**NUNCIBLE?** 

Belichick the best ever? Maybe. But many fans — and one owner — are asking 'what have you done for us lately?'

Bill Belichick's coaching career is on the clock. That thought has been bandied about the last several years. Heck, once watching a TV with Marv Levy being interviewed he apparently told Bill O'Brien and other coaches, "You won't ever find me coaching into my 70s."

Well laddy-da, Belichick turned 70 in April, and the fact that former Pats offensive coordinator Josh McDaniels, who was thought to be Belichick's eventual replacement, bolted the head coaching job in Las Vegas in January, implies he isn't going anywhere soon.

But that guy, the all-time greatest head coach, maybe in any professional team sport, is sort of on a hot seat in 2022.

And there are probably two reasons:

1. Tom Brady was sort of nudged out of here, due to personality conflicts with Belichick, and has won a Super Bowl post-Patriots.

2. The Patriots have not won a playoff game in three years, the longest tenure of Bob Kraft's ownership.

Kraft was outspoken at an event earlier this year, saying that fact three seasons without a January playoff victory — was unacceptable. Of course, Kraft is legendary for feeding into Patriots Nation's wants and complaints.

But if we're being honest, a fourth year without a playoff might really and truly be too much to take.

For Patriots Nation. And for, more important, Mr. Kraft.

What does that mean?

The greatest coach that ever lived is on the clock.

And if we're being honest again, after what New England saw at the end of the summer from its pro football team, particularly the offense, it doesn't look great.

When pressed after the last preseason game against the Raiders in Las Vegas, Belichick didn't debate what most fans saw.

"Preseason is preseason," Belichick said. "Preseason is about developing your team for the season and evaluating the players. I don't think preseason games are a real big indicator of what the team is or isn't, one way or the other.

"I don't think you really know where your team is until you get to about mid-season, you know, mid-October. Play five, six, seven games, match up against some different teams, see for real what your strengths and weaknesses are, and your opponents' as well; what it looks like on paper and what it is in preseason, and what it is in the regular season, I don't think they're all the same."


In other words, Patriots Nation, have some patience.

But in 2022, patience is a dirty word in professional sports. And the post-Tom Brady rebuild isn't as easy as simply trusting in Belichick.

You need elite talent. And we're not talking one or two dudes. And you need rabid dogs surrounding them.

The Patriots are question marks in both areas. Which brings us back



# Shouldering the load

# Pressure is on young Pats QB to lead team

What do you think, in terms of talent, of Super Bowl champion wide receiver Odell Beckham, Atlanta's star tight end Kyle Pitts, two-time champion linebacker Von Miller, all-time great kicker Justin Tucker and Cowboys elite wide receiver CeeDee Lamb?

I assume you think highly of all five heading into the 2022 season. A few very highly.

Well, guess what?

NFL players ranked Mac Jones ahead of, barely in some cases, all of them in their annual NFL Top 100 player rankings for 2022.

Mac came in at No. 85.

Among the five quarterbacks drafted in the top 15 picks — Mac was 15th overall — none of the others were even close to making this list.

That is saying something.

Mac made an impact on the league last year. More importantly, he made a statement among his teammates beyond the respectable 10-7 record and playoff berth.

And remember, the Patriots under Mac were 1-3 through four games, with four TD passes, four interceptions and an NFL-leading 10 sacks.

Then some magic, sort of happened. The Patriots not only won eight of their next nine games (the loss was in OT against Dallas), but his accuracy, success (12 TDs versus 4 ints.) and, most of all, leadership qualities became evident.

Here were comments from several Patriots, including longtime vets:

Center David Andrews: "He really loves football. And that's a big thing because it's a long season; it's a grind; you have to, especially in a place like this."

Safety Devin McCourty: "Those leadership qualifies shine through ... He works so hard. He wants to do the right thing. He wants to lead the group."

Special teamer Matthew Slater: "He commands our respect and he's earned it ... I'm extremely biased. He has demonstrated great leadership since the day he walked into the building ... Ultimately, this is going to be his team."

Outside linebacker Matthew Judon: "Teams in the NFL follow their quarterback ... I see a leader and a competitor. The way he approaches (his job), he's first player in the building and probably the last one to leave ... The way he commands the offense on the field is impressive to watch."

Wide receiver Jakobi Meyers: "He's just a humble dude, a great guy to be around. He don't really step over nobody, but when he wants something done he's going to make sure it gets done. So, you respect him but it's not really a fear-based thing where he thinks he's better than anybody. That's why I love him." PATRUTS

is big for a quarterback. Just look at a few pretty good Friday, outfits -- Cleveland and L.A. (Rams) quickly come to mind — in which the guarterback was defeated before the games actually were played.

Winning games, though, particularly in January and sometimes February, will

supersede the nice ... albeit ... truthful, words.

Things will be different on two fronts.

Mac not only worked on his craft, spending the offseason with a few throwing coaches, including Tom Brady favorite Tom House, the former MLB pitcher. Mac worked on his body, too, obviously spending more time in the weight room and filling his body with better, more nutritional foods.

Like Tom Brady, he came into the league a little on the puffy side.

No more. In fact, Mac looks as if he spent a lot of time from February to May at some TB12 facility.

"It was just cleaning up my diet, and I've learned more this offseason than I probably ever have about nutrition, sleep, wellness, all that stuff." said Mac.

"At the same time, I need to be able to maintain my weight and be able to take hits," he said, sounding a lot like Brady. "There's a fine balance for every player. I've definitely trimmed down on the body fat, and I'll get a chance to bulk up before the season starts and be able to absorb hits."

The other big change for Mac will be the person in his ear over the next four or. hopefully five months.

With his former one-onone coach and offensive coordinator Josh McDaniels now the head coach in Las Vegas, he appears to have a concoction of coaches as possibly co-offensive coordinators in Matt Patricia and Joe Judge.

We could also add Belichick into that mix.

Mac has been asked about it since mini-camp and almost every session he's had with any media personnel.

"At the end of the day, the players play and the coaches coach. You want to listen to the good coaching that you can get from three coaches who have all been head coaches," said Mac. "They've seen a ton, a ton of football and that's what I'm just trying to take in, is what is something that each one of them said in a meeting that I can take with me, whether that's about life or football and then apply it to the game.

"Like I said, they all bring a different perspective, but I feel like they're listening to the players, 'Hey we kind of like this concept, alright let's try it,' or if they want to put in something else, they explain the why. That's the important part for me is understanding why we're doing something and from there, as a player, my job is go execute the plays."

Originally committed to University of Kentucky after having a successful high school career as only a "three-star" recruit. He was ranked No. 468 prospect in HS when he committed to Kentucky. As his ranking grew, his prospects improved and he was offered a scholarship from Alabama.

Miami and Pittsburgh, both difficult venues for the road team, and then Ravens in Foxborough for Week 3?

A 3-0 and 2-1 mark sets Mac up well for a Pro Bowl season. A 1-2 or 0-3 mark? Sounding like his head coach, the next practice is first and foremost on his mind.

As for the NFL Top 100 list, the only other Patriot was linebacker/pass rusher Matthew Judon at No. 52.

It means his targets on offense, though improved from 2021, with the addition of Davante Parker as his probable No. 1, won't rank with what the other quarterbacks of his ilk have.

It means Year 2 Mac had better be better than Year 1 Mac. And that Mac was pretty darn good.

# **Bill Belichick**

Looking at the 2022 slate, is there one game on the New England Patriots schedule in which Bill Belichick loses the coaching battle?

The answer you are looking for here is, "No!"

Belichick may no longer be the best coach in the game. Perhaps, at 70, he's slowed down a bit. And the attrition on his coaching staff, either with guys being hired away like Josh McDaniels or retiring like Dante Scarnecchia and Ivan Fears, has hurt.

He's still right there, probably a notch below Sean McVay in LA and maybe Andy Reid in Kansas City.

## **Mac Jones**

As a rookie, the franchise QB put up stud-like numbers with 3,801 yards and 22 TDs with 7.3 yards per attempt.

Mac Jones might not have the most lethal arm on the planet, but if the first year was any indication, he belongs in this league.

His mind is a weapon. Jones processes and throws, something that separates the bottom guys from the top in this game. In the end, how he hones his arm talent will determine how good he is in the NFL. But the foundation is there, and that factor legitimizes the potential of the New England offense.

## **Ground Game**

There are better running backs in this game - probably a dozen of them, maybe more.

Few teams, if any, can run out two guys like Damien Harris and Rhamondre Stevenson. Together, they can and most likely will allow New England to control the ball and the clock, easing the strain on the defense and allowing Mac Jones to grow into his game without undue pressure.

Together, a year ago they combined for 1,535 yards and 21 TDs on the ground with a 4.6 yard/carry average.



### Horrifying Corners

The greatest sell job this summer in camp has been the fallacy that Jalen Mills has grown into a No. 1 cornerback.

That façade was a tremendous smoke-screen for the propaganda campaign that Jonathan Jones could be the No. 2 guy outside on the boundary.

The Patriots' worst personnel group in camp is at the corner.

There is potential help on the way, but any kind of serious work from rookies Jack and Marcus Jones would be a dangerous baptism by fire.

New England's pass rush had better be ferocious or teams are going to shred these guys, chunk play by chunk play.

### **Limited Star Power**

The NFL Network's Top 100, as chosen by the players, recently came out and New England had but two men on the list. Mac Jones and Matt Judon.

Each went to the Pro Bowl a year ago, but would either be confused with a true game-breaker.

Judon had a career-best 12.5 sacks last season with one coming in December or January (6 games).

Jones didn't lead the Patriots to a win when the opposition scored more than 24 points.

New England lacked play-makers on both sides a year ago. You could say J.C. Jackson was the guy. He's a Charger now.

There is just no bigtime threat. And in this era of the NFL, that's suicide.

fourth best in the NFL in fewest yards allowed per game (310.8) and second (17.8), our eyes saw nothing of the sort.

The Patriots defense had to the Jones and the offense pionships (Green Bay and at the end of games.

If not for the disjointed summer preseason, Belichick's best work might be his rebuild of the offense, particularly after Cam Newton's strange year leading the offense in 2020.

Belichick drafted, arguably, the best quarterback in the 2021 NFL Draft at the No. 15 spot, in Jones. And while we're talking draft, he may also have stolen one of the best defensive lineman in the draft, his college teammate at Alabama. Christian Barmore, in the second round.

The Patriots finished 10-7 in the regular season last year and in the rapidly improving AFC, that might be tough to repeat.

The AFC East, while not as difficult as the AFC West, has all four of its members best in fewest points allowed trending upward. And nine of the Patriots' 17 games are against a playoff team from last year, including two trouble getting the ball back from the conference cham-Cincinnati).

Did we mention the first two games are on the road in Miami and Pittsburgh and that the Patriots will be underdogs in both?

The Patriots history under Belichick is the Patriots play their best in December and beyond.

There is one fact that might be worth noting, though, from those in the "Attack Belichick Club." The last time he was in this predicament, where he had to prove himself was the 2001 season after the 5-11 debacle in 2000.
