

PUBLIC NOTICE

NYSEG has filed tariff revisions May 27, 2026, with the New York State Public Service Commission (PSC) for new electricity and natural gas delivery rates to become effective June 1, 2026. These tariff revisions implement the temporary rates approved by the PSC in May 2026 and they include a \$52.6 million increase in base electricity revenue and a \$1.2 million increase in base natural gas revenue. The PSC Order approving the temporary rates also required NYSEG to implement a Company-Administered Energy Efficiency/Building Electrification (“EE/BE”) Programs Surcharge through the System Benefits Charge (“SBC”).

A typical residential electricity customer with an average use of 600 kilowatt-hours/month can expect an average monthly bill decrease of 0.1 percent. A typical residential natural gas heating customer using 100 therms/month can expect an average monthly bill increase of 0.9 percent.

Customers may see some charges prorated on your June or July bill to take into account energy delivered before and after the new electricity and natural gas delivery rates went into effect.

RESIDENTIAL CUSTOMERS

Regular Residential Customers: The electricity delivery charge will decrease 0.369 cents per kilowatt-hour. The per-therm natural gas delivery charge for the 4-to-50-therms block will increase 1.9 cents per therm and 0.704 cents for the block rate over 50 therms. The electric customer charge and the natural gas customer charge will remain the same.

Day/Night and Time-of-Use Customers: The electricity delivery charge will decrease 0.376 cents per kilowatt-hour for Service Class 8 and 0.272 cents per kilowatt-hour for Service Class 12. The Service Class 8 customer charge and the Service Class 12 customer charge will remain the same.

Regarding energy supply: If you purchase energy supply from NYSEG, your price will continue to be based on market prices; if you purchase your energy supply from a supplier other than NYSEG (also known as an energy services company or ESCO), your energy supply price depends on your agreement with your ESCO.
