# SHOP&DINE IN AREA DOWNTOWNS

Cumberland Valley's blend of charming and developing downtowns makes the region a true destination. Each town's unique collection of shopping spots, restaurants, historical attractions and more make them a hidden gem waiting to be discovered.

### Boiling Springs

Boiling Springs is a hiker's paradise. The Appalachian Trail runs through the center of town, and the town is a designated Appalachian Trail Community.

If you are a water-lover, fly-fish at the world-renowned Yellow Breeches Creek, boat or fish at Children's Lake, or make a splash at the valley's oldest public pool and waterpark. Find all the fly-fishing and outdoor gear you need at TCO Outdoors.

Plan to spend the night or weekend at Allenberry Resort, one of only three Orvis-certified fly-fishing lodges in Pennsylvania. You can also find made-in-America and PA artisan crafts at the Village Artisans Gallery.

### Camp Hill

Camp Hill has a wealth of local recreation and parks, as well as being a short distance from the area's best hiking, biking, skiing and boating. The walkable downtown area features a variety of restaurants, spas and boutique shops. The town has been recognized as having over 40 women-owned businesses located along its main thoroughfare.

While the town is a thriving modern community, it's also proud of its Civil War heritage – being the northernmost engagement of the Gettysburg campaign in 1863.

### Carlisle

Carlisle is Cumberland Valley's largest town and features picturesque, tree-lined streets with a diverse collection of galleries, shops and restaurants.

If you and the family are outdoor enthusiasts, you'll appreciate the easily-accessible Appalachian Trail plus the biking, hiking, lakeside beaches and more at nearby state parks. Bring your bike and take advantage of the town's bike-friendly lanes.

History buffs will want to dive into the past at the U.S. Army Heritage & Education Center and the Cumberland County Historical Society, as well as with a collection of self-guided walking tours that explain the architecture and unique stories that only happened in Carlisle.

### Enola

Enola's roots hail back to the expansion of railroad transportation, and rail lines still run through the heart of town.

If you're looking for a place to spend a relaxing day outside with the kids, stop by the Adams-Ricci Community Park. Its 82 acres offer access to the Conodoguinet Creek for boating and fishing, trails, sports fields, picnic areas, a butterfly garden and a massive children's play structure. This park is also home to the Pennsboro Pumpkin Fest in October.

### Lemoyne

At the crossroads of Interstate 83 and Route 11/15, Lemoyne is between Wormleysburg to the north and New Cumberland to the south. It's an easy trek from our state capital. Activities include beautiful views of the Susquehanna River and Harrisburg skyline from Negley Park, great

shopping at local stores – including the 60,000-square-foot West Shore Farmers Market – and indoor Italian go-kart racing at Autobahn Speedway.

### Mechanicsburg

Mechanicsburg is a history lover's dream, peppered with old Pennsylvania Railroad sites, including the buildings preserved by the Mechanicsburg Museum. Local shopping, dining, a community theater and a farmers' market can be found in and around the downtown area. Head to the Carlisle Pike area for big box shopping and more dining options.

### Mount Holly Springs

This small town, nestled in the gap of the south mountains of Cumberland Valley, has always been a natural gathering spot for nature travelers. Begin by exploring the 913-acre Mount Holly Marsh Pre-

serve, where you can hike approximately 7 miles of trails ranging in difficulty level or observe a wide variety of birds, plants and other wildlife. The small downtown is home to several local dining spots.

### New Cumberland

Discover downtown New Cumberland's shops, galleries and restaurants. Local favorites include the Oxford Hall Celtic Shop and Tickle My Senses Gallery. The recently renovated and re-opened West Shore Theatre serves as a cinema house and performing arts venue. Plus, enjoy fishing along the banks of the Yellow Breeches Creek. The town is home to the annual New Cumberland Apple Festival.

### Newville

Enjoy a relaxing day walking, biking or horseback riding on the 13-mile Cumber-



land Valley Rail Trail. This leisurely trail offers informative signage about the area's agriculture and Civil War history.

Head up the mountains to Colonel Denning State Park for camping, swimming, biking, hiking and more. You won't want to miss the 180-degree view of the valley that can only be found after hiking the strenuous Flat Rock Trail.

### Shippensburg

Shippensburg offers a desirable balance of industry, agriculture and education. Spend an afternoon learning about Civil War history at the Shippensburg Historical Society, or shop for local foods and ingredients at an assortment of roadside farmstands. You can also spend a day outdoors hiking or biking on the Cumberland Valley Rail Trail. Be sure to visit the Cumberland Valley Railroad Museum at the Shippensburg Station trailhead. Located in a renovated boxcar, the museum shares the railroad heritage of the Cumberland Valley.

Enjoy first-class musical performances, Broadway-style shows, lectures and more at Shippensburg University's premier facility, the H. Ric Luhrs Performing Arts Center. The university is also home to the Fashion Archives and Museum.

### Wormleysburg

This West Shore community is the perfect place to unwind and enjoy views of the scenic Susquehanna River from its award-winning restaurants. Dukes Bar

& Grille and Dockside Willies serve up a variety of flavors ranging from brick-oven pizza to stuffed flounder. Their large decks are the perfect spot to enjoy the beautiful setting of the sparkling Susquehanna

# SOMETHING FOR EVERY SEASON

With no shortage of year-round choices, Cumberland Valley offers plenty to do in every season. Here are some suggestions.

**Spring**

1. View the budding trees with a stroll around picturesque Children’s Lake in Boiling Springs or hike along the Cumberland Valley Rail Trail.

2. Plan a bird-watching journey to Cumberland Valley parks to see a number of different species of songbirds, fishing birds, sparrows, woodpeckers and warblers.

3. Attend Spring Carlisle, which marks the beginning of the Carlisle-based car show season. It has been named one of the top 5 automotive swap meets in the world.

4. The beginning of spring marks the start of trout season and Cumberland Valley’s famous fly-fishing streams include the Yellow Breeches, LeTort Spring Run, and Big Spring Creek.

**Summer**

1. Cumberland Valley’s breathtaking views and scenic vistas are

2. Cumberland Valley may be land-locked but there are still plenty of opportunities to get out on the water. Swim, canoe, kayak or tube on serene lakes or along scenic streams.

3. Go old-school and enjoy an evening of entertainment

at Cumberland Drive-In in Newville, one of only about 300 drive-in theaters remaining in America.

4. There is no better season to shop for fresh foods and farm products in Cumberland Valley. Spend the summer months browsing through roadside stands, markets and greenhouses.

1. Waggoner’s Gap Hawk Watch is a premier location for watching the fall raptor migration along the Kittatinny Ridge. Bring a picnic and enjoy a meal with one of the best views of Cumberland Valley.

2. Mid-to-late October sees peak color in Cumberland Valley. A short drive or hike along scenic roads easily takes you from downtowns to the natural beauty right on our doorstep.

3. Fall means festival season is in full swing with celebrations of tea, apples, art and American crafts, pumpkins, sunflowers and more.

4. Cumberland Valley’s pic-

turesque and walkable downtowns are the crossroads for art, fashion, food and history. With a diverse collection of galleries, specialty shops, restaurants and museums, fall is the perfect time to meander and discover hidden gems.

Highlighted Events: Uprise Fest, Pennsboro Pumpkin Festival, Fall Furnace Fest

**Winter**

1. The magic of Christmas comes alive, and to the stage, with a variety of special performances guaranteed to put you in the holiday spirit.

# CUMBERLAND COUNTY EMBRACES HISTORY

## VISITCUMBERLANDVALLEY.COM

The Cumberland Valley is rich in history. Step back in time as you explore unique attractions and historical sites tucked in Cumberland Valley's quaint towns.

Discover the stories of U.S. Army soldiers at the U.S. Army Heritage & Education Center (USAHEC, 950 Soldiers Dr., Carlisle). Experience the interactive gallery's parachute simulation, digital shooting range, Korean War night attack and hundreds of artifacts. This museum and gallery are free.

Walk or run along the outdoor Army Heritage Trail at USAHEC, which features full-scale military exhibits, such as a Huey Helicopter, WWI trench system and Civil War cabins. This leisurely mile-long loop is perfect for all ages and allows children and adults to engage with the exhibits and discover Army history.

Uncover unique Cumberland Valley stories at the Cumberland County Historical Society (21 N. Pitt St., Carlisle), which has 16 galleries that serve as a visual guide to Cumberland Valley's past. The facility is a resource for documents and photos related to the Carlisle Indian Industrial School.

After touring the museum, stop by History on High—The Shop (33 W. High St., Carlisle) for Cumberland Valley books, jewelry, gifts and more. The shop is also home to the Cumberland Valley Visitors Center, where visitors and residents can pick up infor-

mation on things to see and do in the area.

Head to Mechanicsburg and explore the buildings that make up the Mechanicsburg Museum Association (2 W. Strawberry Alley). The museum preserves four 1800s buildings from the Cumberland Valley Railroad, a log tavern that predates Mechanicsburg, and a collection of items and records important to Mechanicsburg's history and heritage.

Shippensburg is home to the Shippensburg Historical Society (52 W. King St.) and the Fashion Archives and Museum of Shippensburg University (501 N. Earl St.). The historical society contains a library of local books, photographs, maps, clothing, artifacts and more. The Fashion Archives maintains, preserves and exhibits apparel and accessories ranging from the 18th-century to the present.

You can combine your love of history while also

taking advantage of the outdoor recreation in the valley. Stroll along the Cumberland Valley Rail Trail (trailheads in Shippensburg and Newville) or the LeTort Spring Run Nature Trail (Carlisle), which both feature interpretive signage explaining their historical significance. In addition, the Cumberland Valley Railroad Museum tells the story of the Cumberland Valley Railroad. It is located at the Shippensburg Station trailhead along the Cumberland Valley Rail Trail.

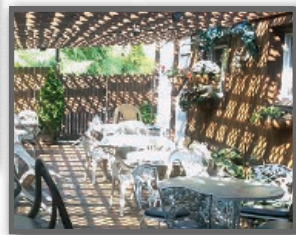

## FESTIVALS DOT COUNTY CALENDAR

Cumberland Valley is home to a year-round array of festivals and events covering interests ranging from history to crafts to food. Held in a variety of settings, all of these annual festivals and events are family-friendly, and most are free! Here are some highlights.

### Top spring events

**Amani Festival:** A one-day multi-cultural festival in downtown Carlisle with activities geared toward the themes of unity, acceptance and tolerance.

**Earth Day Festival:** Honor the planet with music, workshops and more in Mechanicsburg.

**Greek Festival:** Food, music, dancing, and church tours at Holy Trinity Greek Orthodox Cathedral in East Pennsboro Township.

### Top summer events

**Foundry Day:** Juried arts festival along Children's Lake in Boiling Springs.

**Jubilee Day:** The downtown Mechanicsburg event is the largest one-day street fair on the East Coast.

**Bluegrass on the Grass:** One-day bluegrass festival at Dickinson College featuring a mix of bands.

**Cumberland County Ag Expo:** Annual agricultural fair including animal exhibitions, 4H presentations, children's activities, tractor pulls, food and music in Newville.

**Shippensburg Corn Festival:** Includes more than 250 craft and antique vendors, live music, food area and more in downtown Shippensburg.

**Annual Steam Engine Show:** Steam engine and tractor parades, farmer's flea market and more, in Mechanicsburg.

### Top fall events

**Uprise Festival:** Two-day event with almost 40 Christian musical artists, kids' activities, food vendors, merchandise, and more in Shippensburg.

**New Cumberland Apple Festival:** Over 250 craft vendors, children's activities, and apple-themed foods.

**Harvest of the Arts:** 100 juried vendors, live music, food trucks, and children's activities in downtown Carlisle.

**Pennsboro Pumpkin Fest:** Craft vendors, car show, live entertainment, and pumpkin treats at Adams Ricci Park.

**Destination Carlisle's Halloweenweekend:** Decorated storefronts, a pumpkin path through downtown, pumpkin games, ghostly entertainment, and Spooky Saturday trick-or-treating.

**Fall Furnace Fest:** Crafts, guided hikes, kid's programs, and more at Pine Grove Furnace State Park.

### Top winter & holiday events

**Boiling Springs Christmas Tree Lighting:** Visit from Santa and lighting of the floating Christmas Tree at Children's Lake.

**Market of Curiosities:** A three-ring show of shopping, beer tastings, and live

music in Carlisle.

**Central Pennsylvania Youth Ballet Holiday Performance:** The only pre-professional ballet school allowed to put on George Balanchine's version of The Nutcracker every year.

**Holiday Performances at H. Ric Luhrs Performing Arts Center:** Changing, nationally recognized performers each year.

**Carlisle's Ice Art Fest:** View and take pictures of more than 50 ice sculptures while exploring downtown Carlisle.

### Car events & races

**Carlisle Events Auto Shows:** Eight world-renowned annual collector car and truck events from April through October plus the winter auto expo in January make Carlisle an automotive hotspot. Downtown Carlisle hosts the annual Ford (June) and Corvette (August) parades.

**Williams Grove Speedway:** March through October features 410 Sprint Car dirt track racing.

## FARMERS MARKETS AND FARM RETAIL IN CUMBERLAND COUNTY

### SENTINEL STAFF

Cumberland County has plenty to see and eat at various farmers markets and farm retail operations that offer everything from fresh produce to dairy to up-close visits with animals.

Here is a look at some of the agricultural activities and operations across the county:

**Ashcombe Farm & Greenhouses:** 906 W. Grantham Road, Mechanicsburg. The garden center sells plants, baked goods, produce, gourmet foods and seasonal goods, as well as offers an array of classes and events.

**Basehore Farm:** 6080 Creekview Road, Mechanicsburg. The farm provides produce, flowers, seasonal decorations, cheese-based goods, preserves, maple syrup, eggs, honey and more. Decorations include Christmas trees, wreaths and gourds.

**Bent Pine Alpaca Farm:** 65 S. Old Stone House Road, Carlisle. Families can enjoy a personal introduction to alpacas, as well as shop for items made with the farm's alpaca fiber, such as scarves, hats, sweaters, mittens, ponchos, socks, jackets and shawls.

**Breezy Valley Farms:** Near intersection of Route 11 and Route 233, Newville. This seasonal roadside stand sells vegetables, melons, berries, tree fruit, pumpkins, honey, pickled and canned goods, baked goods and bedding plants.

**Bricker's Strawberries:** 1710 Lisburn Road, Carlisle. The pick-your-own strawberry farm has been in operation for almost 40 years and offers strawberries sold by the pound, as well as pre-picked strawberries at its shop.

**Buttonwood Gardens:** 980 Waggoners Gap Road, Carlisle. The farm offers fresh-cut flowers and plants, as well as in-season produce, such as berries, peaches, lettuce and asparagus.

**Celtic Knot Alpacas:** 1560 McClures Gap Road, Carlisle. This alpaca farm also offers hand-knit and woven items using alpaca fiber, and the farm also offers farm tours and educational seminars.

**Clair's Orchard:** 1452 Holly Pike, Carlisle. This family-owned fruit market offers seasonal fruits, such as apples, peaches, nectarines, cherries, pears, plums, apricots, strawberries, blueberries, raspberries, melons and lopes. There is also fresh cider, vegetables, meat and dairy products and canned goods.

**Cross the Creek Farm:** 2035 Pine Road,

**Newville.** This farm offers pick-your-own strawberries, as well as already picked strawberries when the fruit is in season around late May to mid June.

**Destiny Dairy Bar:** 60 Horners Road, Carlisle. Located on the Brickner farm, Destiny Dairy Bar is an on-farm retail market that offers locally produced, fresh-from the dairy treats, such as whole cream, pasteurized and non-homogenized milk in various flavors.

**Dickinson College Farm:** 553 Park Drive, Boiling Springs. The farm has more than 15 acres of vegetable production ground and 18 acres of animal pasture. Pre-registered guided tours are available, and free self-guided tours for small groups can take place on weekdays.

**Earth Spring Farm:** 366 Stought Road, Carlisle. The farm offers a CSA program, as well as runs its own farm stand featuring farm fresh eggs, Apple Valley milk, fresh produce and more.

**Garden Gate Farm Market:** 1560 W. Trindle Road, Carlisle. This seasonal, roadside stand sells vegetables, tree fruit, homemade baked goods, honey, specialty cut flowers, potted flowers and plants. The stand closes at the end of October.

**Healing Acres Farm:** 380 Hollowbrook Drive, Carlisle. The farm offers eight acres of produce, pasture-raised poultry and a meditation labyrinth that doubles as a pollinator garden.

**Hidden Valley Ayrshires:** 406 Bobcat Road, Newville. This small dairy farm offers raw milk from their grass-fed, non-GMO ayrshire herd. They also have cheese from another local dairy and ice cream. Baked goods are available on the weekends.

**Kings Gap Farm:** 1124 Pine Road, Carlisle. This farm specializes in pumpkins, flowers and fresh vegetables and has a roadside stand located half a mile from the entrance to Kings Gap Environmental Education

Center.

**Lock Farm:** 822 Ritner Highway, Shippensburg. The small produce farm offers seasonal vegetables and fruits. It is open daily except for Thursdays when it has a virtual market, and also has a Fields to Meals Farm Share program.

**Maple Lane Farm:** 150 Crossroad School Road, Newville. This farm sells pumpkins and gourds in the fall, as well as offers a corn maze in September.

**Mount Rock Orchards:** 328 Mount Rock Road, Shippensburg. This roadside stand sells cherries, farm-fresh peaches, apples, vegetables, baked goods and canned goods.

**Mulberry Hill Farm:** 2998 Ritner Highway, Carlisle. The farm-to-fleece shop is home to 13 Romney and Romney-Border Leicester sheep, and the farm offers hand-dyed superwash yarns for crafting.

**Nature's Nook Farm:** 740 Shed Road, Newville. This farm sells blueberries, blackberries, grass-fed beef, goats and horse-quality hay.

**Newville Produce Farm & Greenhouses:** 379 Greenspring Road, Newville. The farm sells vegetables, flowers, melons, honey, herbs, berries, tree fruit and pumpkins, as

well as garden accessories.

**Oak Grove Farms Inc.:** 846 Fisher Road, Mechanicsburg. This family-owned farm sells a wide variety of vegetables, fruits, homemade breads and soups, pies and cookies, pumpkins, eggs and dairy products. The farm also has more than 50 kinds of homemade jams and jellies.

**Paulus Farm Market:** 1216 S. York St., Mechanicsburg. The family-owned and operated market offers vegetables, fruits, fresh cut meats, bakery items, flowers, Christmas trees and dairy products, as well as barnyard animal attractions for children.

## CANOE OR BOAT ON COUNTY'S WATERWAYS

If you are looking for a relaxing way to get out on the water, try one of the many boating opportunities in the valley.

The scenic Children's Lake in Boiling Springs is a great afternoon escape. The lake can accommodate shallow-draft boats, canoes and electric motorboats. (A construction project at the lake from spring 2022 to spring 2023 may limit access to the water.) Laurel Lake at Pine Grove Furnace State Park is a scenic mountain lake ideal for swimming, boating or fishing. Seasonal boat rentals are available.

Get out on the Susquehanna River when you rent a canoe, kayak or stand-up paddleboard at

Susquehanna Outfitters in Wormleysburg. They also offer guided trips along local creeks. The Yellow Breeches Creek Water Trail (a Pennsylvania Designated Scenic River) and the Conodoguinet Creek Water Trail both feature float-trips that are perfect for kayaks.

The world-renowned limestone stream, Yellow Breeches Creek, originates on South Mountain, in Michaux State Forest, near Walnut Bottom. From there, the Yellow Breeches meanders through Cumberland Valley's farmland, forested areas and suburbs, and joins the Susquehanna River near New Cumberland. The main stem of the Yellow Breeches is some 49 miles long and 60-feet wide at its

middle stretch.

The Conodoguinet Creek is about 90 miles long and weaves through agricultural lands, villages and small towns. You can enjoy a

leisurely float, fishing and bird watching on this Class 1 stream. The trail begins near Carlisle at North Middleton Park.

Its series of elaborate bends and

loops meander through Cumberland Valley and end at "The Point" in West Fairview, where the creek flows into the Susquehanna River. "Conodoguinet" comes from an American Indian word meaning "a long way with many bends."

The Susquehanna River is the 16th largest river in America and the largest river lying entirely in the United States that flows into the Atlantic Ocean. The river divides the eastern border of Cumberland Valley and the western border of Harrisburg. It meanders 444 miles from its origin at Otsego Lake near Cooperstown, New York, and empties into the Chesapeake Bay at Havre de Grace, Maryland.

Pine Grove Furnace State Park offers two great swimming locations. Laurel Lake, which spans 25 acres, and the smaller Fuller Lake offer sandy beaches with scenic mountain views.

Little Buffalo State Park in nearby Perry County features a state-of-the-art swimming pool

with depths from 1 to 5 feet, two waterslides and a sprayground.

# Birding opportunities across valley

**VISITCUMBERLANDVALLEY.COM**

Begin your birding journey with one of the best views in the Valley. Waggoner's Gap Hawk Watch is the premier location west of Hawk Mountain for watching the fall raptor migration along the Kittatinny Ridge. The short hike to the rock outcrop features interpretive signs identifying families of raptors and different species of birds you will see. Continue your outdoor experience by picking up the Tuscarora Trail at Waggoner's Gap and travel east along the tip of the ridge to Lamb's Gap and beyond.

Carry on your search for Cumberland Valley's feathery friends at one or all of our state parks.

Travel the 4-mile scenic road to King's Gap Environmental Education Center. The view from the top of the mountain is worth the trip! Head out on the patio of the old stone mansion for a 180-degree view of the valley. The open pines around the center harbor Pine Warbler and attract other migrating warblers and songbirds. The area in and around the pine plantation at the foot of the mountain is good for migrant sparrows (especially Fox Sparrow) and occasional wintering Long-eared Owl.

The nearby Pine Grove Furnace State Park features two lakes and groves of pines and spruces. The breeding birds include

northern warblers such as Black-throated Green and Blackburnian. Laurel Lake is the better of the two lakes for migrant waterfowl. Koppenhaver Trail, a one-mile loop that starts at the Fuller Ball Field and Railroad Bed Road, is the most productive trail for birding.

In the summer, many species of warblers can be found in the Tuscarora State Forest and Colonel Denning State Park. Common species found here include Northern Parula, Black-throated Green, Blackburnian, Cerulean, American Redstart, Ovenbird, Worm-eating, Hooded, Louisiana Waterthrush, Common Yellowthroat and Yellow-breasted Chat, Ruffed Grouse, Yellow-throated Vireo and Acadian Flycatcher. During spring migration, Olive-sided Flycatcher, Yellow-bellied Flycatcher and Golden-winged Warbler have been reported.

Continue to LeTort Spring Run and Nature Trail in downtown Carlisle. The spring is a popular fly-fishing destination, but the two-mile tranquil trail that runs beside it offers excellent bird watching opportunities. Songbirds such as Common Yellowthroats and Carolina Wrens and fishing birds such as Belted Kingfishers and Great Blue Herons can be seen among the mixture of deciduous trees and lowland marshes.

Songbirds and fishing birds can be seen among the mixture of deciduous trees and lowland marshes along the LeTort Spring Run Nature Trail in Carlisle.

On your next stop, visit the Vincent DiFilippo Nature Preserve, which offers birding along the wetlands and the Yellow Breeches Creek.

You can then travel to the West Fairview Boat Launch and East Pennsboro Township Park. West Fairview Boat Launch is one of the best spots to view migrating waterfowl along the Susquehanna River. The adjacent East Pennsboro Township Park along the Conodoguinet Creek has riparian woodland habitat, which is good for migrant passerines.

### 1. Appalachian Trail (A.T.)

Accessible by various access points throughout the valley.

Difficulty Level: Easy to moderate

Length: 46 miles in Cumberland Valley

Highlights: Cumberland Valley is home to the midway point of the roughly 2,190-mile A.T. Easy access points and ample parking allow for multiple day hiking opportunities and experiences.

#### EXPERIENCE THE A.T. IN BOILING SPRINGS:

Boiling Springs is an official Appalachian Trail Community. Hike the A.T. by following the white blazes across Bucher Hill Road, along the famous fly-fishing stream Yellow Breeches Creek, then along Children's Lake. You can also head south on the A.T., crossing a beautiful historic stone bridge, zig zagging through farm fields and taking a steady climb up South Mountain to Center Point Knob.

## CUMBERLAND COUNTY ROW OFFICERS

### SENTINEL STAFF

Cumberland County is run by the county commissioners and a group of elected officials known as row officers.

The row offices, listed below, are elected positions. The positions of sheriff, controller, recorder of deeds, prothonotary, clerk of courts, register of wills and coroner are up for election this year.

### Clerk of Courts – Denny Lebo

The clerk of courts is the official record keeper for matters related to the criminal division of the Court of Common Pleas.

The clerk of courts handles criminal court records; takes bail; processes appeals to state appellate courts; assesses, collects and distributes fines, costs and restitution; reports dispositions of criminal cases to state agencies; licenses private detectives; registers constables and maintains county road dockets.

All records, except for those involving juveniles, are open for public viewing.

### Controller – Al Whitcomb

The controller is the elected chief fiscal officer of the county.

The controller is responsible for all fiscal affairs, including accounts and official acts related to elected officials; other county employees; and organizations that collect, receive, hold or disburse public monies of the county. He or she also selects the accounting system to be used by the county, keeps a full set of books on the fiscal operations of the county and prepares and issues annual audited county-wide financial statements.

The controller has the authority to refuse to authorize any fiscal transaction that appears to not have been properly authorized. He or she also has the responsibility to audit, settle and adjust the accounts of all county officers at the end of the fiscal year.

Whitcomb's staff includes deputy controller Robert Dagrosa and second deputy controller Michael Clapsadl.

### Coroner – Charles Hall

The coroner investigates sudden, violent, unexplained or suspicious deaths in the county to determine cause and manner of death and whether criminal activity was involved. The coroner reports the findings to the family of the deceased and any investigating agencies. The coroner also protects the property of the deceased and keeps the confidentiality of any information received.

Hall's staff includes chief deputy coro-

### District Attorney – Sean McCormack

The district attorney is the chief law enforcement officer in the county. The district attorney's office prosecutes criminal cases.

McCormack, who was chosen to replace Skip Ebert who retired in January 2022, is responsible for the functions of the District Attorney's Office. The district attorney can also prosecute homicides and other violent felony cases.

### Prothonotary – Dale Sabadish

All civil litigation is filed with the prothonotary. The records maintained by the prothonotary are available to the public unless sealed by the court.

Civil litigation filed through the prothonotary's office includes the following: arbitration petitions and awards, argument court, building agreements (stipulations,

liens and waivers), certification of Notary Publics signature, change of names (through name change or divorce), custody and visitation actions, certified divorce certificates (for divorce and annulment), judgment notes, landlord and tenant disputes, liens (federal tax, mechanics, municipal and state), naturalization court, passport applications, petitions for opening ballot boxes on recounts, power of attorney registrations, protection from abuse petitions, quiet titles and suspension of operator's license/registration and appeal.

### Recorder of Deeds – Tammy Shearer

The recorder of deeds keeps a permanent public record of deeds and documents related to the development, transfer and encumbrance of real estate in Cumberland County.

All records are divided into the following three categories: deeds, mortgages and miscellaneous.

### Register of Wills/Clerk of Orphans' Court – Lisa Grayson

The register of wills determines whether documents offered for probate should be admitted to the official record. The office processes all descendants' estate filings and inheritance tax payments for those living in Cumberland County at the time of their death. The register of wills has the authority

to appoint personal representatives to administer estates. The register also has the authority to conduct evidentiary hearings, take testimony and render decisions on disputable estate matters before opening the official record. Decisions made by the register can only be appealed for specific reasons to the Orphans' Court Division of the Common Pleas Court.

The clerk of orphans' court is the filing office for the miscellaneous division of the common pleas court. The office handles actions including accounts, adoptions, appeals, claims against estates, guardianships, minors' estates, small estate proceedings, trusts and marriage applications and licenses for couples who wish to marry in Pennsylvania. Historical birth and death records prior to 1906 are available for the Orphans' Court Division.

### Sheriff – Jody Smith

The Office of the Sheriff is responsible for enforcing court orders from the county Court of Common Pleas and enforcing the state's crime code, vehicle code and Rules of Court. The sheriff serves and enforces court orders, writs of summons, complaints, money judgments and injunctions; conducts real estate sales; issues licenses to carry concealed firearms and licenses to sell firearms and precious metals; serves warrants issued by the courts; provides security to county properties and the courts; provides transportation of prisoners to court appearances; provides assistance and support to other law enforcement agencies; and provides education, assistance and awareness to the public through community service programs.

### Treasurer – Kelly Neiderer

The treasurer is responsible for receiving and depositing money for the daily operational accounts and funds of the county; investing county operational funds; maintaining daily cash balance accounts for county accounts; preparing checks for payroll, general expenses and indirect costs; serving as a member of the county retirement board; serving as an agent for more than 70 licenses; serving as an agent for the state Department of Agriculture, the Pennsylvania State Police, the Pennsylvania Fish and Boat Commission and Cumberland County; and collecting and disbursing the county hotel tax.

## RECYCLING, COMPOST OPTIONS AVAILABLE

### SENTINEL STAFF

Cumberland County and municipalities offer options so that not every item needs to end up at a landfill.

### Electronics recycling

When the state Department of Environmental Protection issued stricter guidelines as to what type of electronics could not be disposed of in a landfill, the number of companies and local governments offering electronics recycling services became far fewer than in past years.

After years of not being able to provide even an annual event-type service to its residents, Cumberland County in 2017 opened a facility that will accept electronics from anyone, regardless of residency.

The Cumberland County Electronics Recycling Center is located at 1001 Claremont Road, Middlesex Township. The facility is open from noon to 4 p.m. on Tuesdays and Wednesdays, as well as from 8 a.m. to noon the second and fourth Saturdays each month. The hours are subject to change depending on facility usage.

The recycling center accepts televisions, computers and accessories, mobile devices, entertainment equipment, data center equipment and cable equipment. The county will charge a fee of 50 cents per pound of electronics recycling, which it says will offset the county's costs for collecting, packaging, loading, shipping and recycling the electronics.

Cash and credit/debit card payments will be accepted, though credit/debit cards will have convenience fees added. Fees are subject to changes as the county monitors the collection process.

The center will be under 24-hour video surveillance, and the county will enforce anti-dumping regulations.

### Compost sites

While the county monitors its recycling center, municipalities are opting to increase enforcement and rules at their compost sites.

The sites offer ways for residents of those municipalities to get rid of leaves and brush, as well as pick-up mulch, tanbark and compost. In all locations, trash, grass, stones, bricks and other construction debris cannot be dropped off at compost sites. Tree stumps and large branches are often not accepted at compost sites.

Here is a look at the compost sites in Cumberland County:

The Cumberland County electronics recycling center opened in July 2017 on Claremont Road in Middlesex Township.

#### CAMP HILL BOROUGH

The site is located at 422 S. 24th St., and is free to borough residents. Residents must load materials themselves. The borough may close the facility at any time to process or haul material.

#### CARLISLE BOROUGH

The site is located on Post Road and is open from late March to mid-December, with various spring/summer and fall hours. The site is free to borough residents who must show an ID to use the facility. Commercial and industrial contractors are allowed to use the site for an \$900 annual fee.

#### EAST PENNSBORO TOWNSHIP

The site is located at 750 S. Humer St., Enola, and access cards are used to get into the site. Cards cost \$10 for residents of the township, who must load materials themselves. The site is open from March 1 to Dec. 31. Commercial landscapers can purchase access cards for \$800 if they are based out of East Pennsboro. The township is no longer accepting applications for businesses located outside of the township.

#### HAMPDEN TOWNSHIP

The site is located at 1955 Technology Parkway, Mechanicsburg, and is free to township residents who must load materials themselves. A resident ID card is required to enter the drop-off site. The facility is closed during holidays and inclement weather. Tanbark and leaf compost is available through the site.

#### LOWER ALLEN TOWNSHIP

The site is located at 1400 S. St. John's Road, Camp Hill, and runs on weekdays and the second Saturday of the month from April to November. Township residents can drop off four truck loads of yard waste and four bulk items per residence a year at no charge. Additional drop-offs require a \$25 fee be paid. Finished wood chips and leaf compost are also available as materials become available.

#### MECHANICSBURG BOROUGH/ SILVER SPRING TOWNSHIP

The joint site is located at 842 W. Church Road, Mechanicsburg, and is open to Mechanicsburg Borough and Silver Spring Township residents. These residents must purchase a \$10 access card (for each household), which grants access to the site for one year. Renewals will be required for continual use of the facility.

#### MIDDLESEX TOWNSHIP/NORTH MIDDLETON TOWNSHIP

The joint site is located at 100 Windy Lane, Carlisle, and is free to residents of both townships. The site is open from March to mid-October, as well as on Saturdays from November to January, with varying hours in summer and fall. Residents can only dump their loads after they have been inspected. The site attendant will have the final OK on all loads brought into the site, and identification is required.

#### SOUTH MIDDLETON TOWNSHIP

The site is located at 615 Lindsey Road, Carlisle, and is free to residents who must get a permanent sticker on their car to indicate residency in the township. There is an attendant on site, and the facility is closed in inclement weather. No commercial business or hauler can drop off or pick up material without a completed authorization form at the township office. Leaf mulch and tanbark are free to township residents, but must be hand loaded.

#### SHIPPENSBURG BOROUGH

The site is located at 963 Avon Drive, Shippensburg, and is \$5 for borough residents, but costs \$25 for a pass for residents of Southampton Township (Cumberland and Franklin), Shippensburg Township, Newburg Borough, North Newton Township, South Newton Township and Hopewell Township. Site users must have the ID card to gain entry to the site, and those cards are valid for one calendar year. Commercial landscapers can also register for the site for \$105 per 10 cubic yards.

#### UPPER ALLEN TOWNSHIP

The site is located at 100 Gettysburg Pike, and is for compost, wood and chips pick-up only. It is free to residents who load the materials themselves or \$50 to have wood chips delivered. Delivery is in April.

### OIP Orthopedic Injury Clinic

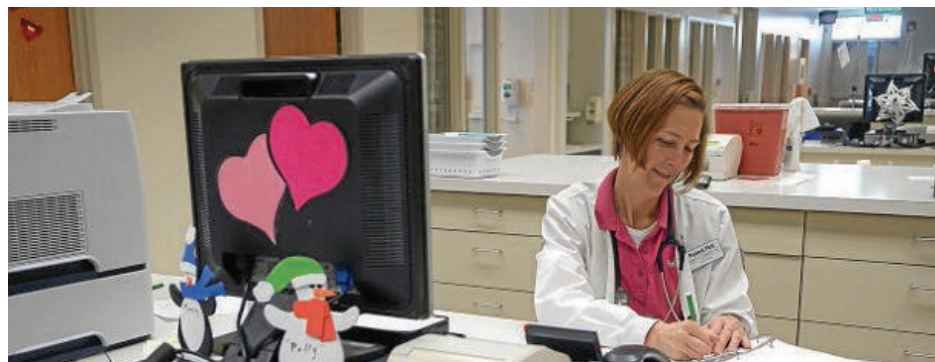

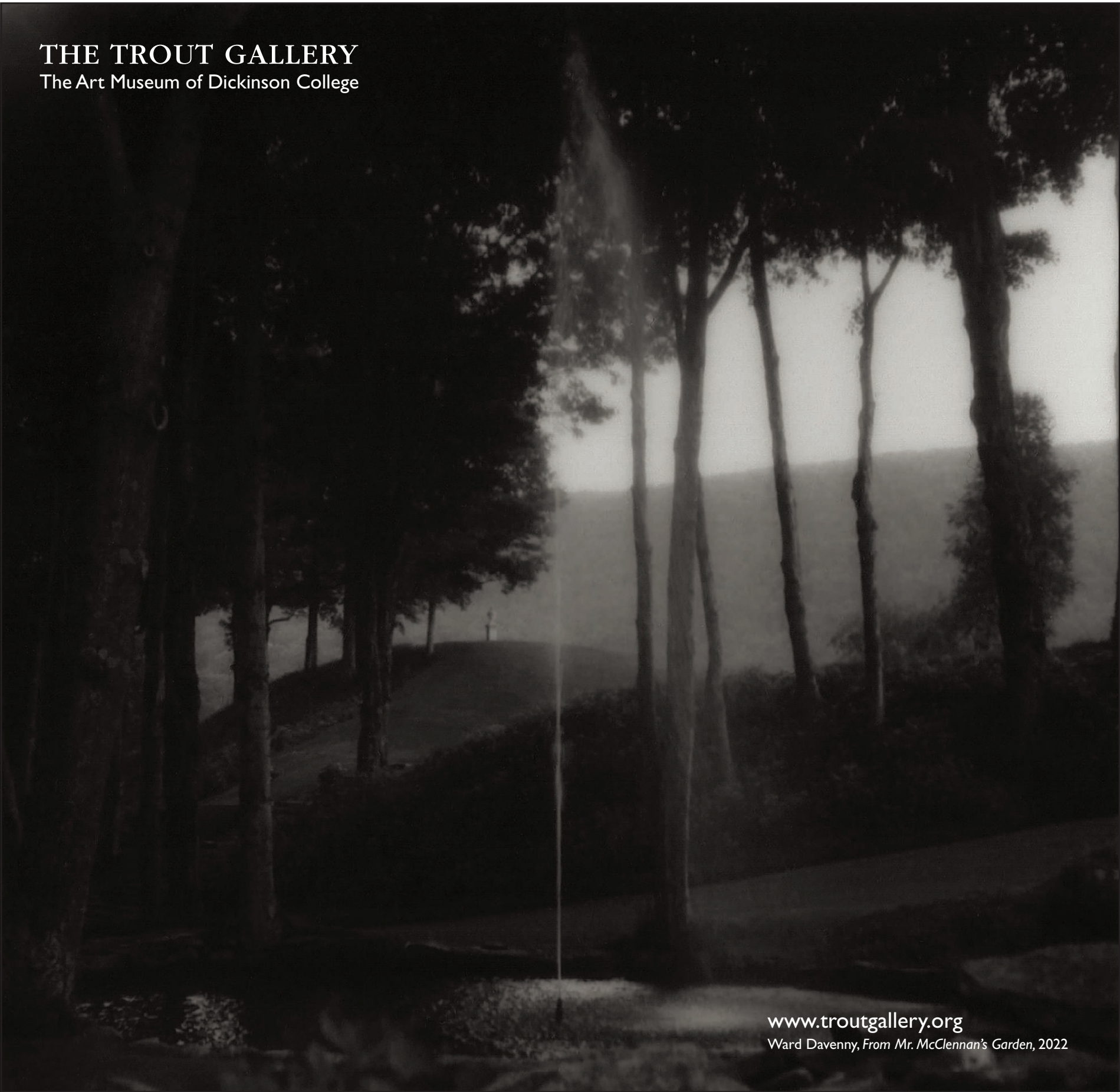
