Install new weather barrier. Furnish a minimum 5-year manufacturer warranty to include Film Integrity, Chalk Rating, Fade Rating, and Perforation. GRHS Girls Basketball team celebrated their Section 7AAA Championship. Coach Hamling was named Section 7AAA Coach of the Year and Rich Kane named Asst. Coach of the Year. Team GPA = 3.8  
Principal Report - Matt Dass, Grand Rapids High School: Targeted Interventions (MTSS): Learning Recovery; Tier 1 Inventory of academically "at risk" students created; every student was voluntarily "taken" by a staff member. Staff checked in with students during hybrid and reset periods. Semester grades demonstrated 898 grades below 60% in classes (courses); normally about 300. Tier 1 results: 577 grades below 60%; additional 104 students issued a "P" after

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demonstrating the learning necessary to semester one earn credit. All students given additional two weeks to demonstrate learning; Teachers and students partnered to determine if adequate learning had occurred. Tier 2 Math and English Learning Recovery: New courses created; master schedule, student schedules disrupted, but 184/473 students in LR, Students given opportunity to recover first semester credit, while still pursuing second semester credit, 32 ELA students have earned "lost" credit; 3rd--> 6th grade reading levels (close reading & STAR assessments, Math data will need to be continually monitored; scaffolded learning model, Science and Social Studies will replicate these models; time and resource restrictions. Tier 3: Students remain in core classes and have opportunities to earn credit; students are taking advantage of support staff and supplementary learning & credit recovery; working with families and stakeholders. Student academic, attendance, and behavior data is reviewed regularly & students are delivered necessary supports. We want to keep kids in school -- we use all resources available to us to help students be successful. **More to Come:** Learning recovery has not been perfect; many positive components we can use in the future. We know kids will, and want to, come to school; most students attend online inconsistently. We need to maintain a high quality of student support: Revisited: Graduation timelines have been preserved, Students maintained access to counseling and referral services irrespective of learning model, Students are placed in academic settings necessary to succeed, College and career readiness has been maintained, Advanced (IB) and safety net courses have stayed effective and compliant, Data necessary to institute our MTSS and student support interventions has been delivered, Everything is a choice; we have gotten better at considering creative solutions to problems, and analyzing the best outcome. Our perception of possibility has changed! Graduation will take place but will look a little different. Noble Hall Field will likely be utilized with an indoor option in the event of inclement weather. A Senior Prom is scheduled for May 15 for the GRHS and ALC students in the GRHS gym. We are partnering with the Reef Center to meet occupancy requirements. The planning committee is ensuring a student driven event that includes dancing. School spirit week will lead up to prom. With an increase in cases in our community, mitigation efforts are a high priority.
