"When I first drove onto the base, I noticed the wall and how blank it was," said Staff Sgt. Brandon Garza, 56th Logistics Readiness Squadron logistics planner. "That's when I knew something had to be done."

After seeking approval from leadership, Garza came up with a concept design for a mural. Garza then recruited three other airmen he knew were avid painters: Airman 1st Class John Lindeman and Senior Airman Bridgette Thompson, 56th Logistics Readiness Squadron vehicle maintenance journeymen; Airman 1st Class Sarah Wisler, 56th Communications Squadron, network


operations technician.

"There is a lot of heritage at this base that I feel wasn't as broadly represented until now," Garza said. "With this mural, I wanted to pay a tribute to all of the ones that have come before us as well as the aircraft that have been flown here. In the painting, we silhouetted all of the old warfighters and added color on our current fighter aircraft representing the progression of airpower here at Luke."

Each airman was proficient in a different style of painting. Garza has experience in graffiti art, while Lindeman is used to painting landscapes. Thompson enjoys painting portraits and for Wisler, fine art.

expertise, it was really cool to see everyone's style blend together to complete this project," Garza said.

Throughout the project, the team members would evaluate their own work to ensure they were all on the same track.

"Communication played a big part," Lindeman said. "Throughout the process, we had to provide honest feedback to one another to discuss what we liked and disliked about our work."

Garza and the team hopes the mural will not only become a major landmark for the base but also provide visitors with a great location for a photo opportunity.

"We want this to be something people can remember when they come to Luke Air Force Base," Garza said.

In the future, Garza plans to start an art club on base for aspiring artists to share and grow their passion in painting.

In 2017, airmen and their families assigned to Air Education and Training Command received more than \$200,000 in Air Force Assistance Fund.



425th Fighter Squadron celebrates 25 years

The 425th Fighter Squadron celebrated 25 years of United States Air Force and Republic of Singapore Air Force partnership May 22 with a parade ceremony.

Peace Carvin II, the name given to the joint-training environment between the Republic of Singapore and the U.S., is the longest operating overseas detachment for the RSAF. Since 1992, the 425th Fighter Squadron has flown the F-16C and F-16D Fighting Falcon with a mission to provide advanced weapons and tactics training to RSAF pilots and maintenance airmen.

During the parade ceremony, the guest of honor, Maj. Gen. Mervyn Tan Wei Ming, Republic of Singapore Chief of Air Force, spoke. He thanked the 56th Fighter Wing for its continued support and partnership.

"Through the years, each generation of RSAF aircrew and air force engineer that have come through the doors of the detachment has worked in conjunction with their United States Air Force counterparts to ensure that PC II continues to operate at a high level of readiness," said Lt. Brandon Sim, RSAF officer in charge of publicity. "PC II, more fondly known as the Black Widows, has enhanced its operations by adopting the best practices from both air forces – achieving the best of both worlds."

After a visual inspection of a flight of 425th Fighter Squadron airmen, Ming unveiled a new 25th anniversary, commemorative F-16 tail flash painted by the 56th Equipment Maintenance Squadron corrosion control.



F-35 Lightning II touches down for the 1st time in South America



Two F-35 Lightning IIs assigned to the 56th Fighter Wing landed in South America for the 2018 Feria Internacional del Aire y del Espacio, marking the first time the F-35 has been to South America.

The lead aircraft was piloted by Capt. Andrew Olson, F-35 Heritage Flight Team commander and pilot.

The aircraft arrived in Santiago, Chile, March 30 and was on public display at the FIDAE air show April 3 through 8.

Bringing the F-35 to FIDAE helped meet training needs for the aircrews and mainte-

nance personnel for various operations, including long-range flights, air-to-air refueling, as well as provide an opportunity to

strengthen military-tomilitary relationships with regional partners. The two F-35s at FIDAE were part of the F-35 Heritage

Flight Team.

The Lightning II qualified to take part in the Air Combat Command Air Force Heritage Flight program in 2016. The team includes one pilot and 12 maintainers, all selected from Luke Air Force Base.

The F-35 Heritage Flight Team is scheduled to take part in 13 air shows for the 2018 season.

The F-35 combines fifth-generation fighter aircraft characteristics — advanced stealth, integrated avionics, sensor fusion and superior logistics support — with the most powerful and comprehensive integrated sensor package of any fighter aircraft in history.





Honorary commander, Blue Blazer earns call sign 'Popper'



Operating from sea aboard aircraft carriers, the Super Hornet gives the Navy the power to protect America's interests anywhere, at any time. The versatile jet has the ability to destroy targets located hundreds of miles inland,

without the need to get another country's permission to operate within its borders.

"Strike Fighter Wing, U. S. Pacific Fleet, based at Naval Air Station Lemoore, Calif., is the heart of Naval Aviation," said Capt. James S. Bates, Deputy Commodore, Strike Fighter Wing, U.S. Pacific. "The sailors assigned to SFWP always exceed expectations and produce amazing results through team work and dedication to their department, squadron, the U.S. Navy and their family. Naval Aviation is a chal-

lenging occupation, but our sailors work day in and day out to provide fully mission capable aircraft and fully qualified aircrew to ensure leadership is able to answer national level tasking. I am humbled to be able to lead the sailors of SFWP and I am proud to call Lemoore my home."

Kennell has military ties with family members who serve and is honored to carry on the family tradition.

"My brother is in the Marines," Kennell said. "I always thought about joining the military."

Kennell is also proud of his contribution to the command.

"I like working on the aircraft," Kennell said. "I think they are very cool."

As a member of one of the U.S. Navy's most relied-upon assets, Kennell and other sailors know they are part of a legacy that will last beyond their lifetimes providing the Navy the nation needs.



Gold Star mom tells why we should remember

Darryl Walker, U.S. Air Force Maj. (ret.), a C-130 navigator during his career, was a special guest speaker at the May 28 Memorial Day service at West Resthaven Park and Cemetery. He acknowledged all branches of the service, his wife and family, mother and father, his brother and other members of his family, including nieces and nephews and friends.

Walker quoted President Ronald Reagan about there being certain sadness when it comes to the death of a serviceman. He said we usually see servicemen as old men with gray hair, "but they were boys. They gave up everything for us and all we can do is remember. There's something about remembering — flying a flag, attending a parade, wearing a poppy."

Then, Walker said, "Army Specialist A. J. Walker, 23, Sept. 18,

2007, was killed in Iraq. We reminisce about football, youth camps, playing the drums, his big heart and his zest for Jesus. But some days, we hear a new story about A.J."

Walker said he got a call two days before Memorial Day from "Jonathan," a man who served with A.J., who told him he was thinking about A.J. Jonathan also wanted to tell Walker another story and let him know he was "just calling to remember."

Walker said A.J.'s captain called two years ago, "to let us know he had named his newborn son after A.J. There's power in the sword; it protects us and keeps veterans in our thoughts and our minds."

Walker and his wife, Annie, have two other children, Alice and Andy, who were present at the Memorial Day ceremony.

But that day, Walker gave part of his speaking time to Annie, so she could tell the story of their late son's life.

"As Darryl said, Memorial Day, I want to remember my soldier," Annie said. "A.J. grew up like many military service kids: Every payday at the commissary and every summer waiting until 1300 for the pool to open."

In 1995, when A.J. was 8 years old, Annie said the only communication was a land line phone. There was a certain time on a certain day when the family could talk to their deployed serviceman. No Skype. No Facebook. No Twitter. By the time A.J. was 10, his father was gone on another extended tour.

One of those days came the words from A.J., "I hate the Air Force," Annie said. "I remember that night very clearly. He wanted to know where his dad was and why he was gone so much. I sat him down and explained America wanted the world to know the freedom we enjoy and heroes have to go where heroes are needed.

"At 21, A.J. approached his dad and said, 'You've done your part; now it's time for me to do mine."

Annie then began to read excerpts from A.J.'s letters regarding his passion for what he was doing — "answering the call" and saying, "Evil will not prevail, not while I stand and my brothers stand."

She repeated: Sept. 18, 2007, Bagdad, Iraq.

She said, "I'm so grateful to share with you about my soldier. We have known the memories of our heroes and we need to share those memories."

Following Annie Walker was someone who appreciated the sharing of memories: Mike Pearson, a third-generation combat veteran. He gave a history of Memorial Day, told the group at the ceremony about the 25 American military cemeteries on foreign soil. But he also told those in attendance to "remember the dead by serving the living."







The event was hosted by the Glendale Office of the Mayor and the Glendale Chamber of Commerce Military & Veterans Affairs Committee.

The ceremony began with remarks from Master of Ceremonies Jeffery J. Turner, Glendale Chamber of Commerce Military & Veterans Affairs Committee chairman, followed by the posting of the colors by the Civil Air Patrol, 388th Composite Squadron.

Sounds of the Southwest Singers Community Choir sang the national anthem, an invocation was given by the Rev. Mark Martin of Calvary Church, and the choir then sang "America the Beautiful."

Opening remarks were delivered by Glendale Mayor Jerry Weiers, who told the recruits, "Today, you are doing the right thing. Your community appreciates you and we have your back."

Next, a video was played of Chief Master Sgt. Randy Kwiatkowski, command chief of the 56th Fighter Wing at Luke Air Force Base, performing the song "Heroes" written by Mike Munsterman of Renegade Rail.

Certificates and challenge coins were handed out, starting with Army recruits, who outnumbered the other three branches of recruits nearly two to one.

Weiers explained that challenge coins date back to World War I and that a commander or someone up the command chain would present one to recognize a special achievement. He said it could be for courage or for showing leadership, honesty or anything that recognizes the recipient as exceptional.

"Often times, you can't give someone an increase in pay, or a promotion in rank, so the challenge coin is a very special recognition for something extraordinary," he said. "The most important stamp on the coin is where it says: 'The First To Say Thank You."

Lt. Col. David Clukey, U.S. Army Phoenix Recruiting Battalion commander, said, "Events like this are crucial," adding that 70 percent of high schoolers don't qualify for military service, with obesity accounting for the majority of disqualifications.

He listed five charac-

teristics of veterans, the first being, "Veterans can learn anything on the fly," he said.

No. 2 is punctuality, he said, adding, "If you're not 15 minutes early, you're late."

No. 3: courtesy to superiors.

"Nobody knows chain of command like a veteran," he said.

No. 4 is loyalty and No. 5 is work ethic, he said, explaining that a veteran will shoulder more than his task.

Maj. Scott Stewart, commanding officer, Marine Corps Recruiting Station Phoenix, spoke before Marine recruits were given their certificates and challenge coins.

He applauded the recruits for volunteering "when volunteering isn't the most popular thing to do," he said, adding, "I'm proud of all of you."

Chief Master Sgt. Ronnie Woods of the 56th Fighter Wing at Luke took the podium before the Air Force recruits were acknowledged.

He said joining the military isn't an easy decision to make, but the support the recruits have been shown by their family, friends and the community has made the decision easier.
