The United States Postal Service is considering plans to repurpose its Tulsa mail processing facility, which may adversely impact the jobs of Tulsans and delay the delivery of necessary medications, household goods, and other time-sensitive communications by sending mail and packages to the USPS facility in Oklahoma City before being delivered to Tulsans. A comprehensive public input strategy is necessary to ensure the local impacts are thoroughly evaluated before final decisions are made regarding this facility.

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF TULSA, OKLAHOMA, URGING THE UNITED STATES POSTAL SERVICE TO CONSIDER LOCAL HEALTH, ECONOMIC, AND COMMUNITY IMPACTS OF CLOSURE OR REPURPOSING OF THE TULSA PROCESSING CENTER; URGING THE EXTENSION AND ENHANCEMENT OF PUBLIC ENGAGEMENT; ENCOURAGING A COMPREHENSIVE APPROACH TO RESTRUCTURING EFFORTS; REQUESTING THE OKLAHOMA FEDERAL CONGRESSIONAL DELEGATION ENSURE DECISIONS ARE MADE IN THE BEST INTEREST OF TULSANS; AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, The Post Office Department was founded in 1775 with Benjamin Franklin as the first Postmaster General and since that time has played an unparalleled and critical role in building the United States by connecting our citizens, communities and country; and

WHEREAS, Article I, Section 8, Clause 7 of the United States Constitution ensured these crucial services were preserved and guaranteed when it gave Congress various powers related to the postal service; and

WHEREAS, the Postal Act of 1792, signed into law by President George Washington established the foundation of our modern Postal Service with a commitment to freedom of the press, privacy and commerce; and

WHEREAS, today postal facilities often serve central functions in a community including key roles such as the delivery of everyday necessities and vital medical supplies; and

WHEREAS, the Tulsa Processing Facility is staffed by dedicated and hardworking professionals who swear an oath to the Constitution of the United States and our Postal Workers live by their creed: "Neither snow nor rain nor heat nor gloom of night stays these carriers from the swift completion of their appointed rounds"; and

WHEREAS, the United States Postal Service (USPS) is currently engaged in a public input process to evaluate a recommendation to repurpose the U.S. Postal Service Processing and Distribution Center in Tulsa which would result in some mail processing operations to be moved to Oklahoma City; and

WHEREAS, the removal or repurposing of the Tulsa Postal Processing facility may adversely impact Tulsa residents including our veterans, elderly, people with disabilities and households without a transportation or internet access; and

WHEREAS, the loss of Tulsa's postal processing facility may negatively impact continuity of business operations, time-sensitive communications, and employment opportunities for processing center employees.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY OF TULSA THAT:

- **Section 1.** The City of Tulsa urges the USPS to consider local health, economic, and community impacts and particularly adverse impacts on low- and moderate-income households, the elderly and the disabled before it attempts to close or repurpose the Tulsa Processing Center.
- **Section 2.** Further, that the City of Tulsa urges USPS to extend the public comment period and broadly engage all viewpoints and stakeholders on this topic including, but not limited to, Tulsa citizens and surrounding impacted communities; local government representatives; employees and management including, but not limited to, plant managers, district managers and postmasters of Tulsa and Oklahoma City USPS facilities; and neighborhood and business representatives.
- **Section 3.** Further, the City of Tulsa encourages USPS to take a comprehensive approach to restructuring that does not rely disproportionately on degraded services to Tulsa and surrounding rural areas.
- **Section 4.** Further, that the City of Tulsa urges the Oklahoma Federal Congressional Delegation to actively engage on this issue and ensure any decisions related to Tulsa facility operations are in the best interest of the health and economic welfare of the Tulsa community.
- **Section 5.** That an emergency is now declared to exist for the preservation of the public peace, health, and safety and for this reason this resolution shall take effect immediately from and after its adoption by the Council and approval by the Mayor.
