# Leadership Fremont

Leadership Fremont, presented by First State Bank and Trust, is a nine-month series of leadership development activities and community awareness sessions designed to enhance business men and women's

knowledge and to develop emerging leaders in Fremont. Participants in the program include executives, professionals, government offi-

cials, entrepreneurs, educators, clergy, community organizers and directors of nonprofit organizations.

In addition to community service projects, tours, and topical speakers, the Fremont Chamber has partnered with Dale Carnegie Training whose curriculum emphasizes practical principles and processes that offer people the knowledge, skills and practices needed to add value to the business.

The series is limited to no more than 30 participants in each class. Applications for Leadership Fremont are accepted in August for sessions held once a month September through May. Tuition for Leadership Fremont is \$595 per participant for Chamber members, \$495 for qualifying non-profit organizations, and \$695 per participant for non-Chamber members. Tuition is frequently paid by the participants' employer or sponsoring organization.

# Youth leadership academy

Youth Leadership Academy (YLA), sponsored by Fremont Tribune, is a program that will inspire and train the next generation of community leaders. YLA is a made up of high school juniors and is facilitated by a collaboration of Leadership Fremont Alumni and professionals from all areas of the community.



Over the course of nine months, students of YLA will participate in monthly sessions to learn about various aspects of the community. In addition to encouraging community

involvement; YLA will also instill the importance of education and promote the idea of returning to our community after college to settle here, gain employment or open a business here, and volunteer here. Students will gain a better understanding of the city by meeting monthly with Mayor Scott Getzschman to discuss the city's future and participate in a mock city council session.

In order to fully explore their leadership skills and traits, students will work through a curriculum developed by Dale Carnegie Training. It is designed to tap into the leadership potential of high school students.

The series is limited to students who participate in the application and interview process and is not based on student's grade point average. Applications for the 2018-2019 session will be accepted in late March with interviews being conducted in May for sessions held once a month September through May. Tuition for YLA is \$295 per student.

Tuition is frequently paid for by students, their parents, a student's employer or their parents' employer.
