**ORDINANCE NO. 08-2026**

An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Prestonsburg, Kentucky, Providing for the Advertisement and Sale of a Franchise Authorizing the Owner Thereof to Maintain, Construct and Operate Electric Power Transmission and Distribution Lines Upon, Along, Over and Under the Streets, Thoroughfares, Alleys, Sidewalks, Bridges, Public Ways and Other Public Places of the Said City.

The franchise shall be in effect for ten (10) years from the date of the passage of the Ordinance granting it. The grantee of the franchise shall save the City harmless from any and all liability arising in any way from negligence in the erection, maintenance or operation of said lines and appurtenances. The grantee of the franchise shall have the right to take up portions of and make excavation in the streets, alleys, sidewalks, public ways and public places of the City as deemed necessary for the construction and maintenance of the aforesaid electric transmission and distribution lines, but the grantee of the franchise shall promptly prosecute such work to completion and shall leave the streets, alleys, sidewalks, public ways and public places in as good condition of repair as before such work was commenced. The franchise granted will be binding upon and will inure to the benefit of the successors and assigns of the City and of the grantee. The grantee shall make such rules and regulations covering the furnishing of said electric energy as may be fair and reasonable and consistent with the standard practice of the grantee. Said grantee may charge such rates for electric service as shall be fair and reasonable. The said grantee shall render service under said franchise of like quality, that is, adequate, efficient and reasonable, to that now being rendered to said City.

<sup>3</sup> The currently effective Gas Cost Adjustment authorized in Case No. 2026-00022 is shown in both the present and proposed rates; however the Gas Cost Adjustment is revised quarterly, and the proposed rates will vary as approved by the Commission. Quarterly Gas Cost Adjustment Case No. 2026-00110 is pending before the Commission. **IMPACT OF PROPOSED RATES<sup>6</sup>**

The foregoing proposed base rates are designed to recover Columbia’s revenue deficiency which includes incorporating the actual SMRP Rider plant investments from 2023 and 2024 into the base rates and removing them from the SMRP Rider. This results in an increase of approximately 17.14% in base rates. The estimated amount of increase per customer class in both dollar amounts and as a percentage to which the proposed rates will apply is as follows:
