

WHAT ORGANIZATIONS ARE YOU INVOLVED IN?

I am involved in Birth to Five Illinois: Region 3 as part of their family council, Crisis Nursery of Effingham County as a Board Member, and Postpartum Support International (PSI) as a co-leader of their event The Climb-Team Effingham.

EDUCATION/TRAINING

I earned my BA in Psychology from Elmhurst University in 2014. My junior year I was nominated to attend a Leadership Conference in Kentucky where I spent a week training on leadership skills and management. I then went to graduate school at Argosy University to earn my MA in Clinical Mental Health Counseling. While I was there, I was a member of Chi Sigma Iota-Counseling Academic and Professional Honor Society International. Upon graduation I sat for my licensing exam

to receive my Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) license. After two years of supervision and experience, I was qualified to sit for my clinical exam, then receiving my Licensed Clinical Professional License (LCPC) allowing me to practice independently. I was also trained in Eye Movement Desensitization and Reprocessing (EMDR) through the EMDR Institute in 2015, now practicing this trauma therapy for 8 years. Recently, I took training on Perinatal Mental Health Disorders and received my certification, PMH-C through Postpartum Support International.

WHAT IS YOUR DEFINITION OF SUCCESS?

To me, success means achieving goals that align with my passions while consistently showing up as the best version of myself. It's about staying true to my values and embracing authenticity in everything I do, while making a positive impact on the people and community around me.

WHAT ADVICE WOULD YOU GIVE TODAY'S YOUTH?

My advice to today's youth is to focus on who you truly are and strive to show up authentically in all areas of life. Avoid the trap of comparison and the pressures from media and social media. Instead, invest your energy in causes and organizations that genuinely resonate with you. By doing so, you'll surround yourself with like-minded, goal-oriented individuals who inspire and support your growth.
