MOTION TO RECUSE JUDGE YOLANDA C. PARKER-SMITH
FROM ALL CRIMINAL CASES INVOLVING THE
DEKALB JUDICIAL CIRCUIT DISTRICT ATTORNEY

DeKalb Judicial Circuit District Attorney Sherry Boston, on behalf of the State of Georgia, respectfully moves Judge Yolanda C. Parker-Smith to either **(1) voluntarily recuse herself** from presiding over criminal cases and related matters involving the District Attorney's Office until Judicial Qualifications Commission (JQC) Inquiry № S26Z1811, initiated by formal charges on July 20, 2026, is resolved, or **(2) refer this motion to a different judge to assess the legal need for recusal under Georgia law**. If granted, Judge Parker-Smith's recusal would continue at least until the JQC Inquiry's final disposition and would affect the above-styled matter; additional cases enumerated in **Exhibit A**; and any pending or future criminal matters (including related duties such as search warrants, presiding matters, and Grand Jury returns) involving the DeKalb Judicial Circuit District Attorney. To support this motion, the State shows the following:

The State brings this motion on grounds that, if proven true, Judge Parker-Smith's conduct (1) diminishes public confidence in the judiciary for criminal cases under Georgia Code of Judicial Conduct Canon 1, Rule 1.2; (2) calls her professional competence into question under G.C.J.C. Canon 2, Rule 2.4(A); (3) creates the appearance of external influence on her judicial conduct under G.C.J.C. Canon 2, Rule 2.4(B); may violate additional provisions in Canon 2, including Rules 2.3, 2.5, & 2.8; and calls her judicial impartiality into question under G.C.J.C. Canon 2, Rule 2.2.

The State recognizes that the JQC's formal charges describe conduct against both the State and a private defense attorney. However, while Judge Parker-Smith's conduct involved only a single defense attorney, her conduct against the State encompasses both the elected District Attorney and, by extension, the entire office that fulfills her constitutional mandate. The inevitable result is that not only the State's attorneys, but also crime victims and members of the public at large, now have cause to question Judge Parker-Smith's impartiality in criminal cases under G.C.J.C. Canon 2, Rule 2.11; Uniform Superior Court Rule 25 et seq.; and broader considerations of fairly and impartially administering justice.

This motion is accompanied by a separate but attached affidavit as specified by U.S.C.R. 25.2, describing the facts that call Judge Parker-Smith's impartiality into question. However, the State will briefly highlight some key points of law regarding how the Court should proceed:

Pursuant to G.C.J.C. Canon 2, Rule 2.11(A), a judge “shall disqualify [herself] in any proceeding in which [her] impartiality might reasonably be questioned,” based on a non-exhaustive list of disqualifying factors including, for example, when a judge “has a personal bias or prejudice concerning a party or a party’s lawyer.” Ibid. Unlike judicial disqualification on grounds of constitutional due process, which is reserved for “rare instances” demonstrating actual judicial bias, “the codes of judicial conduct provide more protection than due process requires.” Pyatt v. State, 298 Ga. 742, 751 (2016) (citing Caperton v. A.T. Massey Coal Co., 556 U.S. 868 (2009)). In fact, “[i]t is not necessary that there be shown any actual impropriety on the part of the trial court judge. The fact that [her] impartiality **might reasonably be questioned** suffices for [her] disqualification.” Birt v. State, 256 Ga. 483 (1986) (**emphasis supplied**).

Rule 2.11(A)’s mandatory language makes clear that a judge should recuse herself any time there **appears** to be a legitimate question as to her impartiality. This decision must be grounded in judicial ethics, including judges’ obligation to “act at all times in a manner that promotes public confidence in the impartiality of the judiciary.” Serdula v. State, 344 Ga. App. 587 (2018) (quoting Former G.C.J.C. Canon 2A).

A trial judge’s role in assessing a motion to recuse is very limited. Upon being presented with such a motion, “the judge shall temporarily cease to act upon the merits of the matter” and instead

“immediately” make three specific findings regarding the motion and accompanying affidavit. Post v. State, 298 Ga. 241 (2015) (citing U.S.C.R. 25.3). These three limited, objective findings are (1) whether the motion is timely; (2) whether the accompanying affidavit is legally sufficient; and (3) whether the affidavit sets forth facts that, if true, would warrant recusal. If the motion and affidavit meet all three criteria, the trial judge **must** refer the motion for impartial reassignment to another judge. U.S.C.R. 25.3. This decision is an objective question of law, and neither involves nor permits a trial judge to exercise any discretion. See Mayor & Aldermen of the City of Savannah v. Batson-Cook Co., 291 Ga. 114, 119 (2012).

With this limited role and authority in mind, the State now addresses each of these required findings.

This motion to recuse is timely.

Pursuant to U.S.C.R. 25.1, all recusal or disqualification motions must be filed and presented to the judge no later than five days after the movant learns of the alleged grounds for disqualification. Here, the State acknowledges that it had noticed a concerning pattern of conduct from Judge Parker-Smith prior to July 20, 2026 but had refrained from taking any official action. However, the JQC’s filing of formal charges in Inquiry № S26Z1811 on that date – a filing which quickly gained attention and media exposure – triggered this action for three reasons.

First: the State was generally aware that the JQC was investigating Judge Parker-Smith, but it was not privy to the details of that confidential investigation and played no role beyond relating

factual in-court experiences at the JQC's request. Only after receiving the JQC's formal charges on July 20 did the State perceive two crucial points: the full nature of the allegations, and the fact that the District Attorney herself and several of her appointed Assistant District Attorneys (ADAs) had become necessary witnesses against Judge Parker-Smith in proceedings that carry real consequences for her tenure on the bench.

Second: even assuming there were no valid reasons to question Judge Parker-Smith's impartiality before July 20, the nature of the JQC's allegations forces those questions in all pending and future criminal cases. The most obvious question involves retaliatory action against the State - but the real concern is broader than that. The question of judicial impartiality centers on whether outside factors exert *any* influence - positive or negative - on how Judge Parker-Smith handles criminal cases. *See, e.g., G.C.J.C. Canon 2, Rule 2.4.* Knowing that the State's attorneys are crucial witnesses against her may provoke Judge Parker-Smith to retaliate against the State, but may equally provoke her into giving the State **favorable** treatment. Both options create an equal appearance of partiality, and both options are equally problematic.

Finally: the public (and publicized) nature of the JQC's filings and allegations combine with the facts related in District Attorney Boston's affidavit to create an unavoidable public impression that Judge Parker-Smith harbors a bias against the District Attorney herself, and by extension against the ADAs acting on her behalf. Media coverage of the JQC filings has specifically mentioned not just the prosecutors in Judge Parker-Smith's courtroom, but also the District

Attorney.¹ And public impressions matter when it comes to the appearance of impartiality. Those impressions are the only information available to citizens and crime victims who come into Judge Parker-Smith's courtroom. After the July 20 filing and its media coverage, those citizens and victims now have legitimate reasons to question whether Judge Parker-Smith is impartial.

These three concerns arose no earlier than July 20, 2026, when the JQC's formal charges became public. And they provoked official action without delay. This motion, filed on July __, 2026, is therefore filed within the required five-day window and satisfies the first requirement of U.S.C.R. 25.1. To the extent that this motion is filed fewer than ten (10) prior to a hearing or trial on a case for which recusal is requested, the State asserts that the circumstances demonstrate good cause for the same.

The factual affidavit is legally sufficient.

To support a motion to recuse, an accompanying affidavit must “state the facts and reasons for the belief that bias or prejudice exists, being definite and specific as to time, place, persons, and circumstances of the extra-judicial conduct or statements demonstrating bias,” and cannot consist of mere “conclusions and opinions.” U.S.C.R. 25.2; see Batson-Cook, *supra* at 116. The affidavit must also meet the necessary legal requirements for such documents.

Reviewing the accompanying **Affidavit of Hon. Sherry Boston, DeKalb Judicial Circuit District Attorney, In Support of Motion to Recuse** reveals that it is a valid, sworn affidavit by District Attorney Boston, and that it contains more than mere conclusory statements. The affidavit alleges specific and definite facts raising questions about Judge Parker-Smith’s impartiality, and is legally sufficient under U.S.C.R. 25.2.

The allegations in this motion and affidavit, if accepted as true, warrant Judge Parker-Smith’s recusal.

When presented with a timely and sufficient recusal motion and supporting affidavit, a trial judge must either (1) voluntarily recuse herself or (2) assign the matter to a different judge for evaluation if, “recusal would be authorized if some or all of the facts set forth in the affidavit are true.” Birt, 256 Ga. at 484; see U.S.C.R. 25.3. And recusal is warranted anytime a judge’s “impartiality might reasonably

be questioned.” G.C.J.C. Canon 2, Rule 2.11(A). While the allegations of a recusal motion “stand denied automatically” by operation of law, judges “shall not otherwise oppose the motion” or contest its assertions. *See* U.S.C.R. 25.3. In other words, the law requires judges to treat recusal motions and affidavits as if their allegations were true.

Here, District Attorney Boston’s affidavit alleges facts which, if true, would clearly warrant Judge Parker-Smith’s recusal to preserve the impartiality of this Court. The affidavit not only certifies that the JQC’s formal charges are factually correct, but includes additional details highlighting the degree to which Judge Parker-Smith pressed the issue – for instance, deploying DeKalb County Sheriff deputies to personally serve District Attorney Boston at her office with notice to appear and show cause why she should not be jailed for her ADAs’ purportedly contemptuous actions.

The State asserts that these facts alone should be sufficient to cause Judge Parker-Smith to voluntarily recuse herself from this case and all other pending and future cases involving the DeKalb Judicial Circuit District Attorney, at least for the duration of the pending JQC Inquiry. After all, “[i]f a trial judge knows that, for whatever reason, [she] cannot act fairly and impartially to both sides under the facts and circumstances of a case, then such judge is **duty bound to recuse [herself]**.” Baptiste v. State, 229 Ga. App. 691, 694 (1997) (**emphasis supplied**); *see* Rule 2.11(A); State v. Wakefield, 324 Ga. App. 587 (2013) (setting a general standard that the **appearance** of impartiality requires recusal).

At minimum, the facts set forth in this motion and affidavit are sufficient for this matter to be referred to another judge for an evidentiary hearing. *See State v. Fleming*, 245 Ga.700 (1980). Should Judge Parker-Smith choose not to voluntarily recuse herself from this case and other matters, the State respectfully asks that this motion be assigned to another judge for a hearing pursuant to the procedures set forth in U.S.C.R. 25.4.

The State does not file this motion lightly, and understands the legal and logistical difficulties that accompany recusal. However, Judge Parker-Smith's actions – and the public nature of the disciplinary proceedings they provoked – have forced the State onto this path. Members of the District Attorney's Office find themselves in the untenable position of serving as the State's advocates before this Court while also potentially being witnesses against the same judge in other proceedings.

Intermediate steps such as recusing from the small number of cases handled by the ADAs identified in the JQC's formal charges may be expedient, but are not sufficient because Judge Parker-Smith brought District Attorney Boston into the matter personally. An elected District Attorney "is not merely any prosecuting attorney. [She] is a constitutional officer, and there is only one such officer in each judicial circuit." *State v. Housley*, __ Ga. App. __, A26A0762, slip op. at 9 (July 1, 2026). ADAs derive their only source of authority from the District Attorney herself – meaning that unlike at other law firms, issues involving the elected District Attorney are imputed to her entire

staff. *Ibid.*, citing McLaughlin v. Payne, 295 Ga. 609, 612-613 (2014). Regardless of the difficulties it may cause, the only correct outcome is Judge Parker-Smith's total recusal from pending and future matters involving the District Attorney and her office.

Further, as noted in **Part 4** above, the JQC's formal charges have brought Judge Parker-Smith's conduct into the light of public scrutiny, which only increases the need for action to preserve public confidence in the court system. The appearance of this Court's impartiality has been irreparably damaged in criminal cases both now and moving forward, and principles of fair and impartial administration of justice mandate that the State pursue this course of action.

WHEREFORE, the State respectfully moves Judge Yolanda C. Parker-Smith to preserve the integrity of the court system by **voluntarily recusing herself** from this case; all other criminal cases now pending before her in this Court; all future criminal cases at least until the JQC Inquiry is resolved; and any related administrative or ancillary matters involving the DeKalb Judicial Circuit District Attorney, such as presiding over search warrants, bond proceedings, and Grand Jury returns.

Should Judge Parker-Smith choose not to voluntarily recuse herself in accordance with the Judicial Canons and Uniform Superior Court Rules, the State alternatively requests that this matter be **referred to another judge** for an evidentiary hearing regarding the allegations set forth in this motion and affidavit, and an **independent decision as to whether Judge Parker-Smith should be recused** from

the matters described above. Given the nature of the facts at issue, the State has no objection to consolidating all the cases subject to this motion for a single hearing.

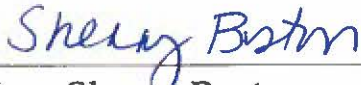
