Welcome

Located midpoint between Seattle and Bellingham, Stanwood is nestled in the Stillaguamish Valley, flanked by Puget Sound and the Cascade Mountain foothills. In 1865, then Centerville, a village with Scandinavian roots, consisted of a logging camp and trading post. D. O. Pearson renamed it in 1878 in honor of his wife, Clara Stanwood. Logging and farming were the area's prominent trades.


Today many of the city's residents work for the Stanwood-Camano School District, nearby aerospace manufacturers or run small businesses. Commuters can catch Interstate 5 about 5 miles east of downtown. Community and Island transits offer general public transportation throughout the area.

Camano Gateway Bridge links Camano Island to the mainland, meaning visitors have no ferry lines or schedules to consider. State and county parks and walking trails lure visitors and residents to pastoral Camano Island.

Stanwood-Camano School District serves the joint community with two elementary schools on Camano and three elementary, two middle and one high school in Stanwood. The district also offers alternative education programs.

Average temperatures in the Stanwood-Camano Island area range from 32 to 80 degrees, with annual rainfall around 35 inches. A short visit to our community will have you feeling like a local in no time.







TRY THIS RECIPE!



Chicken Tikka Masala

Roasted marinated chicken simmered in a tomato and cream sauce with warm Indian spices served over basmati rice, enjoy!

- · 4 cloves garlic, pressed
- 1 T. freshly grated ginger (from a 1" piece)
- 2 1/2 tsp. garam masala
- 2 tsp. ground coriander
- 2 tsp. ground turmeric
- 11/2 tsp. ground cumin
- 1/3 c. plus 1 tbsp. tomato paste, divided
- · Kosher salt
- 1 c. plain whole milk yogurt
- 2 lb. boneless skinless chicken breasts
- 2 T. vegetable oil
- 1 med. yellow onion, finely chopped
- 1 to 3 fresh red chiles, seeded and finely chopped, or 1/2 tsp. crushed red pepper flakes
- 21/2 c. tomato puree
- 1/2 c. water
- 1 c. heavy cream
- 1/2 c. fresh cilantro leaves, finely chopped, plus more for garnish
- · Basmati rice for serving
- · Naan for serving, optional

SPICE PASTE: In a small bowl (with lid), stir together garlic, ginger, garam masala, coriander, turmeric, cumin, 1 tablespoon tomato paste, and 1/4 teaspoon salt until a paste forms; set aside.

MARINADE: In a medium bowl (with lid), whisk together the yogurt, 1/2 teaspoon salt, and half of spice paste until well combined; cover and refrigerate the remaining spice paste.

CHICKEN: Lay the chicken on a cutting board. Using a mallet, pound the chicken if necessary, so it's all about same thickness. Using a paring knife, make a few shallow slits in each breast. Add the chicken to the marinade bowl, turning to coat each side. Cover with a lid and refrigerate at least 30 minutes or up to 6 hours.

TOMATO CREAM SAUCE: Heat oil in a large pot over medium heat. Add the onions and chiles and cook, stirring often, until softened, about 5 to 7 minutes.

Add the remaining 1/3 cup tomato paste and cook, stirring constantly, until darkened, about 2 to 3 minutes.

Add the remaining spice paste and cook, stirring constantly, until fragrant, 2 to 3 minutes.

Stir in tomato puree and 1/2 cup water, scraping up any browned bits in bottom of pot. Bring to a simmer and cook, stirring often and reducing heat to low if needed to maintain a gentle simmer, until mixture thickens, about 10 to 12 minutes.

Stir in heavy cream and gently simmer, stirring frequently, until slightly thickened, about 8-10 minutes.

Meanwhile, preheat the oven to broil and place an oven rack 6-inches from heat. Line a rimmed baking sheet with foil and place a wire rack over the foil.


ROASTED CHICKEN: Transfer the chicken with marinade to the prepared sheet pan with rack and arrange in a single layer. Spoon any remaining marinade over the chicken. Broil until the chicken is mostly cooked and marinade has thickened and is golden in spots (chicken will not be fully cooked at this point), about 10 to 12

Remove the chicken to a cutting board and cut into bite-size chunks. Add the chicken and cilantro to the tomato mixture. Very gently simmer, stirring occasionally, until chicken is cooked through, about 5 to 8 minutes; season with 1/2 teaspoon salt.

Divide basmati rice among bowls. Spoon the chicken tikka masala alongside the rice. Top with cilantro and serve with naan if desired. Serves 6

Dungeness Crab Boil

Fresh caught Dungeness crab, baby red potatoes, corn on the cob, and Polska kielbasa boiled over an outdoor cooker! No need for plates, simply serve the crab boil on a newspaper-lined table and let everyone dig in!

- 4 T. kosher salt
- 1-2 T. cayenne pepper
- 1 Zatarain's Crab Boil in a bag
- 5-6 fresh whole Dungeness crabs, backs removed and broken in half
- 2 lbs. baby red potatoes
- · 4 ears corn, cleaned, cut into thirds
- 1 lb. Polska Kielbasa, cut into 1-inch pieces
- · Melted butter for dipping

- 1. Heat 3 quarts of water in a large pot over an outdoor cooker. Add salt, cayenne pepper and Zatarain's crab boil in a bag. Bring the water to a rolling boil.




