

Kline Runs Victory String to 38; Bennett Hits Hoop

Eddie Kline, state wrestling champion for two years at 95 pounds, ran his victory string to 38 at Algona last Saturday night by pinning Marion Simpson of Algona in a minute and 13 seconds.

Kline has moved up a weight this year and is wrestling at 105. He is seeking his third straight state championship this year. Kline is a senior and is captain of the wrestling squad.

The Mohawk grapplers set an unusual record at Algona by winning their first three matches by pins. This is a feat which hasn't been accomplished for a number of years.

The Mohawks jumped to an early lead of 15 points on pins by Don Hohenfield at 95 pounds; Kline and Ronald Shelp, 112, and then went on to rack up a 26-15 win.

The next meet will be at Eagle Grove Tuesday night. The Mohawks will entertain Iowa Falls Thursday night.

In the first contest against Webster City Bennett racked up nine field goals and eight free throws to chalk up 26 points. In the game against the Ames Little Cyclones he scored six field goals and eight free throws for 20 points.

Bennett has totaled 46 points this year with 15 field goals and 16 free throws. This is more than half the total points he made last year. Bennett has bettered his total free throws with 16 this year to 15 in last season.

The Mohawks have only one game this coming week. It will be played Friday night at Cedar Falls.
