County Now At 113 After Adding 12 COVID-19 Cases Wednesday

As per the Peterson Health end-of-day report on July 1, 2020, and statistics released by Kerr County Emergency Management Coordinator William B. "Dub" Thomas, there are:

- **12** - New Positive COVID-19 Cases on July 1 in Kerr County
- **113** - New total of COVID-19 Cases in County Since Pandemic's Start
- **3** - Currently Hospitalized in Peterson Regional Medical Center
- **2** - COVID-19 Deaths of Kerr County Citizens To Date

Earlier on Wednesday, Kerr County released some demographics related to its local citizens who have tested positive for the novel coronavirus. That briefing included the cities of residence for those local citizens testing positive for COVID-19. It also included a breakdown of the county's total cases by age group, as well as different ways in which the earliest cases were thought to have caught the infection of the novel coronavirus.

The following is an updated list of the numbers of cases listed according to positive patients' city of residence.

***Note: This information is for all 113 local citizen positive cases and includes today's new additions: 8 more cases for Kerrville, 3 for Ingram and 1 for Center Point.

- **22** - Ingram
- **0** - Hunt
- **5** - Center Point
- **1** - Comfort
