Luke AFB temporarily cancels F-35 local flying ops

Five physiological incidents reported

June 9, the following press release was sent to media outlets, letting the public know about the cancellation of F-35 flights at Luke Air Force Base.

The 56th Fighter Wing at Luke cancelled local flying operations for F-35A Lightning II aircraft due to a series of five incidents in which pilots have experienced hypoxia-like symptoms.

According to base officials, since May 2, five F-35A pilots assigned to Luke Air Force Base have reported physiological incidents while flying. In each case, the aircraft's backup oxygen system operated as designed and the pilot followed the correct procedures, landing the aircraft safely.

"In order to synchronize operations and maintenance efforts toward safe flying operations we have cancelled local F-35A flying. The Air Force takes these physiological incidents seriously, and our focus is on the safety and well-being of our pilots," said Brig. Gen. Brook Leonard, 56th Fighter Wing commander. "We are taking the necessary steps to find the root cause of these incidents."

June 12, Luke officials updated their information with the following release:

"The 56th Fighter Wing will continue their pause in local F-35A flying to coordinate analysis and communication between pilots, maintainers, medical professionals and a team of military and industry experts. This coordination will include technical analysis of the physiological incidents to date and discussions on possible risk miti-

to flying operations. Updates will be provided as our teams work together toward safely returning to building the future of airpower through trained F-35A pilots. The safety of our Airmen is paramount and we will take as much time as necessary to ensure their safety."

Wing officials will educate

day on the situation and increase their awareness of hypoxia symptoms. Pilots will also be briefed on all the incidents that have occurred and the successful actions taken by the pilots to safely recover their aircraft. Flight medicine will brief physiological event symptoms and also the extensive measures that

collected from the incidents. Finally, the 56th Operations Group will hold an open forum to discuss any concerns pilots may have, given these recent occurrences.

Currently, the local flying operations cancellation is limited to Luke Air Force Base.

Air Force senior leaders are aware of the incidents and are providing support and resources as necessary to protect pilots. More broadly, the F-35 Joint Program Office has stood up a formal action team of engineers, maintainers and aeromedical specialists to examine the incidents to better understand the issue. These subject matter experts will share the data across the F-35 enterprise and with partner nations.

As of press time for Fighter Country Partnership's VISIONS publication, the F-35A was still





Cook takes command of the 944th Fighter Wing

The 944th Fighter Wing welcomed their new wing commander during a formal ceremony June 3.

Col. Kurt Gallegos relinquished command of the wing to Col. Bryan Cook, 944 FW vice commander.

The wing's guidon was exchanged during the ceremony as a symbolic gesture providing a tangible view of the command authority being transferred from one commander to the next.

The presiding officer was Maj. Gen. Ronald Miller, 10th Air Force commander, who opened with remarks.

"Always there," Miller said. "As the mission is changed and the wing grows, always there is important. So for all the Airmen out there why are you always here? What is your always there moment? Why are you doing what you're doing? You have a great mission and it's only going to get better as we fly fewer F-16s and fly more F-35s. We will always be there as a partner for the 56th Fighter Wing. We will always be

there as a partner in the Air Force mission."

After taking command, Cook, who has been with the 944th since January 2016, addressed the Airmen highlighting his three priorities as the new commander: readiness, Total Force Enterprise, and developing and mentoring our Airmen.

"I need you to be ready," Cook said. "Ready to deploy, ready both mentally and physically and make sure that that your families are ready."

He also talked about fostering relationships between the wing and their active duty partners, mentorship as a priority and the three focus areas he would like to improve upon.

"We need to embrace [our heritage] and create our own legacy," said Cook. "I need every Airman to be a leader both in and out of uniform... I need you to take care of your family not just at home but your Air Force family. Everybody standing next to you in uniform is part of your family."

Cook concluded by thanking Gallegos for his leadership, mentorship, and friendship throughout the years. "You showed us how we take care of Airmen, and you've been a great leader for the 944th Fighter Wing," said Cook to Gallegos. "You've also been a great mentor to me and many others here and most of all, you've been a great friend. I can't wait to get started. This is a great day and I couldn't be more proud of our Airmen in the 944th and the missions we accomplish."

Under Gallegos' command, the wing has integrated the Air Force Reserve pilot training programs for F-15E, A-10 and F-35 missions. The wing is also postured to stand up a 944th Maintenance Group and has grown by more than 1,000 personnel.

"Col. Cook you are inheriting the best wing in the Air Force," Gallegos said. "It's the largest fighter wing in the world, phenomenal airpower, unbelievable troops, unbelievable staff, I'm jealous of you. To the Airmen, I love you and I salute you."

The change of command ceremony was followed by Gallegos' retirement ceremony after having served 32 years in the U.S. Air Force.






signed to promote mutual partnerships with the local community and to promote a better understanding of the important Air Force mission. Its goal is to gain positive public opinion with influencers.






Midwestern University honors military healthcare graduates



Peetz has excelled at

I currently have over 600 small businesses that

follow the page. In addition, it helps me share information such as Luke Air Force Base prime contractors for subcontracting opportunities, how to do businesses with Luke AFB, what a government purchase card is and what we buy on this card."

Her effective team leadership propels her beyond the call of duty to accomplish the mission.

"Ms. Peetz brings everything together," Smith said. "Often contracting and the acquisition process can be daunting both for customers and contractors who want to work with the Air Force. Ms. Peetz is able to effectively communicate with both the customers and prospective contractors to ensure Airmen get the products and services they need to accomplish their mission day in and day out. 



Luke civil engineers partner to tackle B.A.S.H

Airmen from seven bases across the country partnered with Luke Air Force Base civil engineers to accomplish the annual Bird/Wildlife Air Strike Hazard mission, which began in March and is expected to be completed in June.

Known as BASH, the program exists to deter wildlife from nesting in areas where they can pose a threat to the flying mission. This year's project focused on the removal of mud, water, and vegetative growth around the perimeter of the base.

"Due to the large scale of the project, we came here to support the 56th Civil Engineer Squadron," said SSgt Darrell Osborne, 60th Civil Engineer Squadron construction and pavement journeyman. "Working as one team, we get the opportunity to train and work together with Luke on this project to make the airfields safe."

Airmen from Ellsworth,

Fairchild, Malmstrom, Travis, Schriever, Joint Base Andrews and Grand Forks air force bases traveled to Luke to assist the 56th CES with the project.

"This is a great opportunity for Airmen from civil engineer squadrons across the country to come and diversify their knowledge," said Master Sgt. Michael McMurray, 341th

Civil Engineer Squadron heavy repair superintendent. "They are involved in a project that provides them training on things they will not get to experience at their bases."

The project began with placing bird netting to prevent nesting. The next step was to spray and remove the vegetation in the culverts to deter wildlife, thus preventing birds from hunting or trying to nest.

"We are eliminating the habitats for all of the birds surrounding the airfield," McMurray said. "It's a big safety concern and we want to protect our fighters as well as the wildlife."

More than 1,000 tons of vegetation and debris has been removed during the project with a long term effort underway to complete an underground system to

convey irrigation.

"Due to the current manning and increased volume of work requests on base in the pavement and construction equipment shop, we needed help to tackle this high priority job," said Master Sgt. Junior Bablington, 56th CES superintendent of heavy repair. "These Airmen were able to assist and received an opportunity to train on heavy equipment. Really, when it comes down to it, it's Airmen helping Airmen."


Honor Flight veterans get rousing welcome home

In fact, upon discovery of one man's birthday, a round of Happy Birthday spontaneously broke out. It was a sight this reporter was privileged to be a part of.


The rails were also lined
