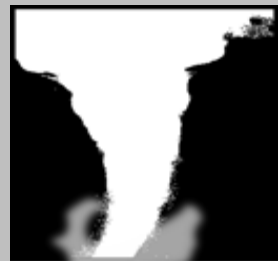


Situation Overview

Tropical Storm Isaias



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Hazard	Impacts	Location	Timing
Wind 	Tropical storm force winds could lead to tree and power line damage. Gusts of near hurricane force (>73mph) are possible near the NJ and DE coasts.	Along and southeast of the Interstate 95 corridor (Areas covered within the Tropical Storm Watch and Warning.)	Tuesday morning into Tuesday evening.
Storm Surge/ Inundation 	There is the potential for minor inundation, with locally moderate inundation on Chesapeake Bay.	Northeastern Chesapeake Bay, Delaware Bay, tidal Delaware River, coasts of New Jersey and Delaware.	Tuesday morning and Tuesday evening high tides.
Flooding Rain 	Significant amounts of rainfall will likely cause flash flooding across the region, and some main stem river flooding, not including the main stem Delaware River.	Possible across the region, but especially along and west of the I-95 corridor.	Tonight through Tuesday night.
Tornado 	Isolated tornadoes are possible.	Primarily along and southeast of the I-95 corridor.	Daytime Tuesday.
Marine 	There is the potential for very dangerous conditions due to high winds and seas.	All coastal and nearshore waters.	Tonight through Tuesday night.

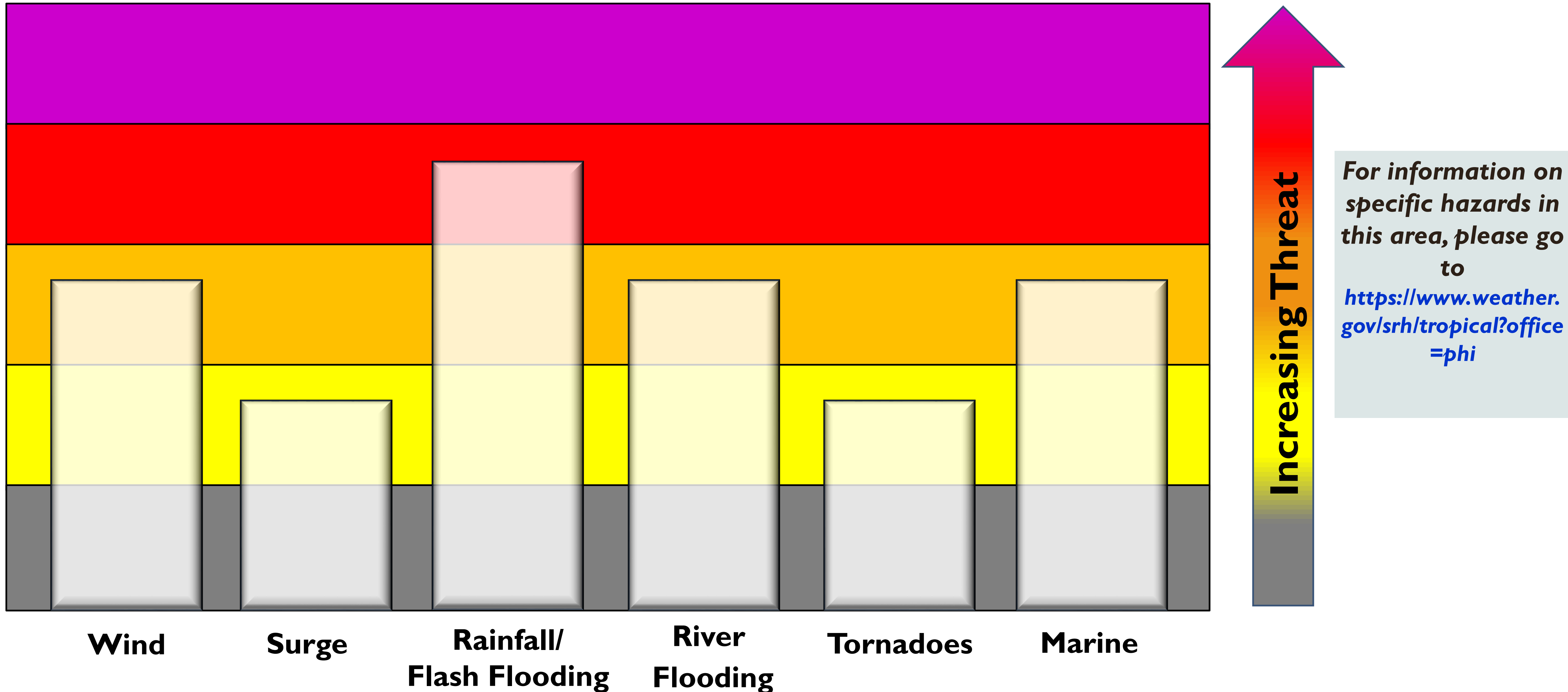

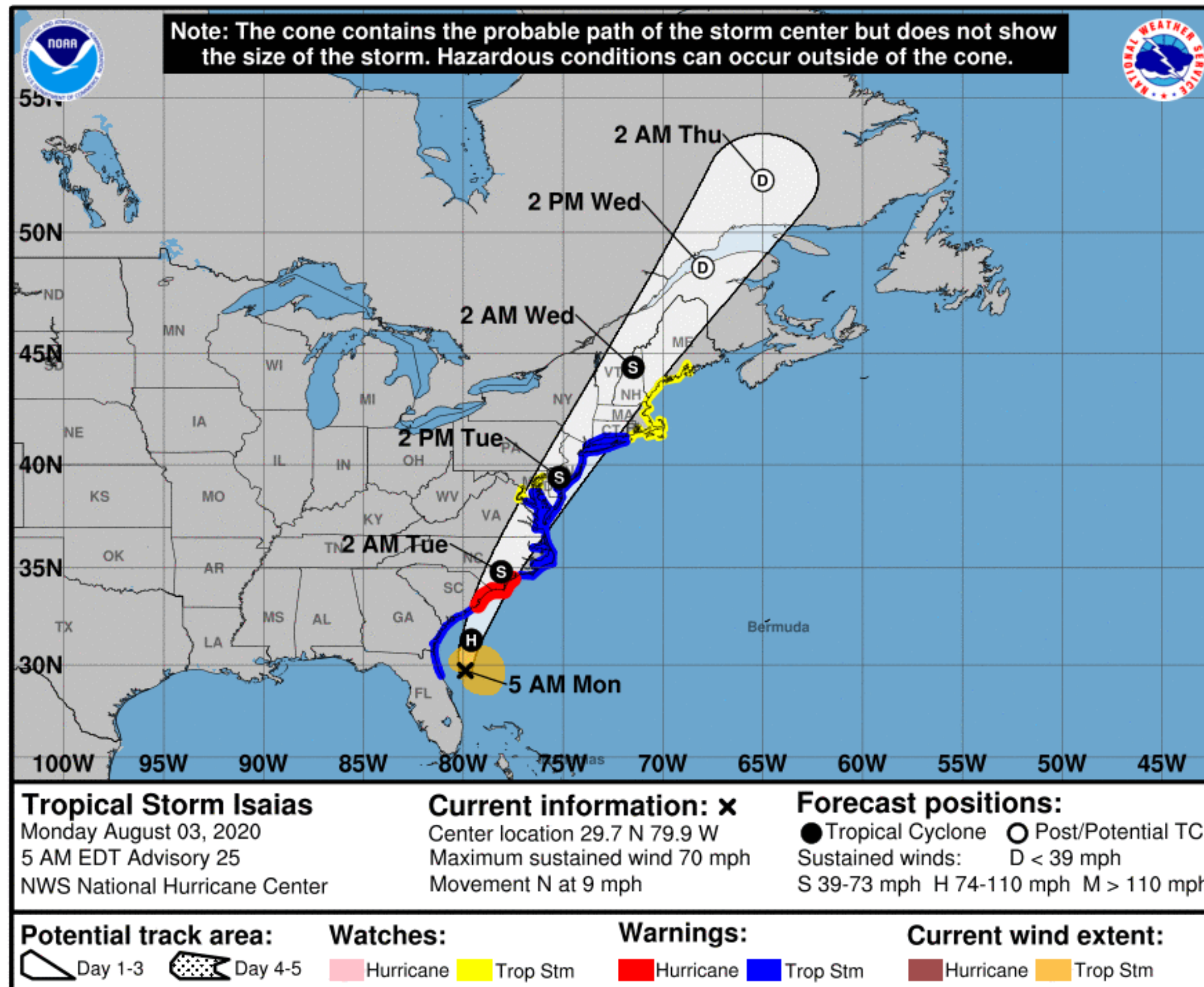
Situation Overview

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- The primary concern with Isaias remains heavy rain leading to flash flooding. Some river flooding is possible, but is not expected along the main stem of the Delaware River
- A Tropical Storm Warning has been issued for areas southeast of the I-95 corridor. A Tropical Storm Watch remains in effect for areas along and just northwest of I-95.
- The greatest impacts are expected early Tuesday morning into Tuesday night.

NOTE: Do not focus on the exact track. Impacts can occur well outside the area enclosed by the cone.

Wind Threat / Potential Impact

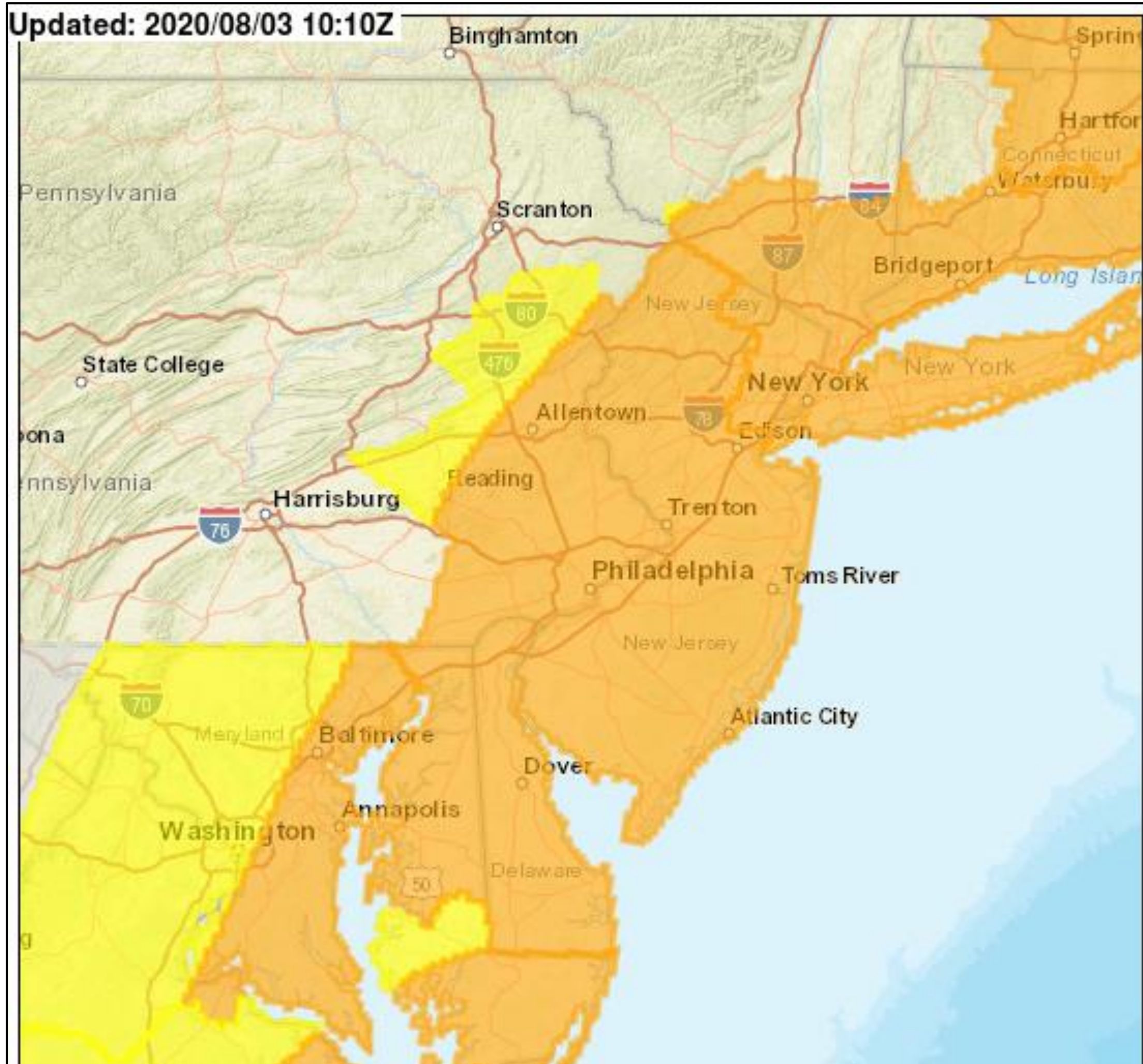

There is a potential for:

- Tree damage and power outages, especially in the orange shaded area.
- Isolated instances of structural damage especially near the coast, where wind gusts to near hurricane strength are possible.

Wind Threat

Potential for wind greater than 110 mph	Potential for wind 74 to 110 mph	Potential for wind 58 to 73 mph	Potential for wind 39 to 57 mph	Wind less than 39 mph
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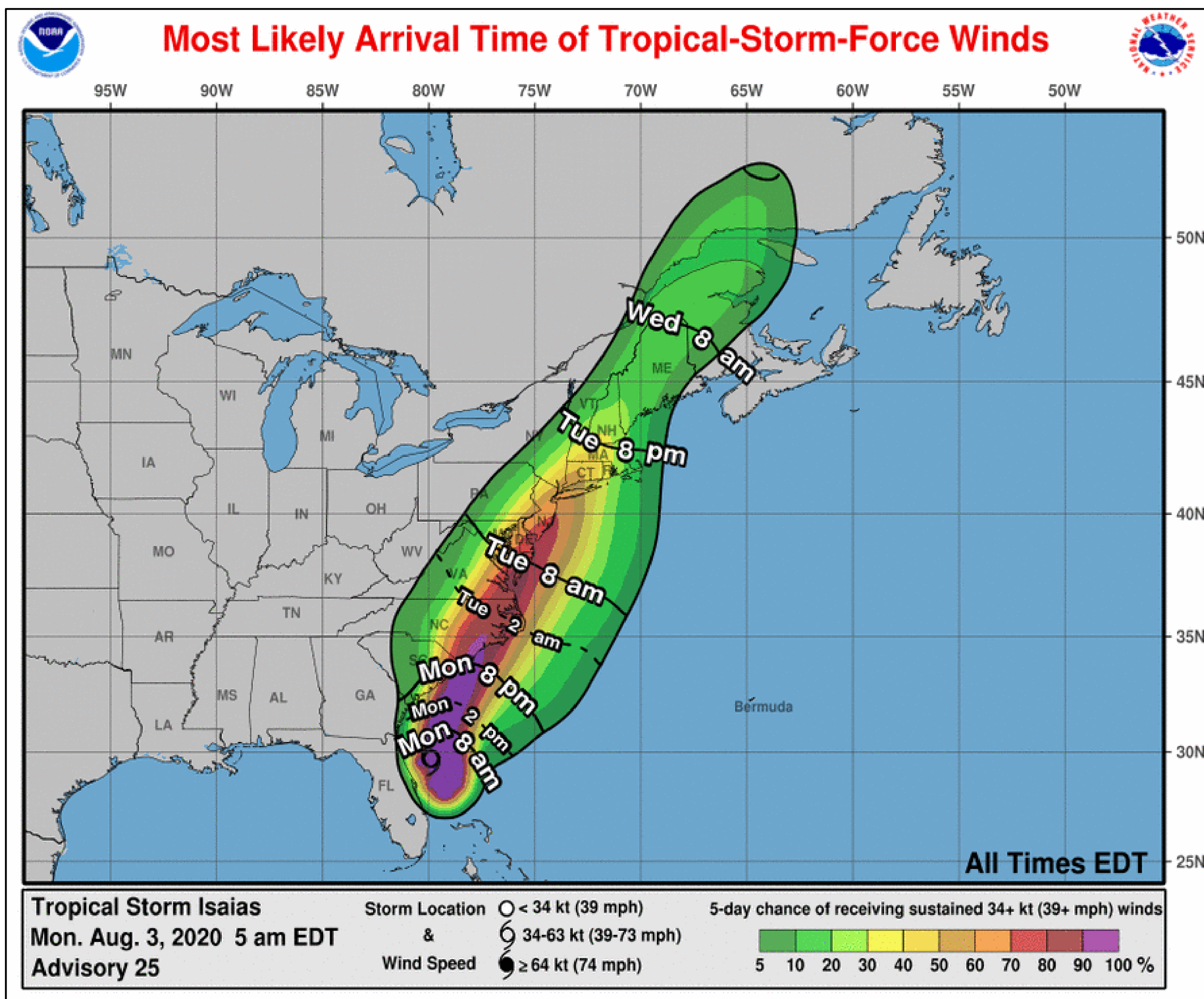
Most Likely Time of Arrival

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- The most likely time of arrival of tropical storm force winds along and southeast of I-95 is mid to late Tuesday morning.
- However, this area could see Tropical Storm Force Winds as early as daybreak Tuesday.
- Note the timing of the arrival of tropical storm force winds has sped up slightly.

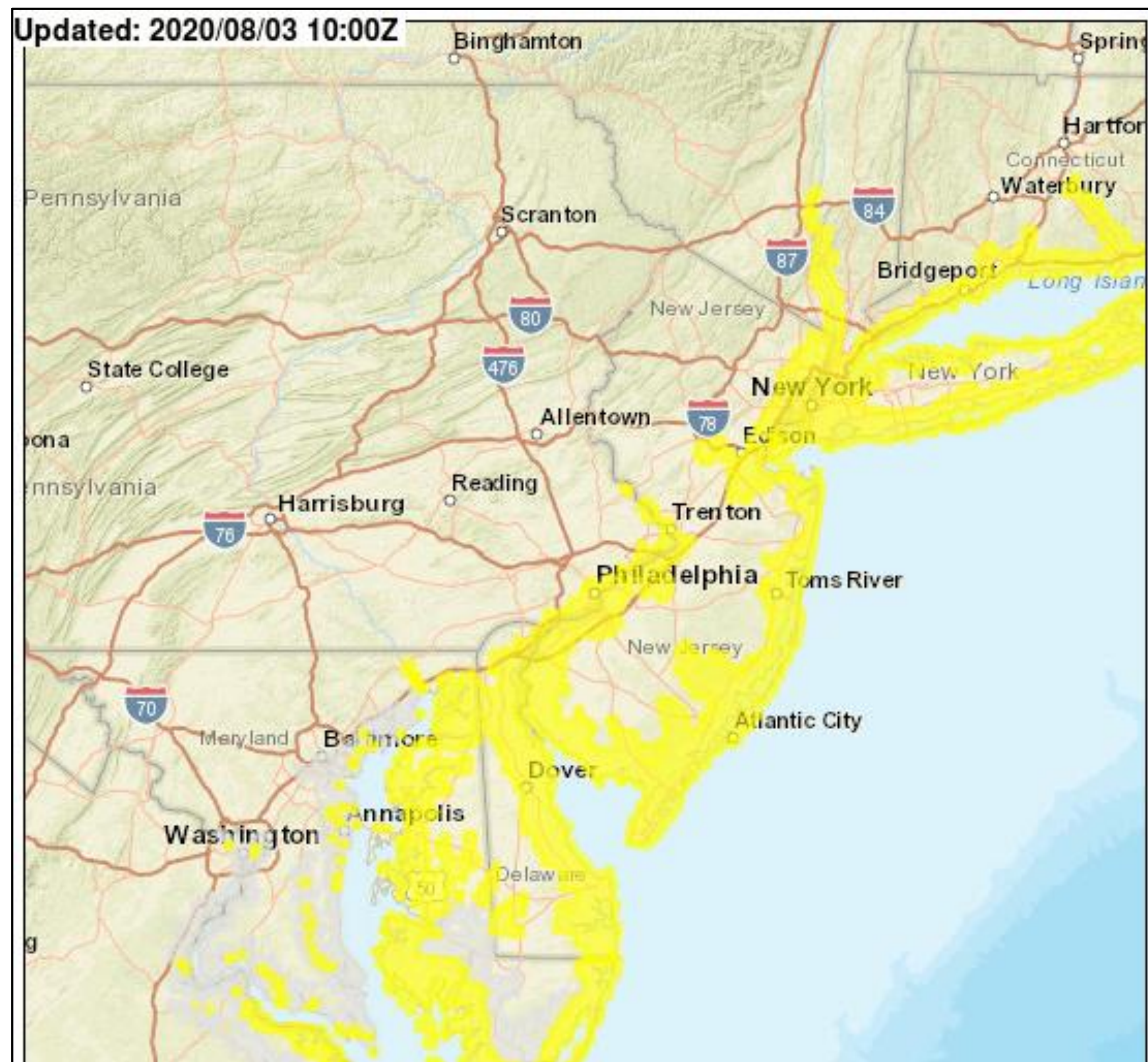
Potential Storm Surge Impacts

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There is a potential for:

- 1 to 3 feet of storm surge inundation in the yellow shaded regions
- Minor to locally moderate coastal flooding (especially in Chesapeake Bay) is possible due to this storm surge

Storm Surge Threat

Potential for storm surge flooding greater than 9 ft above ground

Potential for storm surge flooding greater than 6 ft above ground

Potential for storm surge flooding greater than 3 ft above ground

Potential for storm surge flooding greater than 1 ft above ground

Little to no storm surge flooding

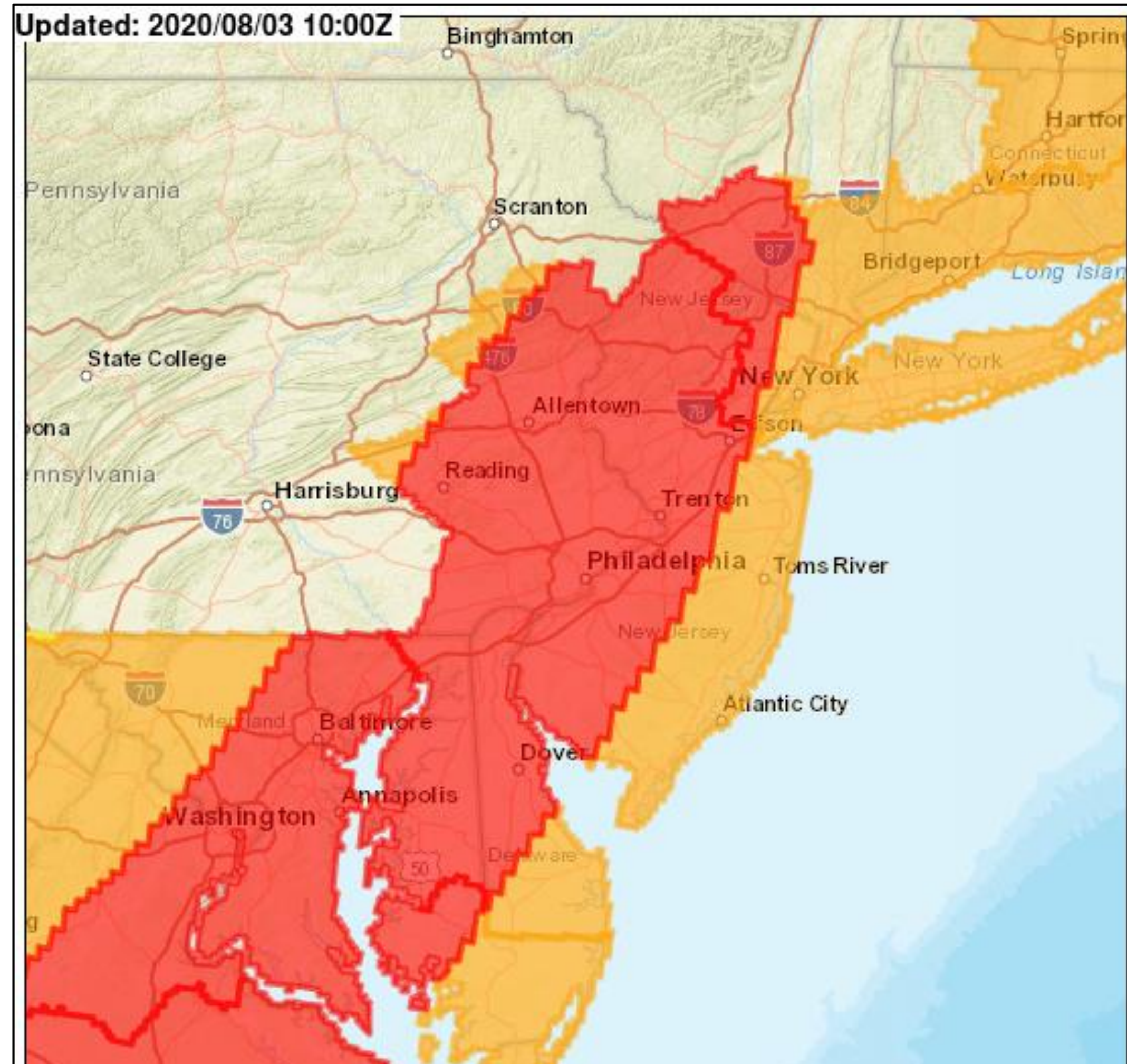
Inland Flooding Impacts

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- Areas shaded in red have the greatest potential for flash flooding from late tonight through Tuesday.

Flooding Rain Threat

Potential for extreme flooding rain	Potential for major flooding rain	Potential for moderate flooding rain	Potential for localized flooding rain	Little to no potential for flooding rain
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Expected Storm Total Rainfall

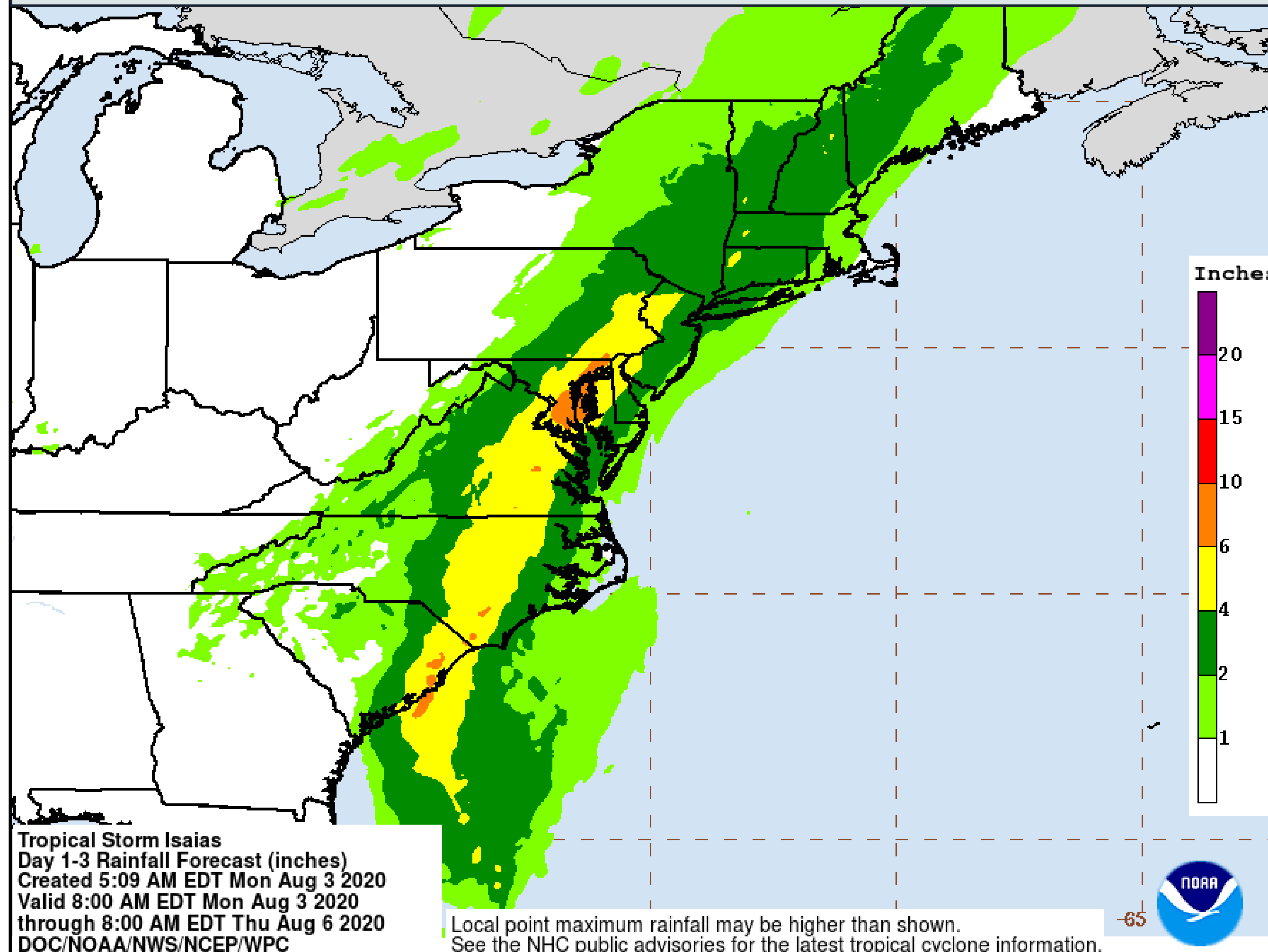
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Note: There will likely be locally higher amounts



- Storm Total Rainfall forecast valid through the duration of the storm.
- In our area, the most rain will occur between tonight and early Tuesday night.
- Locally higher amounts are possible.
- Heavy rainfall leading to flash flooding is our primary concern with this storm.

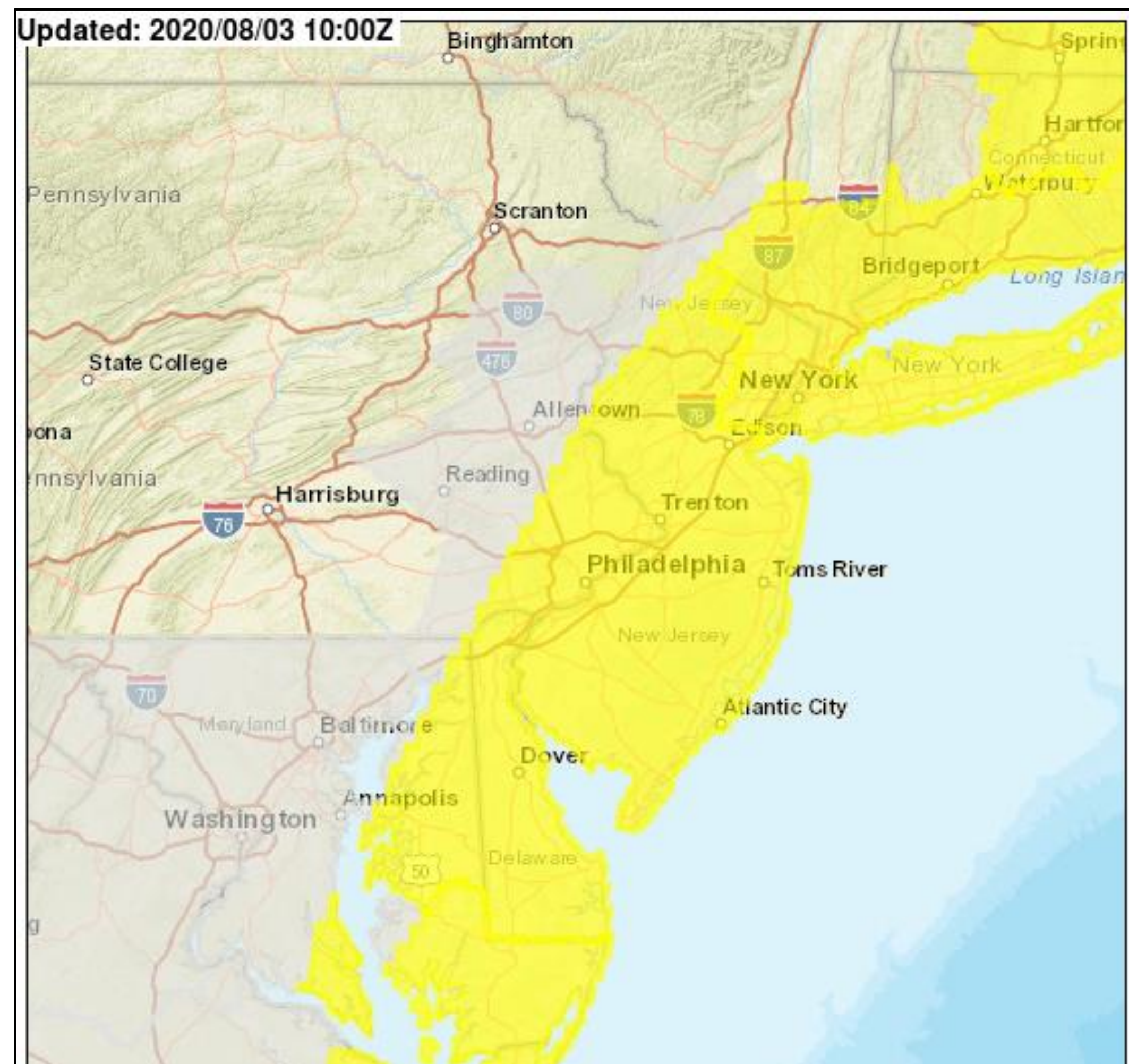
Potential Tornado Impacts

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- Main threat of isolated tornadoes would be during the daytime hours Tuesday.
- The best chance of an isolated tornado will be along and southeast of Interstate 95.

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Key Take-Aways

Tropical Storm Isaias

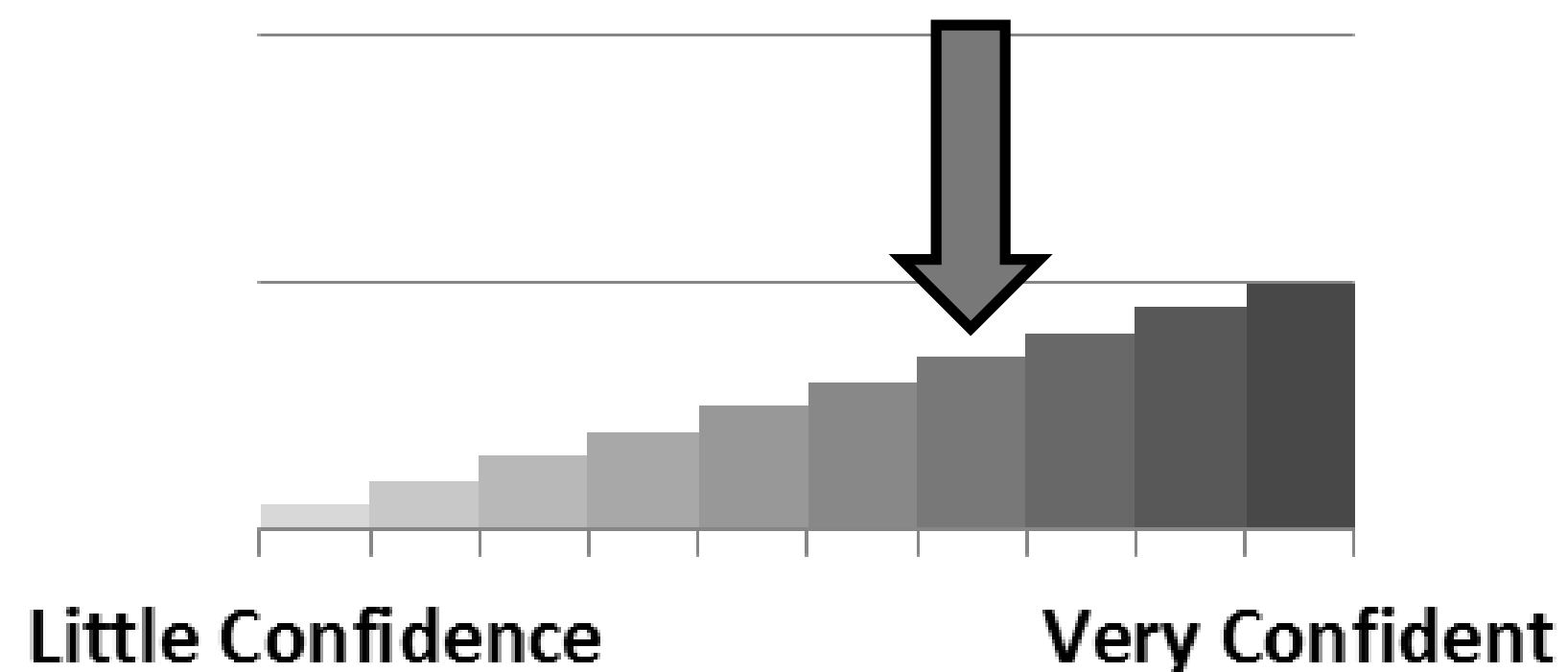


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- Heavy rain leading to potentially significant flash flooding is likely across the region tonight through Tuesday night. Some river flooding is also possible.
- Tropical storm force winds are likely, primarily along and southeast of the I-95 corridor on Tuesday, leading to tree damage and power outages. Wind gusts to near hurricane strength are possible near the coast.
- Increased swells and rip current risk will continue along the coast through at least Wednesday.

Forecast Confidence



We have increased confidence in the track and intensity of Isaias, and expect areas of significant flash flooding. We are also more confident of strong winds especially near the coast. There remains some uncertainty with details, such as how far inland tropical storm force winds will extend.
