Public Media Release for Free and Reduced-Price Meals

Fontana Unified School District (FUSD) announces its policy to serve nutritious meals every school day under the Community Eligibility Program (CEP), which is implemented by the Healthy, Hunger-Free Kids Act of 2010 (HHFKA). CEP eliminates the need for households to submit meal applications to determine eligibility for school meal programs. Effective July 1, 2026, through June 30, 2027, students who attend any in-person K-12 FUSD campus is entitled to all meals offered (breakfast, lunch, and supper), free of charge during each school day to students requesting a meal, regardless of their free or reduced-price meal eligibility (Birch High School does not offer supper meals). Charges may result to your student's meal account for any additional menu items requested. Contact your school site for mealtimes.
