

Press Release 7/24/20

Homes of Greenbrier

We have informed employees, residents, and families and want to provide community members with a Covid-19 update.

1. We continue to have zero resident cases of Covid19.

2. Yesterday afternoon, July 23, we were notified from the Oklahoma Department of health, that all our Assisted Living residents tested negative. We did have one staff member test positive. This person was not in direct contact with residents. This person did not have any symptoms and was screened daily using the required screening protocols. This person was sent home immediately, and staff and families were notified. This staff member was retested today and tested negative for COVID-19. The State Department of

Health has been notified.

3. The following case was reported to the State Department of Health. An office staff member, who does not provide care to any resident, tested positive for COVID-19 over the weekend of July 11. The staff member was asymptomatic prior to testing positive. The staff member has quarantined at home since receiving their test results. The staff member may only return to work after 14 days and is required to be symptom free for 72 consecutive hours without fever or symptoms (without fever reducing medication), and a Negative Covid19 test (per CDC and OSDH recommendations).

4.No frontline staff (nursing, dietary, housekeeping) have symptoms or positive tests.

Greenbrier will continue to keep their families, resident and staff informed in an effort to remain transparent. We will also continue to perform all mitigation steps as directed and suggested by CDC and OSDH.

We remain in phase 1 of reopening which still only allows visitors for compassionate care visits as we have been doing. We will continue to stay in close contact with all families and encourage window visits and phone calls with their loved ones.

We would like to thank our community for all their support, visits, cards, masks, “drive-by’s” etc. Let’s all remain as “close” as we possibly can for our residents!
