couple of cousins on my mom's side that were state medalists for Lakeview," Delano said. "I started wrestling when I was in first grade. I came home with a flyer from school for CWO when they were just starting that up and that's how it started."

Since starting in first grade Delano has competed in countless matches and tournaments in many states.

"Wrestling since I was young,

doing a lot of little tournaments and working with wrestling around the country, in Colorado, California, and everywhere to compete a lot in the offseason and work on getting better was great," Delano said. "Since I was younger I never really took any time off. I

stopped playing other sports to focus on wrestling, and I think that really helped me to become the wrestler I am today."

Since entering high school, Delano has a record of 108-21 with the Discoverers.

"I love high school. It's defi-

nately different coming in, especially in your freshman year," Delano said. "You could wrestle older guys, stronger guys; it's about having that mental toughness coming in. You just got to know you can wrestle and that you're a good wrestler. I think the biggest

thing in high school is believing in yourself when you compete and when you're on the mat."

Having such a strong record over three years, Delano hopes his run can continue so he can reach state for a fourth time.

"It'd mean a lot; you don't have a lot of guys that are four-time qualifiers. I'm also looking for my fourth state medal and those guys that can get up there and be consistent are rare to come by," Delano said. "It means a lot to me to be a part of that rare, select group of wrestlers that have that opportunity."

While entering his final season with the Discoverer wrestling program, Delano hopes to continue his athletic career past high school and compete in college wrestling. For his final year as a Discoverer, he is looking to leave his mark on the program before the high school experience is over.

"I want to be remembered, I want to be a guy that kids look up to and kids want to be," Delano said. "I'm looking for the take-down record this year, so I want guys to beat my record, surpass me in every way possible and be a better wrestler than I was. I'd like to be the guy they look up to that gives back to the community while helping out with the little kids and I want to be a role model for little kids so they can strive to accomplish what I have accomplished."

Lakeview Super Senior // Yordi Dominguez

Yordi Dominguez had his final football season at Lakeview come to a premature ending. He now enters his senior season on the mat looking to leave a mark on the Viking wrestling program.

Over the fall, Dominguez suffered a knee injury, but seems to have healed enough to get back on the mat and carry his success as a junior over to his senior season.

"My career has been kind of a grinder, I wasn't sure if I really had it in me. My junior year, things really changed for me. That was a pivotal point for me and I honestly proved myself wrong," Dominguez said. "My senior year, honestly, has been very difficult. I did tear my ACL earlier in the season and I wasn't sure how it was going to work out, or if I even wanted to wrestle. I accepted the adversity I was hit with; I'm a big believer in God having his plan for me and I think I'll shock a lot of people when they see me on the mat for the first time."

After the knee injury, Dominguez has been working on getting back to wrestling shape and is hoping to prevent any future injury.

"The smartest thing is definitely to not go and wrestle every meet, just reducing my chances of getting hurt, and then the ultimate goal is getting to districts and going to state," Dominguez said. "I have been going pretty hard in

practice and obviously sometimes there's moments where it does hurt, but I just take it back a little bit. I think it's a one day at a time type of thing."

Over the course of Domin-

guez's career he has been able to increase his win total and decrease his losing total. As a freshman he finished 15-22, as a sophomore he was 30-14 and last season he had a 41-5 record.

"I would say I have a lot confidence towards me. My freshman and sophomore year I was I wasn't as confident and I didn't think I knew what I was doing," Dominguez said. "As I was see-

ing a lot of wrestling and always around wrestling, I went to a lot big tournaments that really just built up my confidence. I knew I had it with me the whole time, I just finally unleashed it."

As a junior, Dominguez's 41-5 season ended after his first trip to Omaha, where he fell shy of earning a medal.

"I felt very grateful and it was a crazy feeling but I kind of knew I had that within me since my sophomore year," Dominguez said. "I think I just held back and I finally obtained something that I knew I could have gotten. It was a surreal experience seeing all of those people around the crowd and feeling all those emotions running through you when you're about to go wrestle. It was one of the better feelings you could ever get and I hope to get back again this year."

Dominguez got his start in the sport after watching his brother Kevin compete. After high school, he hopes to continue his athletic career in college, whether it be playing football or wrestling.

While the upcoming season could mark the end for Dominguez's wrestling career, he does look to end on a high note and medal at state.

"I want to place as high as I can on that podium," Dominguez said. "I don't want to just go there to be there and participate, I actually want to make little dent in that bracket."

Scotus Super Senior // Joanna Rusher

Scotus Central Catholic senior Joanna Rusher is no stranger to using her height as an advantage.

The 6-foot senior is coming into her final season with the Shamrock basketball team after starting her career in the sport at a young age.

"I started competitively playing in second grade because I was tall enough to where I could play up," Rusher said. "I've been around basketball my whole life. My dad (Brett) has always coached basketball and he used to play in a league at the Y and I would go to his games. I've been around basketball my whole life; it's a big part of who I am."

While Rusher originally got into the game because of her father, the family bond was still there for her when she reached high school.

"When my sister (Janae) was a senior, I was a freshman, so their whole class really gave me such a positive outlook on high school basketball," Rusher said. They showed me how to be a good leader because they really turned it around for us."

Rusher was able to grow her game by playing both with her sister and father while at home.

"We have a basketball hoop at my house and my dad would have us outside and we would just bang up against each other," Rusher said. "He would just

coach us and I feel like those are experiences I'm never going to forget. That made me a better, stronger and more confident

basketball player and it just means a lot."

Coming into her senior season, Rusher is looking to continue her

leadership on the floor after having a team-high 9.9 PPG, 5.6 RPG and a block a game in her junior campaign.

"Personally I want to keep going and to know while looking back that I gave it everything I had and don't have any regrets," Rusher said. "I just want to know that I worked as hard as I possibly could and got as far as I know that I could have gotten."

While Rusher has the goal of getting better as a player this season, her biggest goal as a senior is to get past district finals, which the Shamrocks have fallen in each of the last three years to end their seasons.

"Obviously I want to win it all but I also want to host districts because we've never hosted districts," Rusher said. "Having a good record going into districts and being able to be a higher seed so you can host a district final here would be just so much better and it makes a difference."

Rusher excels on the hardwood in both the fall with volleyball and in the winter with basketball. She also competes on the Shamrock track and field team in the spring but has no plans of doing sports in college. Instead, Rusher plans to pursue a degree in engineering.

"I feel like I've been playing basketball for my whole life so it's kind of crazy to think that this is the last year that I'm going to do that," Rusher said. "I have the mentality that we just have to give it our all, all the time, because you just don't know when it could be your last game."

Aquinas Super Senior // Jakob Kavan

Aquinas Catholic senior Jakob Kavan has accomplished a lot during his high school wrestling career.

He’s contributed to the Monarchs winning two consecutive state and state dual titles.

However, the one thing that’s eluded Kavan is an individual state title. The senior enters this season looking to break through and finish atop the podium for the first time.

“I’m excited to get back at it. Last three years were a struggle,” Kavan said. “Now this year I want to do the little things right and make sure I end up on top this year.”

Kavan earned his way into the state championship bout all three seasons. As a freshman, Kavan lost by an ultimate tie-breaker 4-3. He was defeated by Central City’s Cole Kunz for the second straight year in the final in 2022 by fall.

Last season, Kavan fell 9-6 to Plainview’s Kyler Mosel.

“I feel like in those matches towards the end I got a little ahead of myself and I didn’t wrestle aggressive like I should have and laid back a little bit,” Kavan said. “That’s what happens when you lay back, but this year I want to make sure I push through the whole match and do those little things right to win.”

Kavan entered this season

with a 125-19 career record. The senior said he’s worked on his endurance, lifted more and attended camps in preparation for the new season.

“As a freshman, I did not expect to do as good as I did and I did. I found out quickly it was going to be fun,” Kavan said. “Kind of had just a plateau the last three years and now I want to push pass that plateau this year.”

This year will be the first time Kavan is not wrestling with his older brother Zander Kavan. Jakob said Zander, who finished as a state runner-up last season, was pivotal in helping him along the way.

“It’s been awesome. When I was a freshman and he wasn’t, he showed me how to do stuff and taught me a lot,” Jakob said. “In the practice room, he taught me some moves. Just wrestling him, having someone at home to talk about what practice was like and stuff like that has been awesome.”

Jakob said he began wrestling when he was in kindergarten. He described what he’s learned from competing in the sport.

“I’ve learned you can do a lot more than you think you can. My freshman year, came in and I was ranked sixth and I ended up getting second,” Jakob said. “Anything can happen in wrestling. I learned that too. You got to be at your best at all times and never take it easy.”

Jakob is seeking to become the 30th state champion in school history while also helping the Monarchs chase a three-peat in both state competitions.

“I think doing the little things and pushing every day in practice, not just going through the motion,” Jakob said. “Just having the mindset of that you’re going to win and no one is going to beat you.”

David City Super Senior // Keaton Kloke

David City senior Keaton Kloke narrowly missed out on his first career state medal, falling in overtime in the heartbreak round.

That defeat has fueled his off-season, competing in various wrestling tournaments throughout the year to end his high school wrestling career on the medal stand.

“Really excited,” Kloke said. “Put time in the offseason just for this. Ready for it to start.”

After not winning a match in Omaha in his first trip as a sophomore, Kloke opened last season’s state tournament with a 9-0 major decision.

The senior bounced back from a 5-3 quarterfinal defeat with a 5-2 decision to put him on the doorstep of the medal round.

After the first three periods ended 0-0, the match went to double overtime when Milford’s Cooper Rea scored seven points to advance.

“It was definitely hurtful losing in double overtime, but it’s kind of driven me to work harder so I don’t get put in that situation this year,” Kloke said. “Every day I kind of come down here, we have these posters on the wall and I look at it every day and it drives me to work harder in practice, push to be better so I’m in a better spot this year.”

Kloke has steadily improved during his three seasons. After

an 11-13 freshman season, Kloke qualified for state as a sophomore following an eight-win improvement.

Kloke is coming off his best season winning 24 of his 31 matches and capturing a district title.

“It started really good and then obviously won districts. That was big,” Kloke said. “Got me ready for state and then at state, it was just nerves that got to me. Overall, it was really good. Hopefully, it can carry over from last year

to this year and maybe get even better.”

Kloke wrestles year-round, including in the fall while also running as a member of the cross country team. His main focus has been the neutral position and expanding the number of shots.”

“Started off with a bunch of camps throughout the summer trying to work for the podium this year,” Kloke said. “I got stopped short last year. Just hoping for a medal, but the goal is obviously gold.”

Kloke said he’s learned that he’s mentally stronger and tougher than he thought. After watching older wrestlers when he was young, Kloke is now in those shoes looking to add to David City’s rich wrestling history.

“It’s great to be a part of it. We’ve obviously had a lot of success throughout the years. A lot of state champions,” Kloke said. “To be a part of it is awesome. Even more awesome when knowing you can become a part of them.”

After David City claimed two state medals last season, Kloke hopes he adds to that total this season.

“Pushing myself through practices and being aggressive. Past years I’ve been a little bit on the defensive side,” Kloke said. “Last year, started going more offensive and this year it’s going to be trying to be really aggressive working on takedowns first before the other guy.”

Schuyler senior Carly Wemhoff brought home one of the first girls wrestling NSAA state medals in school history as a sophomore.

After missing out on the chance to compete at districts last season, Wemhoff enters her senior season looking to lead a young Warriors team and earn a chance to get back to Omaha.

“We have a lot of new people coming out this year,” Wemhoff said. “We’ve gained a lot of inexperienced people, so I’m really excited to help them learn some things and to watch them improve as well as the other girls on the team.”

Wemhoff went 20-6 in the first NSAA sanctioned wrestling season. She reached the semifinals and wound up placing fourth following a win in the consolation semifinals.

Last season, Wemhoff won five more matches and finished as conference champion in her final meet of the season.

“It was pretty good,” Wemhoff said. “I felt like it went pretty good until the end just because I was dealing with my own personal stuff. I still felt like it overall it did go really well. I was happy with the ways things went.”

Wemhoff sees herself as a leader to the younger, inexperienced

wrestlers. She said she’s been trying to make things as easy as possible.

“It’s not the same as middle school,” Wemhoff said. “I’ve been doing those extra things

to get them organized and help them stay where they need to be. It’s a lot of pressure as a senior to

try to lead all these people, but I’m trying my best.”

Wemhoff began wrestling when she was in seventh grade. She said she’s made tremendous growth on and off the mat.

“My very first year was not great, but I learned a lot. Since then, I feel like I’ve made so much growth as a person and as a wrestler mostly because of the sport,” Wemhoff said. “I’ve just come a long way. The way that I wrestle and the way I handle things on the mat and outside of wrestling because of it. The whole thing has made me a better person overall.”

Wemhoff will look to become the second Schuyler girls wrestler to qualify for multiple state meets and the first to win multiple medals. Her goals for this season include finishing her career with a 70% winning percentage.

“Those extra things really count. The camps, the extra conditioning, the extra mat time. That’s just really what stands out when trying to get down to Omaha. I went to a couple of camps this summer,” Wemhoff said. “Did some other stuff and I feel like just showing up to practice every day is really important so you don’t miss anything and you get that extra practice in that other people are going to be lacking.”

Osceola Super Senior // **Kale Gustafson**

Osceola senior Kale Gustafson sits just 477 rebounds away from holding a state record, a tall task to some but the 6-foot-5 Bulldog is looking to put his name in the record book.

Gustafson currently holds the school record with 899 after three seasons, including 436 as a junior.

“I really am just chasing to be the best rebounder in history to break that record,” Gustafson said. “That’s what I’m chasing. It feels good at this point and all, but I’m not going to be happy until I get to that point. It’d be awesome, it’d feel great to do something like that and get my name out on the map. There’s just a lot of work you put in at the weight room and it’ll feel amazing if that happens.”

As a junior, Gustafson finished with 16.1 RPG, which is the best mark returning in the state. He is also the leading returning scorer in Class D-2 after having 21.7 PPG last season.

“The rebounding helps a lot and that helps out with scoring when you get them on the offensive end,” Gustafson said. “Being the best rebounder in the state, like, coming into it, is great.”

While Gustafson is chasing a state record in his final season at Osceola, he didn’t get his start on the court until fourth grade.

“I actually did little kids wres-

ting because we didn’t really have it until about fourth grade. I always played with older kids growing up when I played back-

yard basketball,” Gustafson said. “I was never really playing with kids my age. It really started when I was a first grader, playing

with my fourth grade and fifth grade friends. When I got into it in fourth grade, I was a bigger kid for my age and I would just

always grab rebounds and put the ball back in the hoop. Getting into high school, nothing really changed there, I’m under the hoop getting the boards and putting it in the hoop.”

Despite chasing an individual record, Gustafson knows the importance of his teammates and coaches who have guided him along his journey with the Bulldogs.

“They’re incredibly helpful, (coach Jason Zelasney) has been there every step. He kind of doubts me and that kind of motivates me more. He tells me I can’t do it and then I go do it,” Gustafson said. “That helps an incredible amount when we have a relationship like that. My teammates are in here every day and they make me better. None of them are taking it easy on me so that helps tremendously.”

In his time at Osceola, the Bulldogs have made the state tournament each of the three years and, in the most recent trip, the team lost in the opening round.

“Losing in the first round like we did kind of hurt a lot because we really thought we’d be a lot farther and kind of wanted to get to the championship last year,” Gustafson said.

“Going into this season, when we get to that spot we know every game is just a mission. We got to get to that final one. This is my last year and that’s my number one goal.”

Clarkson/Leigh Super Senior // **Chloe Hanel**

Clarkson/Leigh senior Chloe Hanel enters her final high school basketball season looking to carry over the momentum from a run to the state volleyball championship match.

The Patriots, with an inexperienced roster, grew throughout the basketball season and qualified for their second state tournament as a co-op school following a 20-6 season.

“We’re really excited. We made it to state last year and we did lose first round, but we’re going to use that as confidence,” Hanel said. “We want to make it again this year and we bond really well as teammates. It’s just going to be a fun, successful season.”

Hanel had her best season last year averaging 19.4 points, 6.1 rebounds and 4.0 steals per game. The senior scored double-figures in all but three games last season posting 31 points twice.

Hanel enters this season as already the school’s all-time season and career leader in points, steals, two-point field goals and blocks.

“It’s been a blast. Starting with Cassidy Hoffman and Alissa Kasik, those girls really helped me become the player I am,” Hanel said. “I was obviously nervous and just like a little freshman, but to grow into the leader, the player what I am today, everyone that I played with helped me do that.”

Along with her basketball success, Hanel excelled on the volleyball court. The Patriots took home their first state runner-up trophy in school history after falling short of a reverse sweep

against perennial state power Lincoln Lutheran.

“It was so much fun with my team. We all bonded so well. Just playing with them was not even playing,” Hanel said. “It was just

like doing something fun with my friends. I think that helped us to get to where we ended because we all just loved each other so much.”

Hanel signed to play volleyball

at D-II power Wayne State College. Over her four-year volleyball career, Hanel recorded 1,731 kills and 338 blocks. She finished as the state leader in hitting percentage (.463) this fall.

“Coach (Scott) Kneifl is amazing. He was super supportive at some of my games. Just told me what he saw in me and I think that was like I want to be a part of that,” Hanel said. “Wayne was super successful too in their journey, so I want to be a part of that type of team. It was just an awesome environment and everything.”

Along with her state medals in track and field, Hanel attributed her success in all three sports to believing herself and her teammates.

“By doing that, it brought everybody up and it helped everybody want to succeed and do the best they could,” Hanel said. “I think just having that confidence, not just for myself but everybody else was what helped me be successful these last four years.”

Clarkson/Leigh basketball seeks to contend for its first state title since Leigh won it all in 1996. A win down in Lincoln in March would be the first in the co-op’s history.

“We want to make it down to state and make a run,” Hanel said. “It’s going to be fun. We’re excited and I think we have that confidence this year.”

High Plains Super Senior // **Wyatt Urkoski**

High Plains senior Wyatt Urkoski has qualified for the state tournament in his first three years.

After going 1-2 as a freshman in Omaha, Urkoski reached the medal stand as a sophomore placing fourth. Last season, Urkoski took the next step and reached the state championship match to claim silver.

Entering his senior season, Urkoski is chasing gold.

“Just exciting knowing it’s my time, my season. It’s what I’ve been leading up to. You,” Urkoski said. “It’s what my coaches, my family and my friends have been helping me get to and that feeling of knowing it’s my last season. I got to get ready to go.”

Urkoski defeated Cambridge’s Hunter Perks by an 8-1 decision and he pinned Garden County’s Gunner Roberson and Howells-Dodge’s Lane Belina to wrestle for state gold.

In the title bout, Neligh-Oakdale’s Levi Drueke defeated Urkoski 11-2 to finish on the top spot of the podium.

“That tournament is ... any hard practice, anything in my way ... that’s one of the things I think about when I’m going through anything tough or any tough matches,” Urkoski said. “That’s just the one thing I think about and what all of this is leading up to. The most important thing

about the season is that place.

Urkoski started wrestling when he was 4 years old. Over his first three high school seasons, the senior has compiled a 117-41 re-

cord.

“It’s been tough. My whole problem with all my years is mainly the weight aspect of it,” Urkoski said. “This year

shouldn’t be too bad. Mentally I just got to get myself prepared to finish out the season strong.”

His favorite part of wrestling is that it’s just him on the mat

against his opponent.

“For winning or losing, it’s nobody else’s fault. It all depends on you. It’s not a team sport. It all depends on yourself and how strong mentally and physically you can be,” Urkoski said. “I think that’s amazing. I don’t have to rely on very many other people to win that match or to move on forward in their wrestling career. It all depends on yourself.”

Urkoski said wrestling has taught him not to give up when times are tough, lessons he’ll apply beyond the wrestling mat.

“Knowing that just makes me feel a lot better when I get older and when I have a job,” Urkoski said. “When the time is tough, I just know that I can think about all the times that I’ve struggled in wrestling and I can relate back to that time and mentally be prepared for after high school.”

Urkoski is seeking to become the sixth High Plains state wrestling champion in school history and the first since Logan Russell won his second straight in 2018.

“It definitely boosted my confidence whenever I made it to the finals and knowing that I’m a state runner-up. It shows me that I can make it there. That I can do that and be that one person to be there,” Urkoski said. “Knowing I did not win last year just teaches me that I have work to do and that I have a long way to go before I can be that guy, be that champion that I want to be.”
