

AUSTIN COFFIN - SHELBY-RISING CITY BOYS BASKETBALL

Austin Coffin will never forget the look he and his cousin shared that one night on the court. The Shelby-Rising City senior was just a freshman back then, a night removed from that same cousin breaking the school record for 3-pointers in a game with six.

It was a record that only lasted 24 hours. Coffin tied the mark and had enough time to break it if the opportunity presented itself.

"He wanted the coach to take me out and I said, 'Coach, leave me in.' He set a screen for me and I drained

a 3 right there and broke his record," Coffin remembers. "I'll never forget (the look we gave to one another). That was funny."

Since then, Coffin has established himself as one of the best players in Nebraska high school basketball. He's been named an all-state and all-conference player, averaged 15.5 points per game last season to go with four rebounds and 2.5 assists and has averaged 10 or more points every year since his sophomore season.

He was built by every day trips to the driveway shooting on his home hoop, a summertime basketball league and a summer coach who helped him understand staying level-headed and moving on to the next play.

Still, he didn't necessarily expect it, especially right away.

"It kind of all just fell into place. Only being a freshman and weighing 140, I wasn't thinking about that too much," he said. "Once I got my confidence up, that helped me out."

Now, he's the guy others look to for confidence. "This year I'm hoping for a 15-plus win season. We have a lot of potential," he said. "Last year, we had a lot of heart breakers. It could have been the other way around. We could have been 14-17. I think this is the year we can step up and put it all together."

Though his place in Shelby-Rising City history is likely secure, Coffin is still working on building that legacy. Although being remembered as one of the best players and perhaps the best shooting guard in program history, one other title would be even more meaningful.

"And, the most selfless player on the team," he said.

WILL DANIELSON - DAVID CITY BOYS BASKETBALL

Will Danielson has had his share of losing. As the Scouts starting quarterback, he endured a 1-8 season as a sophomore before helping improve that mark to 2-7 then 4-5.

The one win two years ago required a game-winning drive over Conestoga. Though it only meant avoiding a winless season, Danielson regards it as one of his favorite memories, "like we won the Super Bowl," he remembers.

On the basketball court, Danielson has been part of a program that also managed a lone victory his freshman year before improving to 6-15 and 9-13.

As he prepares for his final season in a red and black jersey, it's those type of experiences, difficult as they have been, that have shaped Danielson into the player he is today.

"It was a struggle," he recalls of that first basketball season. "I knew we had a pretty good group of freshmen and sophomores that knew what we could be. We just needed to work harder than they had been in the years before and start building the program back up."

The trouble was, Danielson believed some of his older teammates checked out midway through that one-win campaign. Not him, his fight endured no matter the outcome.

"I was still trying to start," he said. I was one of the first guys off the bench, and my goal was to start. I came in every day with the attitude of trying to beat out the older guys who weren't doing it for us."

His resolve led to leading the team in rebounding the last two years and scoring the most or second-most points in that span as well. He's a captain this season, been awarded an Academic All-State award and named second team all-conference.

Now he's also embracing his role as a leader, confident in how to shape the program based on the challenges he's faced.

"I want to be known as the class that started at 1-21, had six wins, then nine then this last year building on that even more," he said. "It shows that even if you're unsuccessful when you're young, if you keep putting in the time and the effort, you can change things around."

JACOB FRENZEN - LAKEVIEW WRESTLING

Most wrestlers who finish their season with a loss in the state title match look back on that experience as one of the most painful of their career.

And Lakeview senior Jacob Frenzen wishes it had turned out differently. But for a guy who struggled with his health all year, just being

at state for the first time was a major accomplishment.

Winning three matches and finding himself in the final was something he'll never forget. Though he'd rather have a championship story to tell, he's got one more chance to make that happen.

"There were a lot of ups and downs to my season. I got sick and didn't wrestle very well. I went to state not even ranked, so I think I exceeded probably what was expected of me," Frenzen recalls. "I upset an unbeaten kid along the way. That was pretty fun."

Frenzen never missed a match in his 38-12 season but was never really 100 percent after a two-week battle with the flu.

He was constantly gulping Gatorade and lost five pounds due to a loss of appetite.

He entered state with a matchup against a 27-21 senior and advanced with a first-period pin. Up next was undefeated Rhett Trail of Nebraska City. Frenzen handed that senior his first loss in a 5-4 decision.

In the semifinals, he earned a 3-0 win over Garrett Cornwell of Boone Central/Newman Grove - an opponent he split with in the regular season. Cornwell picked up a 10-3 win in the semifinals of the Madison Tournament. Frenzen gained the upper hand six days later in a dual that took a tiebreaker.

He came up just short of a state title with a 6-0 loss to Alex Vandyke of Omaha Skutt.

"At the time, I was really disappointed, but when I thought about it, I was our school's first finalist in, I think, 18 years," Frenzen says. "Now that just drives me. Now that I got second, I need to get first and show everyone I really do belong on top."

KAEGAN HELD - CLARKSON/LEIGH GIRLS BASKETBALL

Kaegan Held has been a fixture in the Clarkson/Leigh girls basketball lineup since her freshman season. She's an able scorer and certainly contributes on the offensive side of the floor, but that's not where her true value is found.

Nope, in the age of 3-pointers, high scoring games and up-and-down action, Held prides herself in what she provides on the other end of the floor.

"I like defense the best," she says. "I think it's fun. I can guard really well, and I usually take the other team's

best girl."

Held is part of a Patriots girls basketball program that has made its hay playing defense since she first stepped on the court.

Clarkson/Leigh gave up 46.4 points per game in 2016 then 40.6 in 2017 and 36.8 a year ago. Her individual numbers have gone from averaging 4.7 points per game as a freshman to over 11 as a junior.

Held has also made increases in rebounds per game and been around a steady two assists per game and close to two steals.

As a group, the Patriots more than doubled their win total in Held's sophomore year then finished above .500 for the first time in a while at 14-10 a year ago.

And there could be even more ahead. Held is part of a roster that includes five seniors, eight regular players and one back who missed last season with a torn ACL.

She was selected Second Team All-East Husker Conference a year ago and is familiar with leading from the front, having been a starter as a freshman in both basketball and volleyball.

Though she's not certain where yet, Held will continue her hoops career at the next level in college, something she's earned by countless hours of training and preparation.

"It's pretty exciting," she says. "I just hope I can have the same success I've had in high school."

With the way she approaches the game, that seems like a certainty.

"Coach puts me on the best girl because I can stop her," Held says. "I take pride in that."

MADISON HELMAN - EAST BUTLER GIRLS BASKETBALL

Madison Helman is somewhat superstitious. Maybe anti-superstitious is the way to describe it.

She didn't play particularly well in a game as a freshman, and, ever since, has exclusively worn white socks during competition.

She had black on that day.

But if there's a little bit of negativity she tries to avoid by sticking to white socks ever since, her overall goal as a teammate is to remain positive.

"I want to go out knowing I was a team leader, that I set the standard," she says. "Not maybe as someone to look up to, but someone who did things the right way"

Helman and her East Butler teammates come into the 2018-19 season with a brand new head coach and, like Helman, a sunny outlook on what's possible.

The program has steadily been building since the last winning season in 2015 with six wins the year after, two in 2017 and nine a season ago. Finishing above .500 is something Helman and the rest of the group are shooting for in 2019.

From a freshman year that included appearances in 20 games with 2.3 points per contest, to last year, 23 games and 7.7 points, Helman's personal development as a player has almost mirrored that of the program.

It's been consistent because she's been consistently positive.

"I'm not very vocal, but I try to get the team pumped up in the locker room before the game," she says. "When things break down, I try and be the level head that gets us back together."

"When something good happens, I try to recognize it because we need to react to things like that."

Through it all, she's tried to stay in the moment, as she says, focus on the positive. Those moments though,

are running short.

While she's not ready to get sentimental about all of it just yet, she is trying to soak in as much as she can.

"I want to be remembered for being positive and being supportive," she says. "I was someone they could come talk to in the good times and the bad."

BAILEY LEHR - SCOTUS GIRLS BASKETBALL

There was something just different about the end of the season for Scotus Central Catholic girls basketball a year ago.

The state championship was, of course, the culmination of it all. And enjoyable as that moment was, it was perhaps the journey to the moment that Shamrock senior Bailey Lehr will

always cherish the most.

"We definitely had our ups and downs during the season. Sometimes it seemed more downs than ups. Near the end of the season, we started to push through and we all clicked so well together," Lehr remembers. "Once we had to play No. 1 (Lincoln Christian in the district final) we were all kind of nervous. Then we pulled off the win and we were all kind of like, 'Well, we just beat the No. 1 team. We can do this.'"

It was a must-win game. Due to other results around the state, Lehr and the Shamrocks would have been pushed out of the wildcard spot available for state.

So instead, SCC won 10 straight after a loss to Lincoln Christian on Jan. 12 and claimed its fifth state championship.

On a roster that included eight seniors, Lehr earned herself an all-state award as a junior.

She was set to be the driving force for a younger, less experienced team in the upcoming season until a preseason injury at a scrimmage left her on crutches after collapsing in pain during the first quarter.

Three days later she received the bad news: Lehr tore her ACL and meniscus. Her basketball season, and perhaps Scotus athletic career, quickly came to an end.

"For the first time in my life, I will become a permanent manager, and it will be different for me, and it will be frustrating and it will be hard, but I'm going to stay optimistic and put a smile on my face," she says. "The girls are just so young, they need an example."

"Coming from another player it helps. I just want to be that extra coach and that teammate they can go to, and I just want to help them out. I still want to see them succeed. I'm still part of the team. It's still fun for me whether I'm playing or not."

JESUS MAGANDA - SCHUYLER WRESTLING

The goal is what every Nebraska wrestler sets his sights on at the beginning of the season and the beginning of a career—a state championship. However, in the case of Schuyler senior Jesus Maganda, the prospects to finish his career on top of the podium are greater than most.

Maganda has finished very season of varsity wrestling at the state tournament. As a freshman, he went 0-2 to conclude a 21-17 season. He was the only freshman to qualify for the Class B 220-pound state bracket.

A year later, he won his opening match but lost in the

quarterfinals relegating him to the consolation bracket. No matter. Maganda won three straight and worked his way into the third place match where he settled for fourth after a 6-1 decision.

Last season he made a run all the way to the semis before losing to the eventual champion 3-2. But again he responded and bounced back with a 7-6 victory for third place.

As he prepares to make another run to Omaha, Maganda stands as one of the most accomplished wrestlers in the state, with some unfinished business to attend to.

"I think about it sometimes. I was just one point away," Maganda said. "Hopefully I get closer this year."

Maganda won't intimidate anyone with his size. He's been a fixture at 220 pounds for the Warriors each of the past three seasons and is in that spot again for his final year on the high school mat.

However, in the days, weeks and months that have progressed since those first matches in late 2015, Jesus, or Chuey, as he prefers, hasn't changed much, at least vertically.

Though he's spent time in the weight room, and strengthened up every year of his career, his frame stopped at 5-8.

But for those who underestimate him because of his size, they've paid the price. Chuey has won 98 matches and improved every year from that 21-17 mark three years ago to 39-7 then 38-4.

"Probably my favorite memory is still to come," he said. "I just really want that title. That's what I'm looking forward to."

CARSON ZWINGMAN - COLUMBUS WRESTLING

Carson Zwingman has made a lifetime of memories on the wrestling mat.

Yet, it's an incident on the bus that holds nearly equal weight in his long list of Discoverer moments.

"One time we had a mouse on the bus. We were driving to Millard South, and it was crawling on the window. It scared everyone," he remembers. "You've never seen so many wrestlers jump and try to get out of the way."

Zwingman might be seeing some of the same reactions from his opponents when he steps on the mat this year.

The Columbus High senior has qualified for state each season of his career—culminating last season with a runner-up finish.

He has won 115 matches and is in position to break the school record in that category.

Needless to say, he'll be the favorite almost every time he straps on the headgear.

His goal is to get back to that moment on Saturday night in Omaha.

"It motivated me this summer to work out harder and lift weights harder," he says. "It was an awesome experience. I want to be there again."

Zwingman's run to the title match included two pins in each of the first two rounds, a close 3-2 victory in the semifinals then a 10-5 loss that denied him the gold medal.

It was his first state medal to end a 47-10 season. Zwingman went 44-10 the year before and 24-28 as a freshman.

"I didn't place the years before, I kind of choked my other years, but I wasn't shocked because I knew the work I had put in," he says. "It was still eye-opening. It was reality coming to me. It was a crazy experience."

Zwingman returns this year as a favorite in his weight class on a team that can be counted among the favorites

in Class A.

Columbus returns 12 state qualifiers and all 14 members in the lineup from a year ago.

"It's big. I want to go out there and score bonus points every dual, every tournament," he says. "I want to give our team a chance to win every time out."

"There's definitely a buzz in the room. Everyone is grinding out there."

JOSEPH REIMERS - AQUINAS WRESTLING

Joseph Reimers insists there's no pressure. No pressure to win another title, no pressure to make history, no pressure to join one of the most elite clubs in Nebraska wrestling.

Sure, there are some exceptionally special things within his grasp, but he didn't put himself in position by looking too far ahead.

"Right now it's just trying to get better every day in the room, really. That's where I'm trying to put the most pressure on myself right now," Reimers says. "I know if I do that, good things are going to follow."

The Aquinas senior had his hand raised as a state champion for the second time as a junior. His title match victory was his second in a row and completed his first-ever unbeaten season.

Reimers' win made it 34 individual titles all-time for Aquinas and made him the ninth Monarch to have ever won two state titles.

None have ever won three in a row let alone three total. Only 114 wrestlers in Nebraska history have ever won three titles in the past 88 years since Jack Vierson of McCook did it the first time in 1930.

The state meet has celebrated at least one wrestler winning a third title every year since 1990. Reimers can keep that streak alive coming up in February.

But again, let's not get ahead of ourselves. "I've been blessed with some pretty great practice partners and past state champions like Kyle Petree and Matthew Kindler. Working with them, it's a process. You just try and get better every day," Reimers says. "It's kind of a long, slow process. When you start to see results, it makes you love the sport that much more and pour yourself into it."

Reimers, somewhat unexpectedly, advanced to the semifinal round as a freshman before coming up one win short of wrestling for a title. He was unranked at the time and, as is often the case at 170 pounds, facing a bracket of mostly upperclassmen.

Since he burst onto the scene that weekend, he's established himself as one of the premier talents in the state.

Yet, it's the times he came up short that he perhaps remembers the most.

"I've got seven high school losses, and I could probably name them all," he joked. "You definitely remember the close, competitive matches, win or lose, when you're pushed to your limit."


"I'm not going through the motions, I'm trying to perfect this. It's the same thing at home and in the classroom."
