



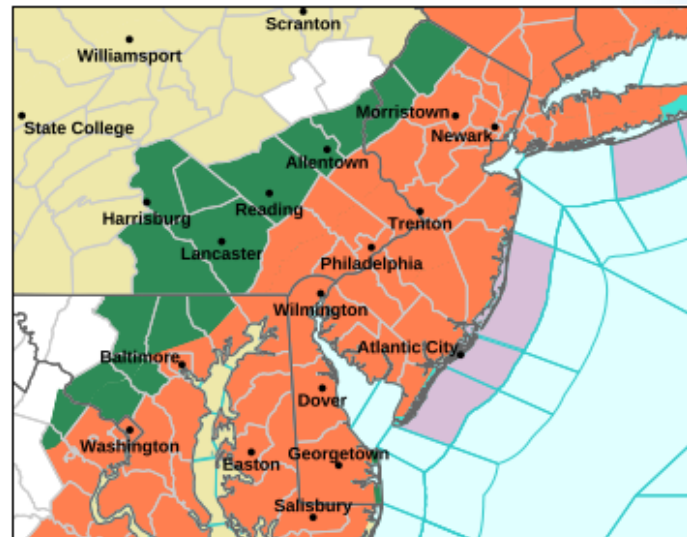

- ✓ Heat Advisory for Tuesday expanded to include Morris County, NJ
- ✓ New Flood Watch issued for Tuesday – includes all zones except Carbon, Monroe Counties in PA

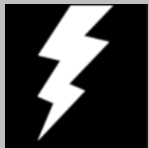

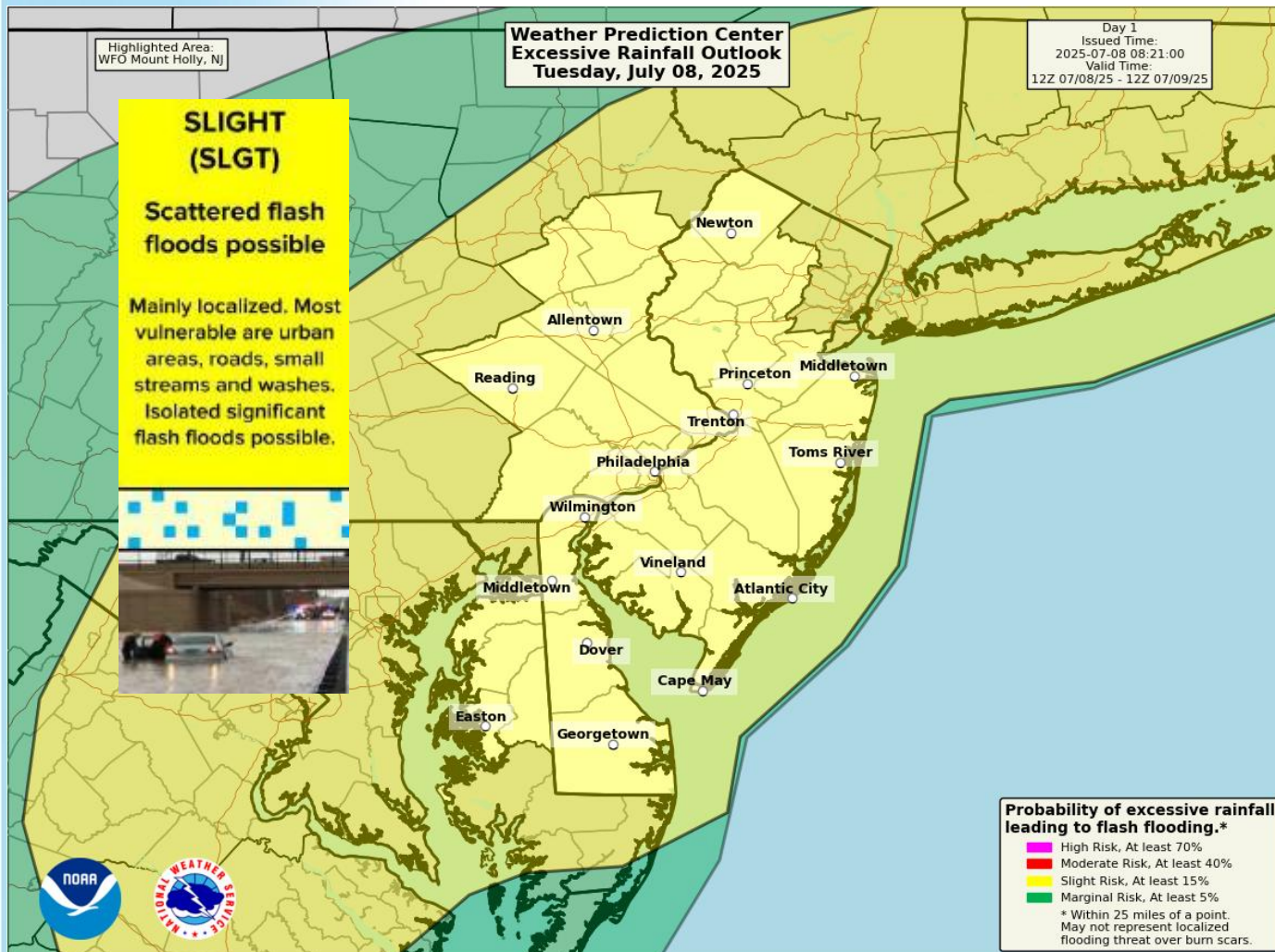

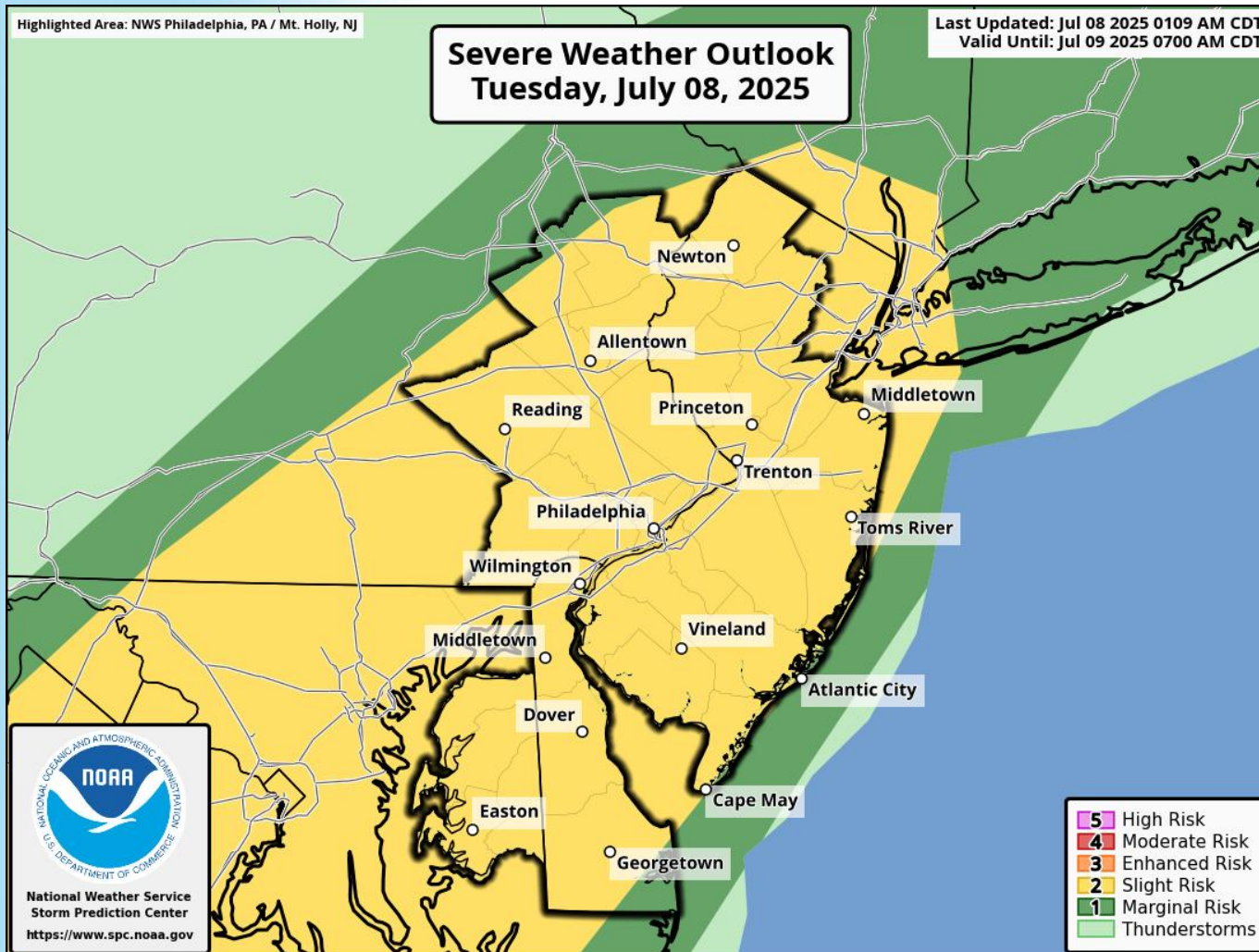
Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Flash Flooding & Severe Storms 	Showers and thunderstorms with heavy rainfall could lead to flash flooding, including road closures, along with damaging winds.	NJ, DE, southeastern PA and the eastern shore of MD	This afternoon and evening and then again Wednesday afternoon and evening
Rip Currents 	Moderate to High Risk for the development of dangerous rip currents.	New Jersey Shore and Delaware Beaches	Today through Wednesday
Heat & Humidity 	Heat indices near 100° to 105° will result in an increased risk of heat related illnesses.	Portions of southeastern PA, NJ, and Delmarva	10 AM to 8 PM today

Flash Flooding Possible This Afternoon Into This Evening



- ✓ Widespread Showers and thunderstorms will be capable of producing heavy rainfall leading to flash flooding
- ✓ Rainfall Rates up to 2 inches per hour
- ✓ Timing: mainly 2 -11 PM

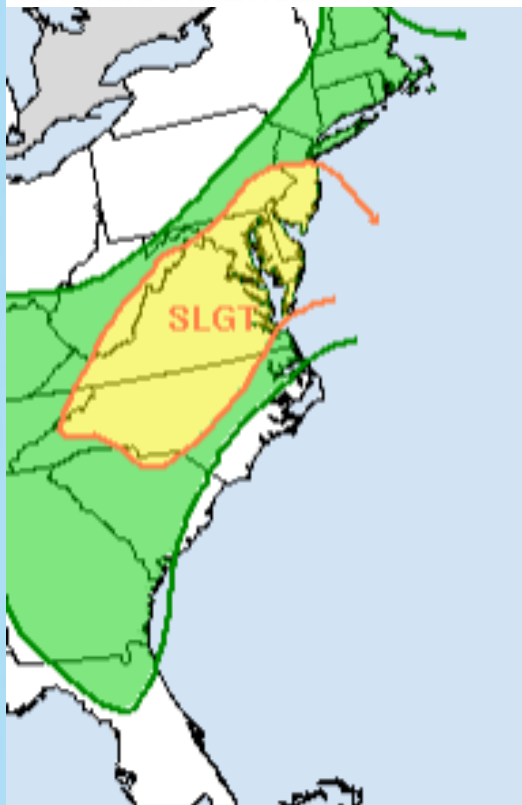
Severe Weather Threat This Afternoon Into This Evening



- ✓ Scattered severe thunderstorms possible this afternoon into this evening
- ✓ Greatest threat is damaging winds
- ✓ Timing: Mainly 2 - 9 PM

- ✓ Another round of showers and storms will produce a threat for more flash flooding and severe weather Wednesday afternoon through Wednesday evening

Event Summary

- ✓ Showers and thunderstorms are expected to develop both this afternoon lasting into this evening and then again for Wednesday afternoon into the evening. Thunderstorms will be capable of producing heavy rainfall leading to flash flooding, as well as damaging wind gusts.
- ✓ Moderate to high risk for the development of dangerous rip currents for the New Jersey shore and Delaware Beaches this today through Wednesday.
- ✓ Heat and humidity will build into today, with heat indices near 100° to 105° expected across portions of the area. Forecast high temperatures are in the upper 80s to mid 90s. The heat and humidity will lead to an increased risk of heat related illnesses. **A Heat Advisory is in effect for most of the area Tuesday.**
