It was a season of celebration.

Four teams that call the North Shore home — St. John's Prep lacrosse, as well as the Hamilton-Wenham girls, Manchester Essex boys, and St. John's Prep tennis programs — all claimed state championships this spring.

Each of these victorious squads, naturally, had their own story to tell. The Eagles' lacrosse triumph was their fourth consecutive state crown and gave them 19 straight playoff wins dating back to 2021. Their brethren on the Prep tennis team, who were also the No. 1 seed in their bracket, went undefeated and captured the school's first championship on the hardcourts since 2001.

The Hamilton-Wenham girls team entered dynasty status after the top seeded Generals swept through the bracket for another championship victory, their third straight in Division 4. On the boys' side of the Division 4 tennis bracket, the Hornets of Manchester Essex gained a large measure of revenge by defeating their Cape Ann League rivals from Lynnfield (the top seed who had swept them during the regular season) with a 3-2 decision and capture their first crown.

But these titlists weren't the only ones who had a remarkable run through the playoffs in June. The Ipswich girls lacrosse team reached the Division 4 state title game; Salem baseball had its greatest season in 34 years by making it to the Division 4 state semifinals; so did the Swampscott boys lacrosse team after turning in its best-ever season at 20-2. The Hamilton-Wenham boys team was also a state semifinalist in Division 4, as were the Manchester Essex girls.

A brilliant spring showing capped off a terrific 2023-24 school sports year. Now, we eagerly await what will transpire in 2024-25.

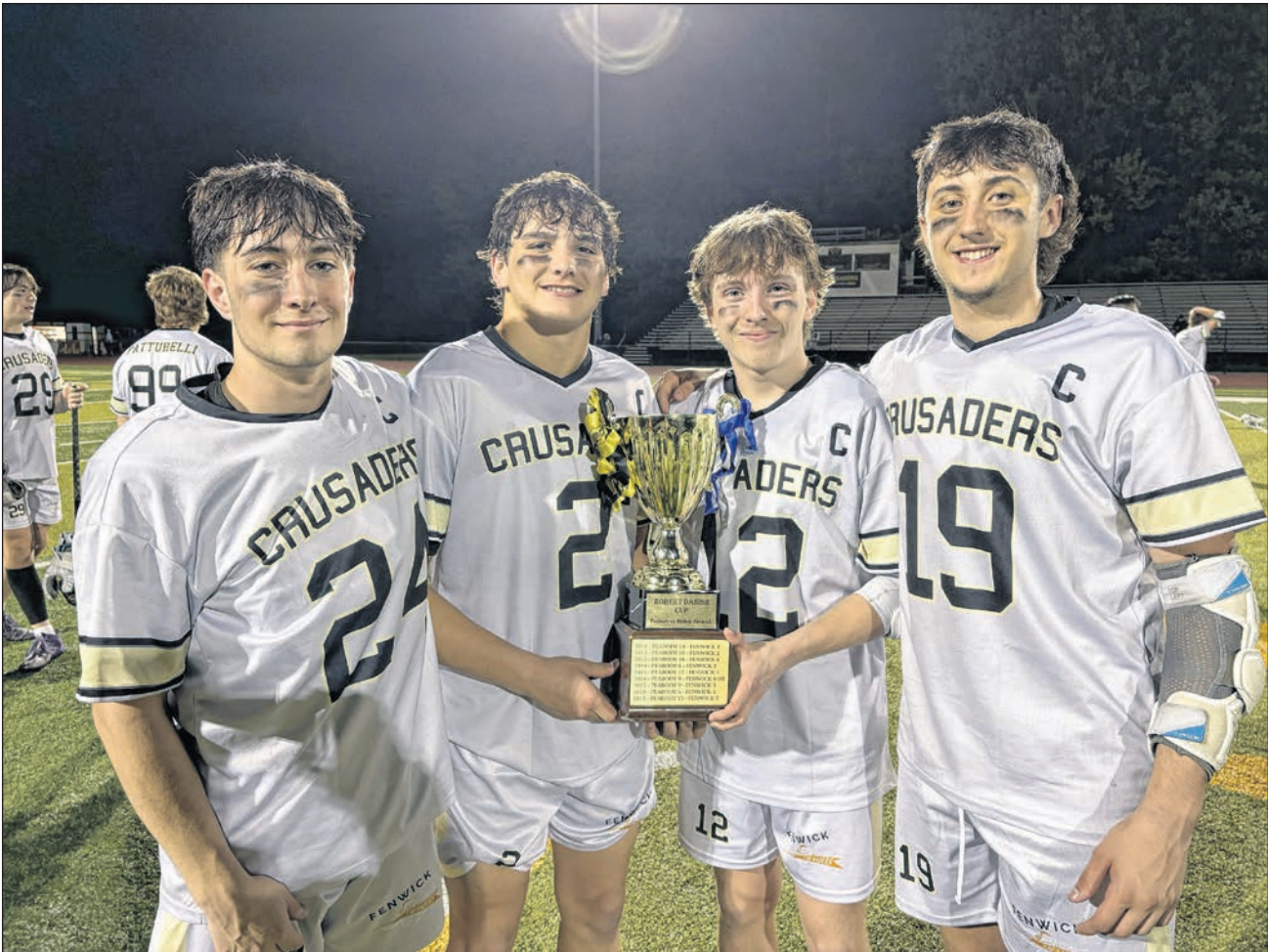

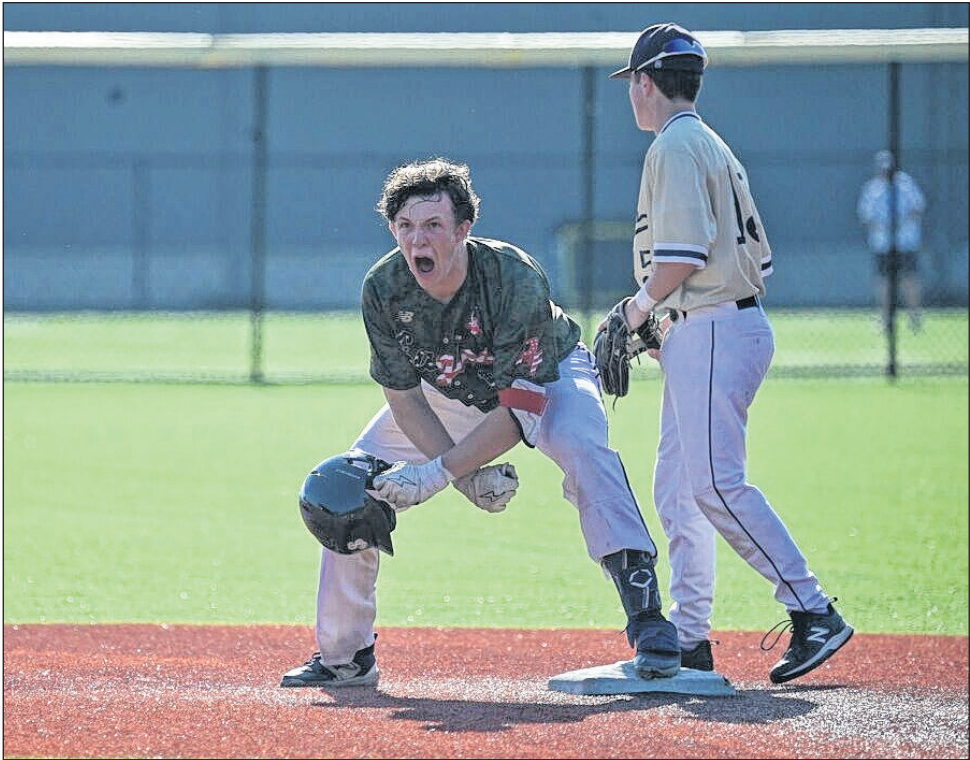

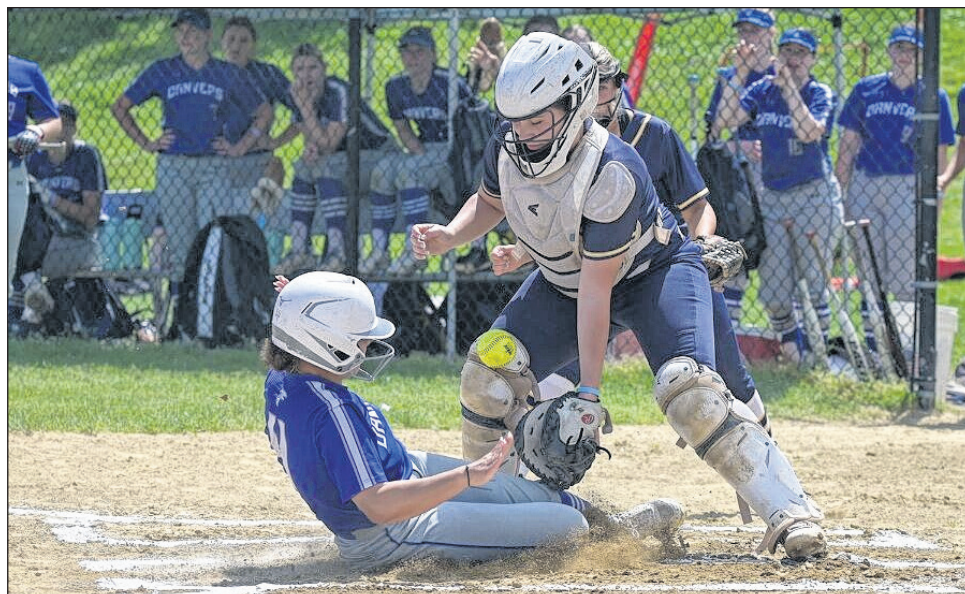
