Notice is hereby given that sealed bids will be received electronically through the City of Mount Vernon electronic procurement website for the City of Mount Vernon, Washington; the Contracting Agency for construction for the Seneca Drive Culvert Debris Removal project.

All work must be completed in accordance with the Contract Documents and the Contractor must comply with all applicable federal, state, and local laws and regulations. Work to be performed includes, but is not limited to: tree and vegetation removal, channel excavation, placement of streambed cobble materials, removal of sediment and debris from existing culvert, installation of large wood debris, temporary stream bypass and fish exclusion, temporary erosion and sediment control, streambank and riparian planting and restoration, and temporary traffic control/street detour. Contract time for completion is 30 Working Days.

As this project is funded with a federal aid grant, all prospective consultant firms must comply with federal Equal Employment Opportunity (EEO) requirements.

Bid proposals will be received at the City of Mount Vernon electronic procurement website at <https://secure.procurenw.com/portal/mountvernonwa> by 2:00 PM, Pacific Standard Time, on June 11, 2026; at which time they will be opened, read, and tabulated publicly. All Work performed on the project will be subject to State of Washington prevailing wage rates.
