



The Pledge of Allegiance was written by a deeply religious man, who was a strict believer in the separation of church and state. Francis Bellamy (1855-1931) a baptist

minister originally published it in The Youth's Companion on September 8, 1892. It did not include the words "the Flag of the United States of America" or the words "under God." Those word were added in 1923 and in 1954 respectively. Today the pledge reads:

I pledge allegiance to the flag of the United States of America, and to the republic for which it stands, one nation under God, indivisible, with liberty, and justice for all.
