State Superintendent Ryan Walters says this is to ensure teachers align with Oklahoma’s commitment to what he calls an America first education.

School structure issues

Tulsa county commissioners table vote on data center near Owasso

Most residents were concerned about the negative impact it could have on their health and their land. On the reverse side the facility is expected to bring in 300 high paying technical jobs to the area. Councilors agreed to table the decision so they could research the topic more extensively.

City of Owasso building new library with build in apartments to address housing issues

City of Collinsville approves zoning changes

State takes over Okemah Police Dept

The change was set to start in November, but the AG says the plan is against the law and OHP needs to figure out another way to better serve the rural communities without leaving the most populated areas of the state without any coverage other than city police departments.

During an early morning raid of a homeless camp, an OHP trooper shot a dog belonging to a 22-year-old homeless man.

The justice center is also now more focused on reformation of the children who enter its doors through partnerships with other organizations.

Officer shoots suspect outside Broken Arrow hotel

Prosecutors also showed the judge video of the alleged incident after which she determined the state had enough evidence to move forward with a trial.

30x30 initiative
