

Told Friends His Body Controlled 'By Evil Forces'

Auburn Man Says Wife, Children, Then Self

AUBURN, N.Y. (AP)—An ex-ambassador who often told friends his body was controlled "by evil forces" seized a revolver Friday night and shot to death his wife and their four children before killing himself.

When police, summoned by Offenbergs' father-in-law, walked up the steps to the body-strewn house, Offenbergs yelled, "Call the hospital. I want an autopsy on my body."

Offenbergs, shot in the head, was alive when police entered the home. He died three hours later at the hospital.

Pawlyk called police after Offenbergs telephoned him that he had killed two of the children.

He had held several jobs and, in recent years, served as a letter-carrier in the Auburn Post Office.

Postmaster Thomas Brogan described Offenbergs as "a good employee," who had never exhibited any tendencies toward violence.

Police said they had uncovered nothing that might help explain why Offenbergs wiped out his family.
