# School closures extended

## CV learns student tested positive for COVID-19

As area districts continue to make plans for another two weeks of closures or online learning, Cumberland Valley School District is letting parents know of a

positive COVID-19 case at its high school.

CV Superintendent David Christopher wrote in a post on the district website that the district received notification Sunday of a possible COVID-19 positive case at its high school. Though the district did not receive any action steps from state or local officials, it

did learn more information Monday morning after speaking with the family.

The district said that the student had tested positive on March 13. Even though the district had not been aware of the positive until Sunday, Christopher said the student's family was working with the state Department of Health

on contact tracing and notifying those who may have come in close contact with the student.

The district said the student was last at the school on March 9, but the student is believed to have contracted the coronavirus from another family member.

Christopher said he will not release any further details to protect

the student's privacy, but he said he would keep the school community up to date if any more positive cases come to light.

There are 12 cases in Cumberland County, with one new one reported Monday by the Department of Health.

# Scouts get busy as bees

Girls, Tool Library team up to create boxes for pollinators

Bees in Carlisle will have new places to nest thanks to a collaboration between the Girl Scouts and Carlisle Tool Library.

Girl Scout Troop 15089 from the Camp Hill area recently visited the tool library to build native bee boxes.

Sara Markowitz, director of community outreach for the Carlisle Tool Library, said the organization first started building bee boxes in partnership with local honey producer Honeybee Friendly as a workshop at Farmers on the Square. Markowitz said it was so popular they had 14 kits available and finished in about 15 minutes, prompting them to do the workshop again.

That's where troop leader Karen Skoczynski entered the picture. She and her son came to a workshop and built a bee

box. Then, her daughter said she wanted to build one, too.

Skoczynski and troop co-leader Amanda Peters made arrangements for the girls to build the boxes as part of their requirements for their Bronze Award. Those arrangements included materials donated from Lowe's

and Home Depot.

On the evening of Feb. 27, the troop came to the tool library where the sides, base, back and roof of the bee boxes were waiting to be assembled. Each girl took hammer in hand to assemble

# Food donations distributed by local families

Giveaway features separate sites for donation, distribution

A grassroots idea to make sure families have food in light of the economic distress stemming from the coronavirus has reached South Middleton Township.

Last week, Jenny Acuna learned her sister was doing a food giveaway in her neighborhood, an idea she had picked up from someone else. In turn, Acuna contacted her friend, Angela Doland, and the two decided to take on the project.

It works like this. Those who have the capacity and desire to donate food take it to the Doland's house. The Dolands take the food up to the Acuna house where the Acuna family sorts it into bags that are left on the front porch for anyone to take. No questions asked.

Donations can be dropped off in a box at 1 Forgedale Drive. There's no need to knock or ring the bell because the family checks the box throughout the day.

Bags can be picked up at 14 E. Eppley Drive throughout the day.

Doland said they wanted to have two locations to make people feel more comfortable. Those picking up food won't run into those making the donations.

"Last night, she had 10 bags on her front porch and by this morning four had been taken, which is awesome," Doland said last week.

# Virus likely to hamper outreach for census

The 2020 census is the first one to be offered online, and that may save this year's effort as worries grow over outreach during a pandemic.

The Associated Press reported that the U.S. Census Bureau made a soft launch of the 2020 census website, 2020census.gov, last Monday. Later last week, the bureau began mailing notices to

residents.

Though the mailers are still sent out and questionnaires can still be answered over the phone, it's the website the bureau is encouraging people to visit. People can use the census ID they receive by mail for the online submissions, though those who answer the questions before receiving the ID will still be counted, according to the AP.
