

oth the girls and boys soccer teams at Fulshear High School are ready to move on to their first year in varsity competition this school year. The teams finished last season with identical 14-1-1 records and JV championships to their credit.

Last year's team rosters were filled with freshmen and sophomores as Fulshear High School continues to evolve. This years' enrollment is predicted to be around 650, adding a junior class. A senior class is still another year away. The Charger soccer teams are a part of District 27-5A.

Soccer is gaining interest in the Fulshear area, but not quite the same level of club soccer activity that you have in close-by communities, such as Katy.

"I think as the different subdivisions grow, and more people move in, the sport will catch on," said girls' head coach Mark Kluppel.

The big win for the girls last season was a 3-2 defeat of Foster High School after coming back from 0-2 deficit.

"We really pulled together after we gave up that second goal. We actually tied the game at half time, and got the win in the second half," Kluppel said. "The second time we played Lamar Consolidated, the girls won the game with a goal with 20 seconds left in the game, 1-0."

That game clinched the district JV championship for Fulshear. The winning goal was scored by Hannah Ajilore, who finished out the season with 14 goals, 3 assists for 31 points.

"Hannah obviously did a great job, but it was a good team goal," said Kluppel. "The other team had a free kick. Ingris Cortez won the free kick out of the air and sent it to Iza Gonzalez at midfield; she put a great through ball into Hannah. She just outran everybody and finished the shot. Karsen Jones was our central defender and played a key role in organizing the defense. We had a lot of young kids playing that had never played before. Having a kid like Karsen was like having a coach on the field."

The Charger goalkeeper was freshman Shelby Mcpherson, who played every minute of every game, the only goal keeper for the team.

"For a kid who had not played goal keeper before, she did just a great job for us," Kluppel said.

Entering its first year at the varsity level, Kluppel said he believes the team is ready for the challenge

ahead of them.

Reset and reevaluate, picking up some new players from the incoming freshmen and others who try out for the first time. Kluppel hopes to have enough kids to make two teams.

As Kluppel stated, the obvious goal for this past year was winning games, but the goal was really building toward their first varsity season and "trying to get the kids to realize the fitness that's needed, the strong technical skills they need to acquire, and the tactical part of the game."

Hopefully this past year the Lady Chargers got a good understanding on how to work together.

"We worked really hard in the weight room during the season," Kluppel said. "Hopefully we will pick it up when we get back from the summer and take it from there. The goal for

this year is to finish in the top four and make the playoffs."

The small enrollment at Fulshear High School does present some challenges but is also opens the door for opportunities for players.

Some of Fulshear's athletes play multiple sports.

"We had two kids that played volleyball, three or four that

either ran cross country or track," Kluppel said. "We had kids in the band, in theater. There's a ton of opportunity to do lots of things. They can be in clubs, choir all sorts of things. We even had a kid come in on the soccer team when the basketball season concluded."

It was just at the right time as the team was experiencing injuries.

"We picked up Angelina Duerto. She really helped us for one game. We were down to only 12 players," Kluppel said. "She finished her basketball season and asked if she could play soccer. It just happened that the day before we had suffered a couple injuries. We needed more kids, and that worked out well for us. We were able to get Angelina for the last four soccer games in the season. Hopefully this year we will have more kids coming to try outs, but I still anticipate we will have kids coming from other Fulshear sports."

The varsity schedule looks very challenging for Fulshear this year.

Fourteen district games and two tournaments (Spring Branch and I-10 Shootout) and Kluppel has scheduled one non-district game against Bellville, a 4A club that he thinks will be in Fulshear's district the following year after UIL re-alignment. Bellville won their district last year.

In non-district games the Chargers will be playing mainly 6A schools just because there are more 6A schools around than 5A. He said preseason this year is going to be difficult for a reason to get ready for district.

"I'm hoping that if we work hard and everybody stays healthy we should have good results. Hopefully we will be playing in April next year. I think we have a pretty good core of kids coming in and should be able to compete on any level," Kluppel said.

Kluppel, before coming to Fulshear was the head coach at Katy Taylor from 2005-2016. In his 12 seasons at Taylor, he was a

part of 11 playoff teams, including six regional tournament teams and two state tournament teams, winning the state championship in 2006.

On the boys side, Fulshear Head Soccer Coach Ricky Konkolweski believes his team is more than ready for the varsity challenge ahead of them.

Konkolewski shared that his Charger team last year was mainly made up with freshman.

"We came from behind seven times...pretty proud of those guys," Konkolweski said.

The Chargers had 40 kids come out for the team, about 20 percent of the boys enrolled at Fulshear allowing Konkolewski to have two teams.

"One was kind of a reserve team, give the guys a chance to get the feel of everything." He had a lot of inexperienced kids catching up to the few experienced kids that were on the team," Konkolweski said.

The Fulshear boys, a JV team, didn't play any varsity teams, "but once we played a team the second time around they dropped a handful of varsity players on to their JV team to try to beat us, and we were still able to take them. It was pretty cool to be involved in that kind of situation."

The team had to be "road warriors" to fill out their 2016-2017 schedule, traveling to Angleton, Port Lavaca and Victoria for games. Konkolewski shared that in one two week period last year the team logged around 800 miles in travel.

Konkolweski said the team has developed a passion for soccer. "These kids eat, dream soccer. I think I'm very fortunate at this spirit. I have a group of hove that are all really good friends away."

point. I have a group of boys that are all really good friends away from the fields. They get together on their own, are extremely close, and extremely, extremely competitive. When they are that competitive it makes a coach's job considerably easier. If you have kids out there that really want to win, you just can't ask for more," Konkolweski said.

Konkolweski said the move up to the varsity level this year will challenge his young squad.

"I think it's going to be a pretty big handful for us; a difficult position," Konkolweski said. We are going to be playing schools way larger than us. We are projected to have only about 650 students when school begins. We will be going against schools like Foster that has 2,000. The numbers are going to be a (depth)

difficulty, our biggest problem."

Konkolewski has been studying Tompkins, Ridge Point, Tomball Memorial, any of the new schools that have recently opened up, looking at what their plans were, how they scheduled, what teams looked good, what teams looked bad, what he could apply to making the Chargers a winning team.

"We will be able to field a pretty good starting roster," Konkolewski said.

This season's goal is aiming for that fourth spot in playoffs.

"If we can get that fourth spot, that would be great. Our district is really difficult. We're pretty proud of what we were able to accomplish," Konkolewski said.

Konkolewski before coming to Fulshear coached girls soccer at Foster High School, compiled a 12-6-2 record overall, and 7-2-1 in District 24 5A. Foster finished second in District in his final year at Foster.

Tennis and cross country are also starting their first year as varsity sports.

The future is closer than you think when students go to high school so embracing the chance to learn about possibilities is a great opportunity.

Leadership High School, hosted by the Fort Bend Regional Council on Substance Abuse, Inc. (FBRC) along with Fort Bend County community leaders this summer, took on the task of providing an exceptional experience to Lamar Consolidated Independent School District youth.

Students from throughout the district, including Fulshear High School students, learned about professions, county government, economic development and volunteerism. This weeklong program, which is an eight-hour a day commitment, also had students participating in fun competitive activities such as canoeing, relay races and paintball as well as a beautification project at Bowie Elementary in Rosenberg. They also self-produced micro-documentaries to capture the most memorable moments of their weeklong adventure.

John Robson, chief operating officer of FRBC, said Leadership High School began in 2010 and welcomed FHS students for the second year in a row. Their goal is to expose young adults to community leaders in different fields at onsite locations to get them thinking about their future.

"They get to connect with leaders and talk with them. This is to get them thinking where am I going to be in 15 years, and why is getting career skills important. There are a lot of careers they were exposed to. It's very hands on," Robson said.

The career exposure was wide and varied from law enforcement to crop dusters, furniture builders and the water treatment plant.

"Things like this can broaden their knowledge of life and

maybe a career they want to pursue. It gets them thinking to have a lens inside the future," said Robson.

Dr. Erin Forbes, associate principal at Fulshear High School, joined Leadership High School on the last day of session with librarians, counselors, and principals. She said the best part of the event wasn't only the chance for students to meet new friends, but also to see the leadership potential for kids.

"It's real powerful networking for them," said Forbes. "Our kids grow as leaders and have them not only on our campus, but in the community. There were really cool things the kids got to learn about different professions and opportunities that are out there. It's always beneficial for kids to open their eyes and broaden their horizons."

Tenth-grader Trei Parker, who is 15, said the "great experience" at Leadership High School was an excellent way to start off summer in "a positive direction."

"I learned that when you communicate and work as a team you can get jobs done that were unimaginable. I also think this will give me more patience when situations are difficult so I react in a better way and learn so I can do better in the future," Parker said.



"I think it will be a big hit."

In addition to its swimming facilities, Firethorne's major amenities include a scenic 12-acre lake with surrounding greenbelt, hike and bike trails, parks and playgrounds, sports fields, tennis courts, a Community Center with a meeting room and fully equipped fitness facility and a Clubhouse for residents' private functions.

Firethorne is home to Ray and Jamie Wolman Elementary in Katy ISD, with the new Lamar Consolidated ISD's Katherine Lindsey Elementary set to open in August 2017.

Fulshear House Concerts will welcome



he Young Fables are the promising country duo comprised of three-time American Idol vet Laurel Wright and accomplished guitarist and vocalist Wesley Lunsford. The act hails from Maryville, TN and the team has already collected impressive accolades including the Grand Prize of the Texaco Country Showdown which landed Laurel on the Ryman Auditorium Stage at age 16.

I wanted to focus more on my music, which led me to quit the

high school basketball team and become homeschooled."

At age 16, Wright was the youngest winner (a record that stands to this day) of the Texaco Country Showdown. That specific year, about 50,000 people nationwide entered the competition. Out of those 50,000, the top five would perform their original music on the Ryman Auditorium Stage.

LeAnn Rimes hosted the event and Wright won the grand prize of \$100,000. The day after she turned 19, Wright moved to Nashville.

"I worked as a restaurant hostess while pursuing my goal of earning a full-time music career," Wright said. "In less

than a year, I was able to accomplish just that alongside guitarist

Wesley Lunsford."

"I've been a semi finalist on American Idol Season 13 and 14 and in the final Season 15 I made it into the top 48," Wright said.

"Wes and I have opened for some amazing artists: Sara Evans, Randy Houser, Scotty McCreery, The Band Perry, Joe Nichols, and more.

"Meeting Wes was a serious game-changer for my music career and me. When my former lead guitarist backed out of a gig at the last minute, my drummer said he knew "a guy named Wes". From the first moment I heard Wes play, I've never wanted another guitarist," Wright said. "He's not only one of the most talented people I've ever met, but also one of the most hardworking people I've ever worked with. Wes was my lead guitar player for about a

year and a half before I moved to Nashville. Just before I moved, Wes told me he wanted to be a part of anything and everything







in which I was involved. We haven't played a show without each other in over a year, we write all of our songs together and he brings something completely unique to our songs."

Lunsford was born in Tallassee, Tennessee - East Tennessee.

"At age 9, Mom made me take piano lessons for a year, which then led to a second year," Lunsford said. "When I was 14, Mom knew I wanted to learn guitar, so for Christmas she gave me my first guitar. Back then, I loved The Beatles, Bob Dylan, Black Sabbath, Pink Floyd... (I still love all of those). At age 15, I started a band and I was the lead vocalist and lead guitar player."

About four years later they were offered a deal, but they turned it down. Shortly after that, the band split and went our separate ways.

"I studied music business for a year at MTSU, but decided that wasn't really what I wanted to do," Lunsford said. "In 2009 I earned a bachelor's degree from the University of Tennessee with a concentration in Studio Music and Jazz. During, and after college, I free-lanced for various bands around the Eastern United States. I had the opportunity to play music in China for 6 months, 7 days a week, with some of my closest friends.

"Oddly enough, while in China, I started listening to (and loving) country music," Lunsford said. "I was offered another contract to stay in China, but declined because I wanted to come back to play country music. After returning to the states, I played country music for a small label's various artists in East Tennessee. Some of the people I met during that time knew Laurel. It was a friend from that group who called me that night to fill in on guitar with Laurel. I come from a music loving family; I have very supportive parents, stepparents, brothers and grandparents. I've worked with a lot of musicians, but knew from the moment we started working and writing together that Laurel and I had something very special."

he Young Fables will feature an opening act of Savannah Adkins. Adkins is a 16-year-old singer/songwriter from Katy and is presently a junior in high school. Adkins mostly plays pop/country but sometimes likes to drift into other genres.

Adkins discovered the beauty of music a few years ago and it has driven her to want to share it. Right now, Adkins has been and



still is playing for local restaurants like Wild Wing Café and Agave Rio. She has also performed at trade shows and festivals.

In the summer of 2016, Adkins won the Acoustic Throw Down at Wild Wing Café in Katy. It was an eight-week competition where she went up with some really talented artists.

Aside from playing, Adkins practices Krav Maga, which is reality-based self-defense that has influenced some of her music, like her original "Throat Punch."



Her undeniable talent and infectious spirit have since kept her in the spotlight. Since finishing fifth on of The Voice (Season 10) and serving as The Kohl's Greenroom Host (Season 11), the Texas ingenue's opportunities have only expanded coming off the show to include her Grand Ole Opry debut, Ryman stage appearances and continuing to tour across the United States to this day. She has recently been cast as a lead in the play "Road to Nashville" which features the hits of country music. She is set to debut September 2017.

Mary Sarah exudes patriotism. She continues to bring that love and respect to her National Anthem appearances across the country by opening her shows with God Bless America. In her own words, "It is the least I can do for the men and women of this country who put their lives on the line for our freedom. Using the platform I have been given to let them know I support their efforts to keep my dream, and the dreams of millions of American's alive is an honor."

"Timing is everything and you cannot rush creativity", finds Mary Sarah on the cusp of releasing a new single she wrote after experiencing the fallout of a failed relationship. "I do hope it helps others who find it hard to see the positive in a breakup," she reveals, "The beauty of the poetic words is that finding yourself through a broken relationship is a very empowering

thing to do". Her genuine disposition lends to a true honesty and a vulnerable transparency that belies her age as a songwriter. Her feet grounded in the traditional sound that she holds so dear. 
At age 15, she joined a band composed of men in their 40s. Two years later, she fronted it as The Pauline Reese Band. About the same time, she met Willie Nelson and was welcomed into his inner circle of friends including legendary songwriters Sonny Throckmorton (George Strait's "The Cowboy Rides Away") and Merle Haggard sidekick Freddy Powers ("Natural High").

While writing songs with them and studying their music and the artists they admired, she toured and worked odd jobs, from fixing guitars and selling hot dogs on a stick to making titanium kneecaps in a machine shop. Honing songwriting, guitar, vocals and showmanship while performing more than 170 concerts a year, Pauline steadily earned a fan base that allowed her to grow from opening act to headliner. She performed at two of Willie's Farm Aid festivals that included Dave Matthews, Neil Young and John Cougar Mellencamp and six of Willie's fabled Fourth of July Picnics.
