### The Honorable Richard L. Martinez, Artesia Municipal Court Judge, passed away on Thursday

ARTESIA — According to a release from the City of Artesia mayor's office: It is with a heavy heart that the City of Artesia, New Mexico announces the passing of Municipal Judge Richard L. Martinez. Judge Martinez died on August 6, 2015, of natural causes. He leaves behind wife Rhonda, three adult children and two grandchildren. Judge Martinez was elected in 2012 and took office on March 14 of the same year. He was also a retiree of the Artesia Police Department serving almost 30 years and advancing through the ranks Sergeant and Commander. His career in law-enforcement was used to make our city a safer, more pleasurable place for our families by dedicating much time to DWI enforcement and other worthwhile law enforcement causes. He also concerned himself with the training and mentoring of young police officers. He was a respected member of the community he served and will be greatly missed. Services for Judge Martinez will be announced early next week.

### Sludge from Colorado mine spill heads down river to NM

DENVER (AP) — A plume of orange-slab muck from mill-billion-gallon mine waste spill in Colorado was headed down river to New Mexico, prompting communities along the water route to take precautions until the sludge passes. Officials emphasized that there was no threat to drinking water from the spill. But downstream water agencies were warned to avoid Animas River water until the plume passes, said David Ostrander, director of the EPA's emergency response program in Denver.



The U.S. Environmental Protection Agency said that a cleanup team was working with heavy equipment Wednesday to secure an entrance to the Gold King Mine in southwest Colorado. Workers instead released an estimated 1 million gallons of mine waste into Cement Creek. "The project was intended to pump and treat the water and reduce metals pollution flowing abandoned mine portal." As the plume headed toward New Mexico, that state's governor said the EPA waited too long to tell her about the problem. Gov. Susana Martinez is disturbed by the lack of information provided by the agency to New Mexico's environmental agencies, said Chris Sanchez, a spokesman for the governor. Sanchez said that the state was not told of the spill until almost a full day after it happened. "It's not going to look pretty, but it's not killer," Cooper told The (Farmington) Daily Times. "The impact on wildlife wasn't clear. There are no fish in the Cement Creek watershed because of longstanding problems."


