Typically, that struggle came down to twins Jason and Jacob. Tyler, the oldest, was happy to watch that struggle, and occasionally create the discontent.

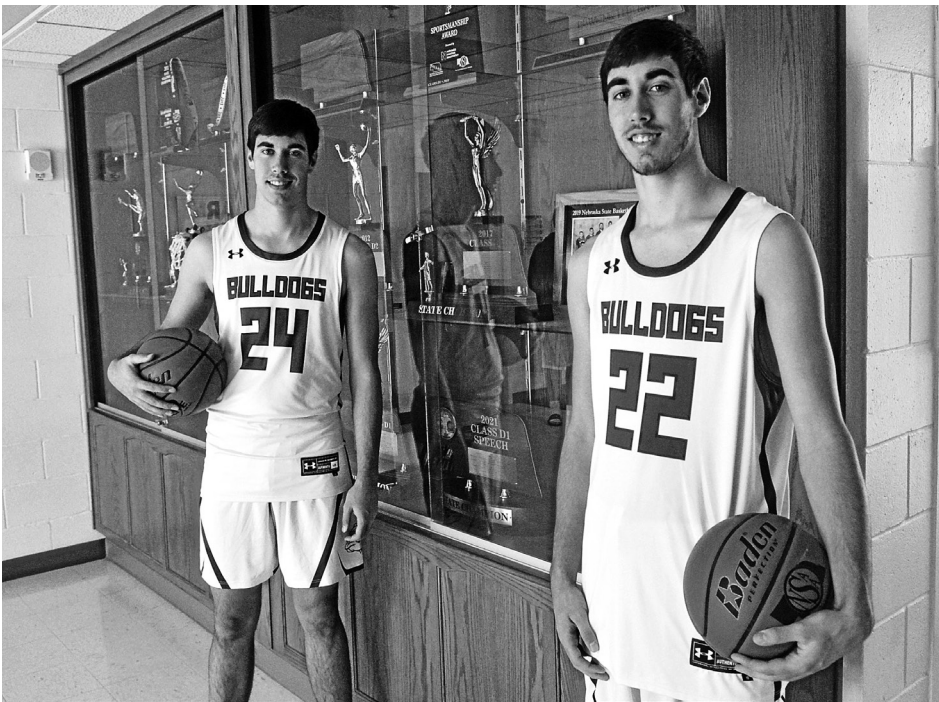
But rarely was any needed; it came naturally. Jacob and Jason, who shared a Lightning McQueen racecar bed in their early years, often ended up separated despite those sleeping arrangements. A few times, Jason said, he kicked Jacob out of bed and made him sleep on the floor.

Everything was a challenge, even mowing the yard. That meant Tyler and Dad, Greg, could avoid that chore, but it didn't mean the lawn looked a whole lot better than when the two started.

Then there were battles on Playstation, most often, playing Madden. The number of broken controllers over the years would rival the total supply most stores keep on hand.

And, of course, there were battles in the driveway playing basketball.

"We were playing one-on-one and (Jason) was pushing me up against the garage, and we have these brick pillar things, and he pushed me into one," Jacob remembered. I sliced my eyebrow and had to get four stitches. It was funny because mom thought we were fighting when I came in crying. She wouldn't answer me because she was like, 'just go deal with it,' like it was just a regular old argument. But it was like, 'no, I'm actually bleeding.'"

"I can't think of an example right now, but he's not all civil when he plays," Jason said in response.

But as much as the pair might have disagreed, battled and bruised each other over the years, that's specific to their relationship. Outsiders aren't given the same sort of leeway in competition. When it comes to suiting up for Humphrey/

Lindsay Holy Family, the Sjutses have each other's back.

They head into their senior season as reigning champs in Class D-1 and with two titles already to their name. They won one with Tyler as freshmen then watched hopes for back-to-back titles unravel in the semifinals as sophomores.

If there's a benefit to that, it's knowing

what it's like to chase a title the year after earning one. This time, the Sjutses will try to repeat with the Bulldogs as members of Class C-2.

"We tell our guys it's going to be a grind," Jason said. "You can't take anything for granted; every game is important to win to put yourself in position come postseason time to make a run."

Winning two in a row is difficult for a lot of reasons. The reason Jason and Jacob might be more familiar with than most is having a target on your back. Living in a town like Humphrey, two guys 6-foot-5 and 6-4 don't just walk around anonymously. That they've won two state titles only adds to their minor celebrity status.

There are no quick trips or errands inside city limits. But Jason and Jacob also appreciate everyone's kind words and interest in what they do. Faith in the Lord and a focus from mom and dad on humility has influenced all of their interactions.

That is the legacy they hope to leave behind.

"We want to be a good example for younger kids. We want to be role models for them, want them to look up to us, want to be like us, be better than us," Jacob said. "We try to stay humble as much as we can. All the other stuff is nice, but at the end of the day we just want to go out there, help our team succeed and do it the right way."

"We want little kids to see that winning is a lot of fun," Jason said. "But even if you can't win there's a lot of ways you can succeed on the court. We just want to be that example."

Levi Bloomquist – Columbus High Super Senior

Columbus High senior Levi Bloomquist was a fish out of water at state last season. After competing on the floor of the CHI Health Center in Omaha the previous two years, Bloomquist was watching the proceedings from the stands.

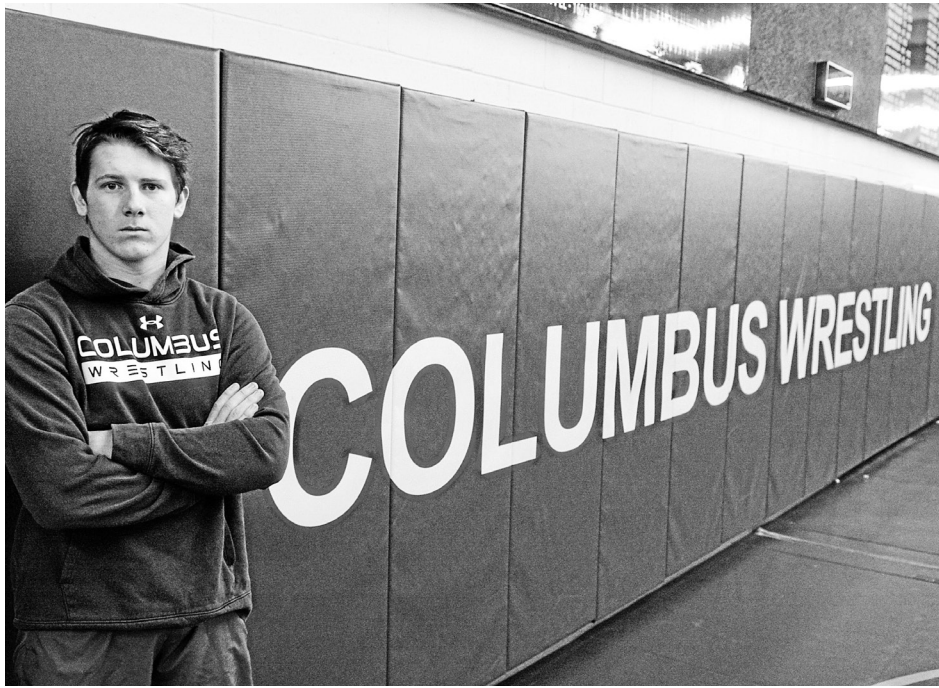
A freak shoulder injury late in the year prevented him from continuing in the final weeks of the season. It was supposed to be the year he finally broke through for a medal.

"I get injured quite a bit," Bloomquist said with a smirk. "They're all weird."

This one was a fracture to his coracoid bone – part of the shoulder assembly that connects the bicep to the pectoral and has been referred to as the "lighthouse of the shoulder."

Bloomquist was at the UNK Midwest Duals in Kearney when he heard a pop and felt something release. He finished the match quickly, pinned his guy in 30 seconds, then went back out six days later in a dual. He lost that match 10-2 and called it a season. It took three or four trips to the doctor, X-rays and tests to determine what exactly happened. He could continue to wrestle if he could deal with the pain, but he could also cause further damage.

"I was pretty sad and I was mad that we were so close to state and districts," Bloomquist said. "I thought I'd be at the state tournament and win a couple matches. Having that taken away, that was tough. Coming in and watching the guys practice and get ready for state was

really tough."

And as hard as it was not to compete, not being around his teammates was perhaps the hardest to deal with. Win or lose, he wanted to be among the group, encouraging and enjoying everyone's success. He

did, however, race right past the security guard to greet Blayze Standley after the state title win.

Bloomquist won't settle for watching again this year. First, there's the bad taste left from last season. But also, for any

wrestler who breaks into the Columbus High lineup as a freshman, big expectations are created. That he doesn't yet have a state medal makes Bloomquist feel somewhat behind.

"I've got to get one now. I've got to get up there (on the podium)," he said. "I'm not going to settle for no medal or just finishing sixth. I want to get higher."

Bloomquist is somewhat of a surprise to be in this position at all. Unlike the rest of his teammates, he wasn't on a wrestling mat like they were all the way back to kindergarten. He didn't start until the sixth grade and wasn't very good.

It took a few years before he put together a winning record. Then all of a sudden, after one teammate went down a weight and he beat another in a wrestle off, Bloomquist was in the Discoverer lineup as a freshman.

If he had it to do all over again, he would have started much sooner, but only for the relationships. The brotherhood between wrestlers is hard to explain for those who aren't involved. Bloomquist can't exactly put it into words other than to say its special.

But as far as getting a late start and suffering through losses, Bloomquist said those struggles are what made him into what he is today.

"I think it's what drove me. I think it's what helped me get in the right mindset," he said. "You never give up, keep going hard until the end. I feel like that really helped me getting that into my head."

Andon Stenger – Lakeview Super Senior

Residents at Wagner's Lake have likely seen the same dude on the streets outside their windows as they get up and get ready in the morning. As that first cup of coffee is brewed and the eggs are fried up, out on the winding pavement around the lake is Lakeview senior Andon Stenger.

He's staying more inside lately as the temperatures drop at or below freezing, but for months he's been a fixture of the early-morning landscape.

Stenger is one of seven seniors on this year's Viking wrestling squad but the only member of the team returning to the lineup with a state medal.

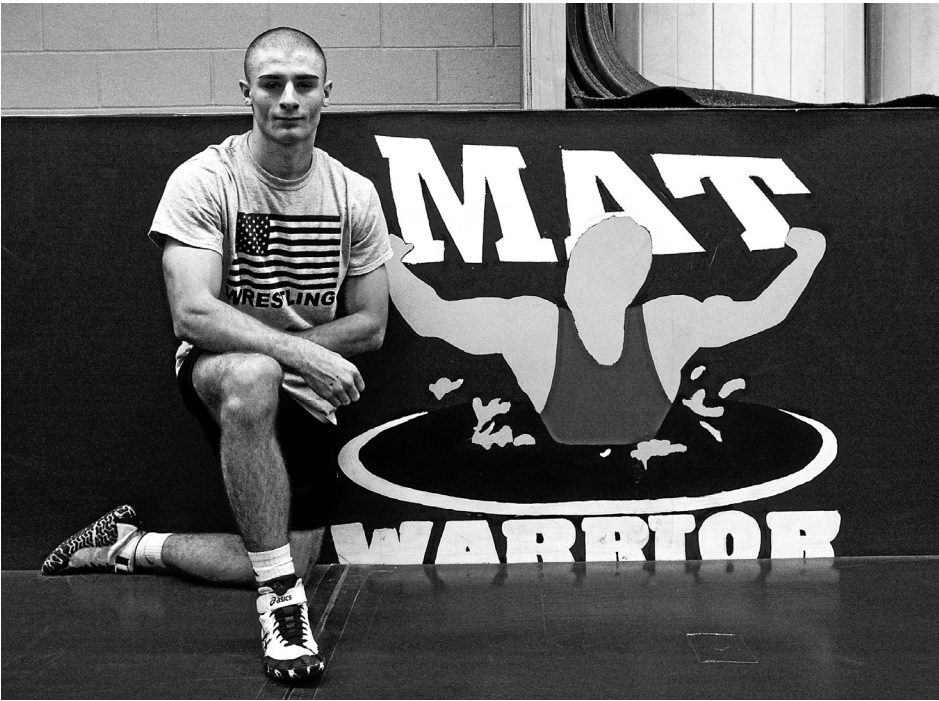
Stenger admittedly went into his first state tournament as a junior full of nerves. His trip to Omaha started with an 11-6 loss before four straight wins had him in the bronze-medal match. Stenger came up just short 5-2 and took fourth while ending a 34-7 season.

Since then he's rededicated himself to his work, spending every day of the summer at the YMCA, biking five miles per day, running and lifting weights.

He wants to succeed but he also knows he'll be at the top of the list in terms of the guys Lakeview expects to win dual matches and score major points at tournaments.

"It was a pretty big accomplishment, but I feel I can do better," he said. "That's why right now what I'm shooting for is gold."

Leading isn't necessarily a comfortable position for Stenger to be in. He'd rather

just go about his business and remain anonymous. But he also realized that his status as the lone returning state medal winner, plus his experience as a senior, would naturally make him a mentor. It's a

work in progress, but Stenger is learning what it takes to be the current face of the program.

"I'm trying the best I can to do as much leading I can and push everyone in the

wrestling room," he said. "It's a lot to have everyone looking at you and have your coaches looking at you."

Stenger's work ethic away from regular training is a part of the sport that has always been in his makeup. There's a natural attraction, he said, to realizing that much of the success is related to effort – you get out what you put in. Some guys might have more talent or experience, but hard work can level the playing field.

"The biggest factor (to finding a love for wrestling) was winning, by far, but also just how competitive you can be and how you can only wrestle one type of way," he said. "There's only one way to do a technique correctly, so if you put in the work you can make yourself better."

Stenger took up wrestling as early as he could and found success instantly. He can't remember what exact age it was, sometime between 5 and 7, but remembers winning a tournament in Grand Island and earning a trophy that was bigger than him. Dad had to help him carry it out of the arena.

And while he has several other reminders of success sitting around at home, Stenger says he's not the type to ever be satisfied. Even after last year and as the potential leader of the team, he's all about what's next.

"I have quite a bit of trophies at home," Stenger said, "but I try to focus on what's in front of me, not what's behind me."

Riley Eickmeier – Scotus Central Catholic Super Senior

Riley Eickmeier lost his first-ever tournament. It was snowing that day in Brainard, and the family had to stay the night because of the weather. Besides those details, he remembers little else about the day other than the finals loss.

In the long run, it might have been just what he needed. Years later, Eickmeier says that early disappointment was likely the driving force behind why he poured himself into wrestling so much as a youngster.

“I was very mad I didn’t get first. It was someone from my own team I had to wrestle. I lost to him and I was pretty upset,” Eickmeier said. “All I wanted to do was win a trophy, and I wrestled my heart out but I didn’t get that trophy and that kind of set it from day one. I wanted to win and didn’t get it. From that day I’ve always wanted to be number one and always had that drive ever since.”

Eickmeier is the lone returning state qualifier for a Scotus program looking for a resurgence after a few lean years. The program was established in 2012 and had a better start than most. By 2016 the Shamrocks already had two state cham-

pions and a conference title. There were more state medals earned the year after, but in the past four seasons, Scotus has sent 12 wrestlers to state and won a combined six matches.

Eickmeier, who’s been watching championship Saturday with his dad on TV since those early days, says he doesn’t feel any pressure to recapture some of that old glory now that he’s the new face of the program. He has big goals and wants to be remembered, but pressure either makes coal or diamonds. Eickmeier would prefer to be the latter.

In his final season he’s embracing a position of leadership and wants to set an example for the youngsters.

Eickmeier went 32-15 in his junior year and made it to state as a fourth-place district finalist. He won the Syracuse Pin Tournament and wrestled for gold two other times. Eleven of his 32 wins came by way of pinfall.

“It feels pretty awesome. I just hope I can show everyone and be an inspiration for them when they’re my age,” he said. “I’m not trying to leave behind anything, no regrets. As soon as I’m number one on the state podium I’ll feel like I’ve made it.”

Kennedy Settje – Clarkson/Leigh Super Senior

Clarkson/Leigh’s Kennedy Settje has been a part of the Patriots’ basketball program since sixth grade when she became a student manager.

After she saw other student managers at work, Settje asked Patriots head coach Matt Murren if she could be one herself. He agreed.

“I just watched people do it before me and I realized I wanted to do what they were doing, so I just asked Murren if I can be a manager and that’s how I got there,” Settje said.

Settje managed knowing that one day she would eventually be a player for the team. That experience was beneficial.

“I think it made me closer to my friends, who I play with now, and the upperclassmen, who I student-managed for and then I played with,” she said. “I think it made my bond closer with all my coaches, too. It all helped.”

Even though Settje wasn’t a player on the team, Murren included all the student managers in team activities. Becoming familiar with the culture early on was a big advantage.

“He pushed us even as a student manager. He always made us run with the team,” Settje said. “Every time they had a running drill, and when we had fun days, we got to par-

“I feel it’s my turn to do what others have done for me. They helped a lot, and I feel like it’s my turn to give back,” she said. “Any time the underclassmen had a question, I tried to answer it as best I could and explain it.”

Now the roles have changed, Settje has become an even more valuable contributor. She was the team’s second-leading score at 9.3 points per game last season. After the graduation of the Patriots’ third, fourth and fifth-leading scorers, Settje is taking on a greater role offensively and all over the court.

“I just hope to be a good leader; allow others to look up to me,” she said. “Murren told me to be more of an offensive threat this year, so I’m going to try to do that. Shoot the ball more, drive, just be more aggressive.”

As a player on the volleyball and basketball teams, she’s been a crucial part of a successful run. The volleyball team reached state for the second straight year, and the basketball team will look to make it back to Lincoln for the second time in three years.

“It’s awesome,” Settje said. “It’s great that our Patriot teams are making it down to Lincoln and it’s super fun to be a part of that.”

Gabriel Moyao – Schuyler Super Senior

Gabriel Moyao didn’t love wrestling at first. His early attempts in the sport came in elementary school when he competed in club tournaments. He was OK, his results were OK, his connection to the sport was just OK.

Moyao seemed destined for an average future, or perhaps one without wrestling in his life. Thanks to the urging of older brother Victor, and his friends, Moyao found a new perspective.

“I think it was just like I was so young and I just wanted to play around the park and everything,” he said. “My seventh grade year, (Victor) told me to go do it. Some of my friends also convinced me to do it, so it was just convincing me to do it and get into wrestling again.”

Victor was a Schuyler varsity wrestler and he earned a trip to state in 2015. He went 30-13 that season and reached the consolation second round. After Gabriel witnessed Victor under the lights in Omaha, it moti-

vated him to write his own story.

“When I saw he made it to state, I kept thinking I want to do that,” Moyao remembers “I want to make it.”

But there wasn’t instant success, he battled some adversity. As a freshman and sophomore, he was a 220-pounder. He went to the gym, ran and lost weight. The coaches told him his natural spot in the lineup was 195 pounds and he met that challenge.

Through all the ups and downs, Victor kept pushing his little brother.

“He told me to just keep going with it, keep hanging with it because my seventh grade year, I didn’t really like it,” Gabriel said. “He’s like, ‘keep going for it, keep going for it and you’ll do good, you’ll do better.’”

Although Moyao wasn’t on the varsity squad as a freshman and sophomore. He said he entered his junior season with a different mindset.

“My mindset is just like, get better than last year,” he said. “It wasn’t really about making it to state, but

once I made it to the next day (of practice), I’ve got to make it to state now.”

Despite competing in just his fifth full wrestling season, Gabriel went 24-22 and reached the state consolation second round — something that didn’t seem possible just a few months earlier.

“I was kind of surprised because all these good wrestlers started at a really young age and then there’s me starting at seventh grade,” Moyao said. “I was kind of surprised that I made it to state.”

Moyao’s goals for his senior year include improving from last year and earning a state medal with a top-four finish. With his brother’s push to get back into wrestling, he enters the season with another shot of getting back to Omaha.

“I’m grateful for that because I don’t know what I would be doing right now if I didn’t get back into it,” he said.

Grady Belt – Shelby-Rising City Super Senior

Grady Belt has been involved in wrestling since preschool. His Dad and uncles all wrestled. Coming from a wrestling family, Belt said it just stuck with him his entire life.

“Growing up, we would always be wrestling,” Belt said. “Me and my brother messing around, and I just kind of developed a love for wrestling and it just carried over the rest of my life.”

Belt didn’t know much back then other than he wanted to get better. Occasionally he enjoys looking back to those days and seeing how far he’s come.

“You don’t know much,” he said. “You’re just learning fundamentals, but I think it’s interesting to see along the entire journey just kind of develop.”

Dedication, showing up to practice, losing weight and a solid work ethic are what Belt says have been his keys to success. It’s a daily grind, one that can’t be missed or skipped if wins and medals are expected.

“I just think I enjoy more the challenge part of it,” Belt said. “Obviously, it’s a really hard sport that can beat you down, but I guess it’s worth it in the end knowing you accomplished it all and finished it.”

Admittedly, wrestling has nearly gotten the best of Belt at times. When midseason comes around

and cutting weight has become a regular way of life, only the guy on the mat can truly know just what it takes. The support of family and friends helps remind him why he’s out there.

“I know there’s a lot of people (who have expectations) on me and want me to do good, so I just have to make the sacrifice more so for them,” Belt said. “It means a lot more, not just to me, but to other people as well.”

Last season, Belt reached the NSAA state wrestling championships for the first time after a 32-9 season. He fell just short of the medal matches when he lost in the consolation quarterfinals.

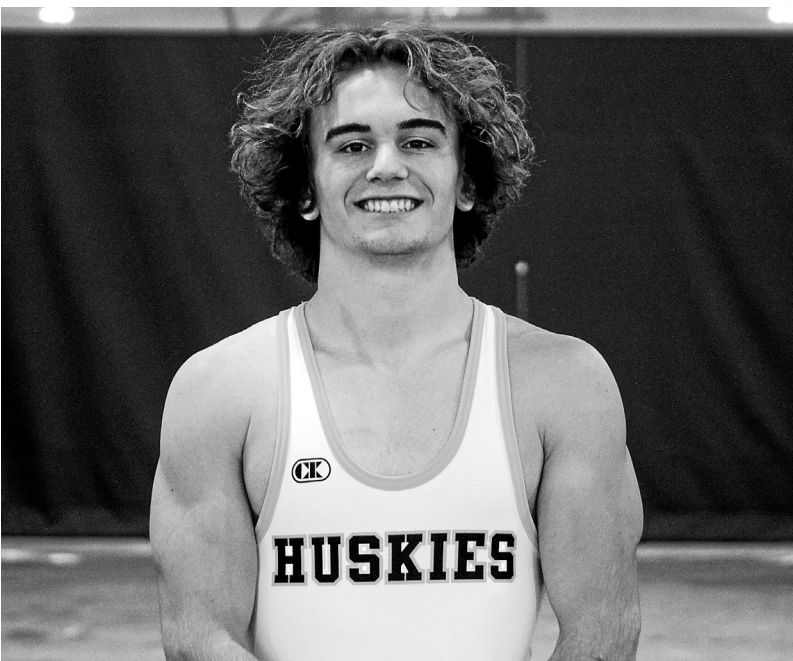
He was the lone SRC representative in Omaha. Belt said he hopes that isn’t this case this season.

“It felt great being able to represent the school at state, but I’m hoping this year there could be a few others who tag along with me, hopefully, to build the program,” he said.

When the going gets tough this season, Belt will draw on his trip to Omaha. There’s nothing like being under the lights on the big stage.

“Just remembering how it felt after the loss when I was done, knowing I came just short,” Belt said. “I’m just thinking of having a better mindset this year. Hopefully, I can overcome it and get a medal this year.”

Christopher Nickolite – Aquinas Catholic Super Senior

Christopher Nickolite enters the 2022 wrestling season as the hunted instead of the hunter. The Aquinas Catholic senior aims to defend his state title after he finished atop the podium last season in the Class C 138-pound tournament.

Despite the target on his back, he's approaching the season no differently.

"The hard work is put down no matter what," Nickolite said. "To be a state champ, you've got to do all the right things. Last year, I did that and this year I hope to do the same."

As the reigning state champ, expectations are naturally high. Instead of pressure, he sees the spotlight as a motivator.

"I know there's people out to get me, but I'm out to get people too," he said. "It goes both ways."

Nickolite has been on an upward trajectory since he first stepped on the mat as a freshman. In his rookie campaign, he reached state despite competing in just 19 varsity matches. The following year, he earned state runner-up, and as a junior, he emerged as the champion.

"Freshman year, I kind of got beat up on a lot. Going into my sophomore year, I realized I'm a competitor. I can hang in with these guys and it was just another whole mindset," Nickolite said. "Going into my junior year, I was like, 'this is my year, I can win a title this year,' and then it happened. This year, it's just one

step farther. I've got to go undefeated and got to make a name for myself."

Nickolite began wrestling in kindergarten. He went to two wrestling tournaments and despite placing second in both events, didn't like the sport. In first grade his feelings began to change.

Nickolite spent more weekends than ever at tournaments and began to feel the love. He was third at many of those events before leaving North Bend, the final tournament of the season, with gold.

All he's wanted to do ever since is collect more.

The best part, is that everything is up to him – training, preparation and results.

"Obviously, coaches play a part into it, but when it comes down to it, if I'm better than the guy in front of me, then I can beat him," Nickolite said. "I don't have to rely on a team or anything like that. It's just myself out there."

Even as the reigning state champion, there's still a chip on Nickolite's shoulder. He finished last season with one defeat and he's determined to right that wrong this season, pick up another state gold and do it with a spotless record.

"That one loss last year," he said. "That one chip there, that one mistake; I wish I could have it back. But new year, new season."

Trevin Brecka – East Butler Super Senior



Trevin Brecka was a fifth-place state medalist as a junior. Brecka is looking for a final season that includes another state medal, 40 wins and a run to the state title match.

In the East Butler wrestling room, each team member has a list of goals pinned to the wall. It's a reminder, when the going gets tough, what that toughness is all about.

For Trevin Brecka, his goals are simple. He wants to make weight every meet, record 70 takedowns, win 40 matches, win every dual match and win state.

The drive to win, but more importantly, the desire to compete is what makes it all worth it and what keeps him coming back.

"I'm a competitive person and this is a really competitive sport," Brecka said. "It was fun to be with my friends every day."

Last season, Brecka competed at state for the first while putting together a record of 27-12. He earned fifth place in the Class D 160-pound tournament. Another medal, and a higher spot on the podium is how he's looking to close his final varsity season.

"I got cut short a little bit and I'm looking to do better than I did last year, obviously," Brecka said. "I push myself every day in the practice room because I know what I'm capable of and I know what my teammates are capable of."

Last year, Brecka faced the adversity of injury, dealing with a hip flexor that forced him to sit for a few weeks. At his size, 6-foot-2, staying at 170 isn't the easiest spot to maintain in the lineup. Injured and unable to workout, it only made staying at that number all the more difficult.

Hitting that weight isn't just working out in the room. It affects every area of life.

"That's a huge part of it and that's where all that mental toughness comes in," he said. "You have to be self-disciplined."

Brecka is coming off a football season in which he was the Tigers' do it all player. He led East Butler in rushing yards, receiving yards and passing touchdowns. Brecka credits what he's learned in the wrestling room for his success on the grid iron.

"Wrestling, you have to be so mentally tough, and when you step out onto the football field, you're one of the most mentally tough people on the field," he said. "I'm not backing down from that."

Brecka started wrestling around first or second grade after dad signed him up. He credits Tigers assistant coach Skyler Ratkovec for pushing him to be the best wrestler he can be.

"He's a former wrestler," Brecka said. "He wrestles me all the time at practice and he just makes me a better wrestler by pushing me and beating up on me, but all around, he makes me a better wrestler."

The Tigers exceeded many expectations at state last year. The team placed 10th in the final team standings with five that made the trip to Omaha. Brecka is hoping for more of the same and ending his career not only with individual success but with the Tigers competing for a team trophy.

"We have the experience and we know how we finished last year," he said. "All we can do is improve. We don't go back, we improve, so a lot of kids are looking to win it all this year."

Tre' Daro – David City Super Senior

Tre' Daro is hungry to chase what's his – an individual state wrestling championship.

Daro has seen his cousins, Dylan Vodicka and Trent Daro, reach the Promised Land. Trent won the individual Class C 120-pound state title in 2016, and Vodicka won back-to-back state titles at Class C 170 in 2020 and Class C 182 last winter.

After witnessing their success, Tre' said there's a mix of pressure and motivation that comes with wanting to make his own moment of glory.

"I want my shot. I've got to get it this year because I won't have another shot," he said. "I was actually talking to Dylan about how the word pressure comes up and he said, 'Well, it's not a real thing so there's no real pressure. Just wrestle like you do.' If the pressure turns into motivation, I guess it's because I'm working hard. That's the goal and we know how to get there."

Last year, Daro went 46-8 and reached the Class C 170-pound state final. The No. 1 ranked guy in the class denied him a championship. He expected to be in that position, but few others predicted his run to the title match.

Knowing what it's like to have success in Omaha is a big advantage.

"I think it'll help because I got to wrestle on those mats," Daro said. "I know what it's like to wrestle there, and it won't be a shock of what to expect. I'll know exactly what to expect, and my mind can be solely on wrestling."

Tre' credited his family and coaches for helping him along his wrestling journey. He started wrestling in seventh grade. After he saw Vodicka on the mat, he had an instant desire.

"My whole family wrestled," Daro said. "Once I was old enough, I brought the paper home to my mom and she said, 'OK, have fun at practice.' I really just fell in love with the sport ever since I first started wrestling."

For Daro, the goal is to follow his cousins' footsteps and be a state champion in his senior season.

"Trent Daro had his turn," he said. "Dylan had his turn, and now it's my turn to take what's mine."
