# TRY THESE OUTDOOR GAMES

#### 1 DOGGY, DOGGY, WHERE'S YOUR BONE

In this game, the child who is the Doggy turns around while someone steals his "bone". The bone can be any small object. When the Doggy turns around, all the children attempt to look guilty while Doggy guesses who stole the bone. With little ones, let them guess until they pick the right person, then its the next child's turn to be doggy. If you are playing with older kids, you can add a limit to guesses.

### **2** POURING STATION

This activity is simple, it's easy, and kids love it. Gather a large tote, different size containers, plastic measuring cups and food coloring. Fill the cups with colored water and let the kids go wild pouring the water into all the different cups. See what new colors they can create with the water.

## 3 KICKIN' CROQUET

Create a croquet course with pool noodles, then have the kids kick bouncy balls through the noodles. First, cut up different colored pool noodles, making sure they are long enough to create an arch to kick the balls through. Design your own croquet course with the arches and use garden stakes to secure them to the ground. To play, have the kids kick their balls through the course. Tally up points for the number of hoops passed or for the kid who gets through the course first. You could also call out colors and simply have them kick it through the ones that match what you've called out.

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
