









Project Location Map






Average Daily Traffic (ADT) Count Data

Counts collected on Wednesday, November 9th and Thursday, November 10th of 2022.




Traffic Count Data

N Decatur Road from Clairmont Road to Scott Blvd – 1/1/2013 to 10/31/2022




Bicycle Crash Analysis

Road Diet - Lane Reductions

- Fewer lanes for pedestrians to cross
- Traffic calming & consistent speeds
- Reduced rear-end, right-angle & left-turn crashes
- A multi-modal communityenvironment






Typical Cross Section of Layout





Road Diet Range


Approximate Transition to Road Diet




Approximate Transition to Road Diet




Short-Term Recommendations

Leading Pedestrian Intervals




- Separate users in space
- Separate users in time
- Increase visibility
- Crash Reduction Factor: 60%

Signal Backplates



- Increase Visibility
- Increase attentiveness
- Crash Reduction Factor: 15%

Wider Edge Lines




- Increase Visibility
- Increase attentiveness
- Crash Reduction Factor: 22-37%





Short-Term Recommendations

Pedestrian Refuge Island



- Separates users in space
- Crash Reduction Factor: 46%

High Visibility Crosswalks



- Increase Visibility
- Increase attentiveness
- Crash Reduction Factor: 40%

ADA Ramp




- Increases accessibility
- Crash Reduction Factor: N/A





Completed Recommendations

• Raised pavement markers on centerline and skip lane lines & wider edge lines (up to 8") along N Decatur Rd in the DeKalb County portion, east side (Dekalb County)







Completed Recommendations

- Street repaving
- Speed feedback sign
- Vegetation clearing & tree trimming
- Guardrail installation
- Leading Pedestrian Interval (LPI)













The North Decatur Road Initiative





Short-term Recommendations City of Decatur

- Raised pavement markers (RPMs) on centerline and skip lane lines
- Wider edge lines (up to 8")
- 150' solid white centerline at N Decatur and N Superior intersection
- New crosswalk, RPMs, SIGNAL AHEAD markings at approach





Concept Report Dekalb County

- Detailed construction cost estimates
- Estimate of right-of-way pricing
- Report to be completed and delivered to County & City in March 2025











Implement More Countermeasures

DeKalb County

- ADA ramps and detectable warning surfaces, pedestrian push button and sign upgrades at Webster Drive
- Raised pedestrian island in striped channelized right turn at Webster Drive
- Signal backplates with retroreflective borders for all traffic signals
- Vegetation Clearing at Ferndale Drive





Implement More Countermeasures

City of Decatur

- Capital project design based on transportation study findings and concept report; inclusive of stormwater
- Tree limb trimming





Next Steps

- City of Decatur will publicize the findings of the outcomes of the Concept Report (Dekalb County)
 - Pending DeKalb County Commission approval regarding the potential funding of design and construction
