donations – an increase of 53 percent over 2015 and providing a one-and-onehalf-day blood supply for all 64 Arizona hospitals depending upon United Blood Services.

# I have the best job in the world

My name is Veronique Cruikshank (AKA "V"). I'm the business manager for Fighter Country Partnership (FCP). I have the best job in the world. I get to be a part of the amazing organization whose mission is to "Support the men, women, families and mission of Luke AFB."

This job is so much more than a paycheck. As a matter of fact, it's a second paycheck. I'm a retired veteran. I retired from Luke Air Force Base as an Air Force Captain in 2011. In all of my 22 years in the Air Force, I've never seen a community organization that does so much for the Airman as FCP.

I joined the Air Force in 1988, straight out of high school. I wasn't "ready" for college and

really didn't know what I wanted to do with my life. I entered the Air Force as an Airman Basic. I was a "slick sleeve," which is the lowest-ranking Airman in the Air Force. I literally grew up in the Air Force and have called military installations around the world my home. The Air Force was also much more than a paycheck and my coworkers were more than fellow Airmen. They were and still are my family. My supervisors and commanding officers were mentors, but also parental in nature. They built me up and challenged me to give my all and supported and encouraged my efforts to reach my goals and succeed.

I entered the military as a Food Service Specialist (a cook). My

career field continued to merge with other career fields and allowed me to have many diverse jobs. I worked as a billeting (base hotel) desk clerk, ran a flight line kitchen (fast food operation), helped run a fitness center (gym) and ran the Honor Guard Program. I also had the opportunity to deploy overseas and provide morale and welfare programs to other deployed Airmen.

I progressed to the rank of Technical Sergeant (TSgt/E-6) in nine years and was considered a "fast burner." I was a single parent and promotions equaled better pay and benefits for my daughter, Alexis.

I had some amazing leaders who encouraged me to pursue a college degree. I went to night school and took lunch-time classes while working full time and raising my beautiful daughter. Toward the end of earning my bachelor's degree in human resources, a friend nudged me to apply for officer training. A bachelor's degree is a requirement to be an Air Force officer. Upon graduation, I applied for and was accepted into the Air Force Officer Training School

(OTS). I went to 12 weeks of officer "boot camp" and graduated as a 2nd Lieutenant.

As a personnel officer, I worked directly for the Unit Commander. I was now the parental leader and mentored numerous Airmen. This included encouraging a few Airmen to go to college and become officers. I also met my husband, Kevin, who was an F-16 fighter pilot. He adopted my daughter and we later had our son, Jacob.

The Air Force helped me to follow my dreams. I had an awesome military career and am proud to be a veteran of our amazing country. What I didn't have was a community organization like FCP.

FCP hosts or partners in supporting the Dorm Dweller Holiday Party,

the Finance Expo, the Health and Wellness Expo, March of the Fallen, Luke Youth Center Summer Programs, Luke Library Programs, Operation Shower, Luke Back to School Bash, deployed family dinners and events, Operation Warm Heart, and Patty Larlham Camps for children with disabilities. And these are just a few of the programs and events FCP supports.



# **AETC and Luke AFB have long history**

The Air Education and Training Command is vital in its mission to recruit, educate, and train today's Airmen to keep its Air Force mission ready.

Luke Air Force Base in Arizona has been a part of the Air Training Command and AETC for approximately half of its lifetime and has been the largest fighter wing in the United States Air Force since 1989. While typical wings have three squadrons, Luke has always had four or more.

"Even during World War II, Luke was the largest training base," said Richard Griset, 56th Fighter Wing historian. "The training mission is a great mission and we've done it for a long time. Since the very beginning, we have taken our pilots and trained them to fly our fighter aircraft."

During World War II, Luke Field produced 17,321 graduates from fighter training programs for the U.S. and its allies.

The base was initially equipped with F-51 Mustang and F-84 Thunderjet aircraft. In 1957, Luke joined the supersonic age when the North American F-100 Super Sabre was assigned to the base. That was followed in 1964 by foreign military sales programs,

Luke's first international training partnerships, in the F-104 Starfighter and the F-5A Freedom Fighter.

The A-7D Corsair arrived in 1969, but was reassigned when the U.S. Air Force decided to make Luke the Air Force's primary F-4 Phantom II training base. The F-4 was used extensively throughout the Vietnam War due to its ground-attack and aerial roles. The first F-4 was assigned in 1971.

The first of the super fighters, the F-15 Eagle, was assigned to the base in 1974, followed in 1982 by the second super fighter, the F-16 Fighting Falcon. Then the F-15E Strike Eagle arrived in 1988. The 56th Training Wing was re-designated a fighter wing Oct. 1, 1991, making Luke the service's primary F-16 training base. In 1991, the F-15 was reassigned, and four years later, the F-15E was reassigned.

On March 10, 2014, the first F-35A landed at



The cornerstone of success for the Luke blood program has been the development of individual committees comprised of primary and secondary contacts within each squadron. The group that had the most successful drives during the year earned the coveted "Top Squadron" title.

"We are proud and grateful to 1Lt. Caro, TSgt. Sawn and the squadrons for their devotion," said Sid Lewis. "They are heroes to both our country and to Arizona patients."

Luke Air Force Base blood donors help teens like Jaziel Olmeda of Phoenix, who shared his story with honored guests at Valentines for Life last month. Jaziel survived leukemia three times with the help of 135 transfusions. He was just 7 years old when he was first diagnosed.

"My childhood was interrupted by cancer," reflected Jaziel. "Having had cancer for six long, extremely emotional years, I can say I always knew I wasn't alone, thanks to my generous blood donors."

Grateful for the blood donors who helped save his life, Jaziel has dreams of becoming

# Annual Tuskegee Airmen commemoration features The Rise Above exhibit

Following the successful annual Tuskegee Airmen commemoration in March 2016, the Archer-Ragsdale Arizona Chapter, TAI (ARAC) expanded the 2017 program with greater emphasis on youth activities. The events began as early as January and concluded March 9 to 14, with eight youth and chaperones traveling on a field trip to Washington, D.C. The activities included ARAC visitations and/or presentations at the West Valley Christian School, Goodyear; El Dorado High School, Chandler; 56th Medical Group Commander's Call, Luke AFB; United Technology Company, Phoenix,; and Buckeye Air Fair, Buckeye.

Another major youth activity was The Rise Above traveling exhibit at three schools in the Phoenix area. The exhibit featured two legendary Tuskegee Airmen, Col. (ret) Charles McGee of Bethesda, Md., and local Airmen Lt. Col. (ret) Robert Ashby of Sun City West.

The exhibit highlights the courage and determination of the Tuskegee Airmen, who overcame obstacles to train and fight as U.S. Army Air Corps pilots, and what it means to us 75 years later. It also features the original film, "Rise Above," on a 160degree panoramic screen in a 30-seat movie theater. The three schools included Stapley

Following the successful annual Tuskegee Jr High, Mesa, AZ; Luke Elementary, Glendale, AZ; and Trivium Preparatory Academy, Goodyear, AZ. The Rise Above traveling exhibit was sponsored by the ARAC and led by Southwest Airline captain (ret) Larry Jackson, Director of ARAC youth Activities.

Other ARAC members continued to further the legacy of the Tuskegee Airmen by serving as "Ambassadors of Goodwill" and as speakers at major events in the Phoenix area. These included the Scottsdale 2017 Martin Luther King Jr. Dinner Celebration; the City of Surprise Inaugural Martin Luther King Jr. Day of Celebration and Service; and the USAF Air War College Regional Cultural Studies Program hosted by the office of the governor of Arizona. The latter event included 55 senior officers from Europe, the Middle East, and Africa. These men and women were presented with an ARAC perspective on the Tuskegee Airmen living in Arizona, US military history and legacy, and race relations in Arizona and the USA.

The 2017 commemoration culminated the fourth Thursday, March 23, with the annual wreath-laying ceremony at Tuskegee Airpark. It was followed by a luncheon at the 56 Club, Luke Air Force Base.





# AF NCO dedicates four more years of service, re-enlists in deployed fashion

Her Air Force calling started like many others who came before – speaking with a recruiter near her hometown in Washington. It was 2009 and she was with her mother who had pulled her out of school under the disguise of having a day to spend time together; their first stop was the AF recruiter's office.

Before Staff Sgt. Rebecca Rains knew it she found herself in the delayed entry program patiently waiting on her job to come open before departing for Basic Military Training. Her AF career has been anything but status quo since.

"I waited nine months for my slot to come open and I went off [in February 2010]," Rains said in a coffee shop near her deployed office. "Every experience I've had in the AF has been awesome and, for the most part, it's the best decision I've ever made. I got to fly in an F-16 during my first enlistment which was the second coolest thing I've ever done."

Fast-forward seven years and her energy and ambition as an Airman are stronger than ever while serving at an undisclosed location here in the region. Recently Rains was afforded the opportunity to take the oath of enlistment in a unique way – in a KC-10 Extender, 30,000 feet over Syria and during an air refueling of an F-22 Raptor pilot.

The pilot, Lt. Col. August Pfluger, administered the oath and is the 380th Expeditionary Operations Support Sq. commander – Rains' deployed unit.

"This was the coolest thing I've done (since joining)," Rains said. "So, I get on the headset and I'm talking to him and he shared with me

some background about his mission prior to coming up for fuel. He then said, 'You ready to do this?' and I said, 'Yep, let's go.' He started the oath and I was kind of nervous, so he had to repeat the first part; but from there on out, it was smooth and I was able to thank him. Everything just lined up perfectly and the fact that he was able to do this was more meaningful to me."

Pfluger administered the oath just 11 minutes after completing his tasking there in Syria.

"SSgt Rains and her team had actually helped make the mission a success and participated in the development of this mission," he said. "She's an absolute superstar in a field of really talented people."

The refueling flight was nearly eight hours and the re-enlistment was at the very end of the mission, before the crew turned the tanker back towards its deployed home. According to Rains, she knew she wanted to re-enlist in a KC-10, but she never expected for things to fall in place the way they did.

"I really like the Air Force and I'm very passionate about my job," she said. "People are motivated in different ways and being out here supporting real-world operations and


seeing the impact that my job provides for the AOR internally motivates me. I feel lucky to have had this opportunity."

Rains intends to use her next enlistment to work toward completing her undergraduate education and earning a commission.

# U.S.S. Arizona memorialized at Glendale main library branch

On the lawn at the Glendale Main Library at 59th Avenue and West Brown Street stands a bronze-colored obelisk, surrounded by five welded steel trees, which pay tribute to military veterans. A mermaid, flanked by saguaro cacti, adorns one side of the obelisk. On another are scraps of jagged metal and series of steel rings. And on a third is an inscription, "On Sunday, December 7, 1941, the first wave of Japanese military aircraft attacked Pearl Harbor at 7:55am...."

The installation is a memorial to the U.S.S. Arizona and its fate as the infamous enemy

ambush catapulted the United States into World War II. The mermaid represents a silver tea service presented to the ship's captain by the State of Arizona in 1916. The shards of metal had once formed a potato locker in the ship's galley. The steel rings were taken from the flagpole on a memorial erected over the ship's wreckage at Pearl Harbor.

One hundred years after it steamed out of the Navy shipyard in Brooklyn, N.Y. and 75 years after Japanese bombers blew it apart, the U.S.S. Arizona lives on in the state that gave it its name.

### Female pilot follows in mother's boot steps

With childlike wonder, she watched as her mother pulled on a pair of combat boots. She witnessed her mother forge forward, knocking down walls that once stood to stall female progression. In the wake of that advancement, there was a maneuverable route the young girl could use to reach her own future goals.

Capt. Jamie LaRivee, a 21st Airlift Squadron C-17 Globemaster III pilot, saw her mother as a role model, and watched her excel in an Air Force career, making LaRivee certain she would follow in her mother's boot steps.

"She was in the first class of women at the Air Force Academy," LaRivee said. "That was a big piece of her life that shaped her completely, but it was also a big piece of my life, too."

After LaRivee graduated high school, she mirrored her mother and attended the Air Force Academy, where she majored in operations research and minored in German. progressed socially the views of 1976. "My mother and barriers," LaRivee were not as many y

"There are still biases out there, and sometimes there are people who make assumptions," LaRivee said. "They're not so sure you can be as qualified as a male pilot, but that just makes you want to work even harder to show you're just as capable."

"In aviation, it doesn't matter if you're male or female- you're a flyer," said Barbara Brewer, the 21st AS unit program coordinator. "Your gender doesn't change that ability."

The world of 2017 has progressed socially far beyond the views of 1976.

person's confidence in their own ability. While flying a mission, LaRivee was part of a predominately female crew. She remembers a passenger looked inside the flight deck and was shocked that he had been unable to tell the difference in women flying the aircraft rather than men. This comment did not bring LaRivee to question her capacity as a woman, but rather solidified her confidence in her skill.

"If you face challenges, don't let them get you down, let them inspire you to do better," LaRivee said. "There are so many women in aviation who have done amazing things, and there have always been people who doubted them."

In a 1996 speech made by LaRivee's mother, the message of femininity in the military rang out.

"One of the biggest challenges of being a woman in the military has and will continue to be balancing strength with sensitivity, confidence with humility,"

Her mother was a rarity as a female cadet in 1976. Similarly, today, LaRivee's career field is manned with just over 5 percent women.

"Not every little girl grows up dreaming to be a pilot," LaRivee said. "It's not a common perception for women to be in flying in general, let alone for women to be in the military."

While at the academy, she had an opportunity to fly gliders. She recalled how she felt in control of her own exhilarating roller coaster ride. After that, she was committed to make it as an aviator. "My mother faced a lot more challenges and a lot more barriers," LaRivee said. "There were not as many women who had gone before her to pave the way to prove that women were just as capable as men, if they worked hard at it."

LaRivee views her gender as a proud part of her identity. She is aware of the obstacles that being a female military member presents, and accepts them as an opportunity to excel beyond expectations.

"You can't pretend that we are built the exact same way as men. But, there are so many ways that we can, if not overcome it, become better," LaRivee said.

Trials arise throughout a military career that tests a


said retired Lt. Col. Marianne LaRivee, in a speech for the Senior Executives Symposium Spouses Program. "We want to show that we can do our jobs well, while also staying true to ourselves as women - daughters, sisters and mothers. That we can do what our country asks of us, while also living up to the cultural expectations and responsibilities of our gender."

The Air Force perseveres in its commitment for a brighter, more diverse future.

"We've made a lot of progress in the last 40 years," LaRivee said. "The social norms have improved so much in our favor as women in the military."



# GCC to dedicate new veteran services center March 24

Although Chuck Pierce has retired as its director, the Glendale Community College Veteran Services Center is still operating on the college campus. In fact, veterans now have a new service center on campus that was dedicated March 24.

GCC is ranked eighth in the nation among veteran-friendly twoyear colleges. The GCC veteran services center bills itself as a "onestop" service for veterans who want to pursue education.

Named a Veteran Supportive Campus by the Veterans Administration, the veteran services center can help veterans transition from military life to the academic environment, get academic support and move into a civilian career.

GCC Interim President Teresa Leyba Ruiz,

Development Director Frances Mateo, who has been with the college 27 years, and Interim Vice President of Student Affairs Monica Castaneda gave a tour of the new center last week as a preview of the grand opening.

Castaneda said there

are more than 800 veterans enrolled in the center. They bring their families with them when they enroll, and the new center is a major improvement over the small building that has delivered services since 2010, and there was one staff member. Leyba Ruiz said the center serves veterans from all conflicts, "and their family members as well."

Veterans can transfer their education benefits to relatives. Leyba Ruiz recalled one veteran who transferred his benefits to his daughter. "It was a beautiful expression of a father's love for his daughter," she said.

The demand has far outgrown the facility, and Leyba Ruiz said, "We had to find an alternative, an option. So, we scraped together the capital resources and invested. The decision to expand was the right decision."

An additional fact that makes the investment worth it – GCC's veteran students are 58 percent more likely to graduate in three years, compared to GCC's overall student body, Castaneda said.

Advisors at the center are veterans themselves. They can help plan an academic path, identify federal and state benefit options, and connect with veteran services on campus and in the surrounding community.





# **Glendale Municipal Landfill serves city and Luke AFB**

In 2013, Glendale City Council was advised by the city's Department of Public Works staff that operations at the Glendale Municipal Landfill "South Area" were approaching capacity and a projected Year 2017 closure of the southern portion of the landfill was eminent.

Glendale city leaders moved forward and approved a plan that called for the seamless transitioning of all landfill operations from the near-capacity south area to the landfill's north area, without impacting service levels to landfill customers.

The transition plan also involved the removal of the original administration building, heavy equipment maintenance canopy and outdated scale house, all of which had exceeded their useful life and the construction of new and updated facilities in the northwestern section of Glendale's landfill.

The \$4.6 million Municipal Landfill Facili-

ties Improvement Project broke ground in February 2015 and was completed in January 2017. The project consisted of the design and construction of a new administration building, a high-tech scale house and an equipment maintenance building.

Additional site improvements included relocation of the existing 69 kV APS power lines, construction of a new main entrance roadway, the installation of new roadway approaches to the new scale house, roadway drainage enhancements, a new public drop-off area for recyclable materials, new directional signagem and the installation of additional access road lighting.

In September 2016, Glendale entered into an intergovernmental agreement with Luke Air Force Base to collect refuse and recyclable materials. Those materials are taken to the Glendale landfill. This has an approximate value to the city of \$184,000. Additionally, the recyclable materials from Luke Air Force Base will go to the Materials Recovery Facility, which is an added value to the city. If Glendale did not have its landfill, the city would have to pay more than \$2 million in fees to haul and dump trash and waste materials to a different location.

### Phase I: Administration building

The 4,368-square-foot administration building provides larger, updated staff workplace and offices, including ADA accommodations. New features include large restrooms with locker storage and showers, a training and break room, and a conference room equipped with a large screen monitor, Wi-Fi and video conferencing capability.

### Phase II: Scale house

The new 784-squarefoot scale house facility features two inbound and two out bound scales, including one equipped with high-tech attend-free wireless weighting software system and two out-bound scales (one bi-directional scale and one multi-axle vehicle scale) with driveup service windows, a digital scale system, traffic lights and automatic gates to accommodate large volumes of customers.

### Phase III: Equipment maintenance building

The new 5,249-squarefoot covered and enclosed maintenance facility was specially designed to accommodate CAT Compactors and track vehicles and features two heavy-duty





equipment work bays with steel-plated approaches and four overhead retractable entry/exit doors, an exterior wash-down area, large tool and storage areas, and overhead crane for large heavy equipment maintenance and external recycled fluids storage/extraction area.

# **Finances done the smart way**

Everyone wants to be financially sound, but that doesn't just happen. The choices and priorities you make help determine your financial success. Being financially fit means you have control of your money instead of it controlling you, which makes your financial goals achievable.

### Create a spending plan

# WINGS: Flying tribute, From 30

The Wings of Freedom Tour is one of the most extraordinary and unique interactive traveling historical displays of its kind.

The Wings of Freedom Tour travels the nation as a flying tribute to the flight crews who flew them, the ground crews who maintained them; the workers who built them, the soldiers, sailors and airmen they helped protect; and the citizens and families that share the freedom they helped preserve.

The B-17, B-25 & B-24 were the backbone of the American effort during the war from 1942 to 1945 and were famous for their ability to sustain damage and still accomplish the mission. Despite the risks of anti-aircraft fire, attacking enemy fighters, and the harrowing environment of sub-zero temperatures, many B-17s, B-25s and B-24s safely brought their crews home. The P-51 Mustang was affectionately known as the bombers' "Little Friend" - saving countless crews from attacking axis fighters. After the war, many aircraft were scrapped for their raw aluminum to rebuild a nation in post-war prosperity and, therefore, very few were spared.

The rarity of the B-17, B-25, B-24 and P-51, and their importance to telling the story of WWII, is why the Collings Foundation continues to fly and display the aircraft nationwide. At each location, local veterans and their families are encouraged to visit and share their experiences and stories with the public. For aviation enthusiasts, the tour provides an opportunity for the museum to come to the visitor and not the other way around.
