



High school's heirlooms

Edward Kline, a Mason City High School custodian, shows some of the trophies won by past generations of Mason City High students, trophies which have been stored for years in the school locker room area. They turned up in packing activities, as the high school prepares to move to its new building. The cups and plaques recognize sports achievements, of course, but also laud such things as a 1932 shorthand championship and a 1916 victory in a typing contest. Styles of trophies are considerably varied, from the horn-handled cup held by Kline to the hanging banner in the picture at lower right. The horn-handled trophy is for Boone Valley victories — apparently in track — in 1918, '20 and '21.
