Our educators have been busy advancing their own professional learning – from learning about STEAM using LEGO kits to developing literacy strategies for all students.



Student Mental Health Support

Just like physical health, mental health is essential for learning, growth, and success in school.

Helena Public Schools has expanded access to care with on-site mental health clinics now located at both high schools, both middle schools and several elementary schools.

These services are delivered in partnership with our trusted community providers:

- Elementary schools: Shodair Children's Hospital (Bryant, Central, Kessler, Warren) and AWARE (Broadwater)
- Middle schools: Pureview Health Center and Shodair (HMS), Indian Health Alliance and AWARE (CRA)
- High schools: PureView (CHS & PAL), Helena Indian Alliance (HHS)

The district continues to seek funding at the local, state and federal level to establish a full-scale, district-employed mental health team with enough therapists to meet the needs of every student and staff member at every school.

Mental Health Screening Services

Helena Public Schools uses a "Multi-Tiered System of Support" to help ensure your student's academic and social success.

Our mental health screening services match students with the type and level of support to best meet their needs. Through early intervention, we can help students stay focused on learning. Students are screened twice a year. Notification is sent to parents before each screening with the option to opt out.

The "Character Strong Student Needs" screener is used for **grades K-5** to assess academic and emotional strengths and behavior of students.

Students **grades 6-12** are screened with the RBHI (Rural Behavioral Health Institute) screening tool, which can help identify signs of depression, anxiety and suicidality. Students who would benefit from therapy are promptly linked with care, including same-day services for those with urgent needs. Learn more at www.rbhi.org.

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Why Libraries?

Helena Public School libraries play a crucial role in supporting students' academic success and personal growth. They provide access to a wide range of books, digital resources, and research tools that enrich learning across all subjects. Beyond academics, libraries foster a love for reading, critical thinking, and independent learning. They also offer a safe and comfortable space for students to explore their interests, collaborate on projects, and develop lifelong literacy skills. Certified teacher-librarians create environments that are hubs of curiosity, creativity, and knowledge and that contribute significantly to a well-rounded education.

Programs like “Book Pals” foster early literacy by connecting students with community volunteers in a supportive library setting. Across the district, initiatives such as World Read-Aloud Day, Adopt-a-Species, LEGO clubs, podcasting clubs and so much more energize young readers and build a lifelong passion for reading and learning.

Middle school and high school teacher-librarians are crucial to student success, extending far beyond simply managing books. They serve as vital literacy advocates, fostering a love of reading by curating diverse collections that reflect students' interests and experiences, and recommending books tailored to individual needs and reading levels.

Fine & Performing Arts

Helena Public Schools believes that a well-rounded education includes the fine and performing arts.

Helena Public Schools' arts programs not only enhance artistic skills but also promote critical thinking, collaboration, and cultural awareness – skills that will remain valuable throughout a student's life. For many, our arts education curriculum has served as the starting point to a career as a visual or performing artist. Our student musicians, thespians, photographers and other fine artists routinely earn top state and regional-level awards.

Visual Arts: Our visual arts curriculum spans from elementary through high school, offering experiences in drawing, painting, photography, ceramics, sculpture, digital arts, design and more. Students gain experience working in a variety of mediums and disciplines. 

Music: Music education is a cornerstone of our fine arts offerings. Beginning in elementary school, students can participate in general music classes, learning the basics of rhythm, melody, and harmony. As they progress, students have the opportunity to join band, orchestra, and choir. 

Theater: Our high school theater programs allow students to dive into the world of drama and stagecraft. From acting to technical theater skills, students gain a comprehensive understanding of what it takes to bring a production to life. Plays and musicals give students the opportunity to experience the dynamics of live performance.

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Academics & Student Success

Helena Public Schools offer rigorous academic programs designed to foster students’ future success whatever their plans hold – be it college, career, vocational training, military or other.

Beginning in kindergarten, student progress is tracked using state-of-the art data assessment tools. Teachers use these insights to tailor each child’s education to their specific needs – providing extra challenges or extra support where needed.

At the high school level, students are offered a wide range of honors and Advanced Placement (AP) courses across english, math, science and foreign languages.

Our curriculum and teaching practices are designed to help each student reach their full potential.

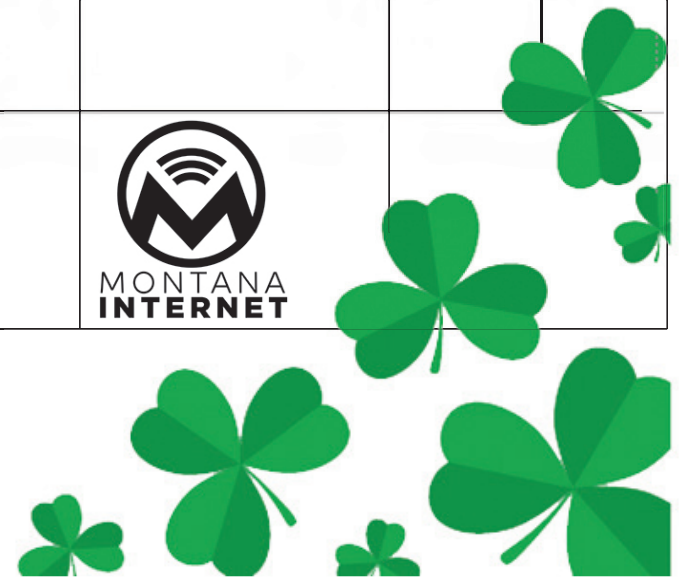

Special Education

Everything we do at Helena Public Schools is based on the belief that all children deserve the opportunity to reach their full potential. As our community’s public school system, it is our responsibility to meet the educational needs of all in accordance with the federal Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). Our district offers a rich array of programs to serve students with a diverse range of needs, beginning at age 3:

Special Education Pre-School

Serves children ages 3-5. To qualify, children must be significantly delayed in one or more areas.

Trailhead

Serves students in need of additional behavioral, communication and academic support.

Functional Life Skills Program

Support for students with significant cognitive delays, intensive physical needs or other needs requiring significant support.

Positive Behavioral Support Program

Support for students with intensive emotional and behavioral needs – designed to help students succeed academically and socially.

Therapeutic Learning Center (TLC)

A partnership with Shodair Children’s Hospital offering services for students needing intensive emotional and behavioral support.

Helena Public Schools therapists work throughout the district to give every child the opportunity to learn and thrive.

Please note that the clinics are intended to screen for areas of multiple concern. If you have concerns about your child’s speech and language development only, please contact your neighborhood school.

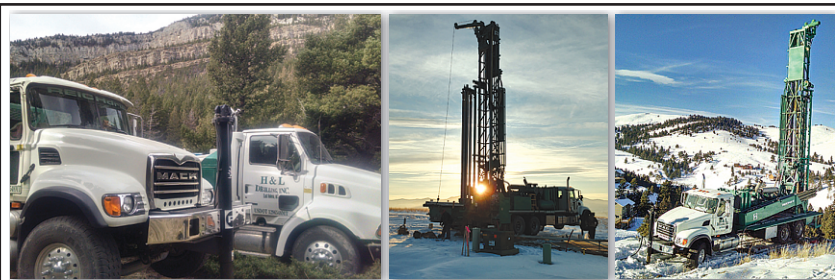


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School-Age Child Care - SACC

WEBSITE & SOCIAL MEDIA

Take a moment to bookmark our district website and follow us on Facebook & Instagram. Remember that emergencies can spawn rumors and misinformation. Be sure you're prepared to receive timely and accurate updates.

REFRAIN FROM CALLING OR VISITING

Please refrain from calling or visiting your child's school during an emergency. Phone lines, staff, and roads are needed for the response. Please avoid calling or texting your child during an emergency so they can focus on following safety instructions.



SEE SOMETHING? SAY SOMETHING.

Safe schools are everyone's responsibility. If you become aware of a potential safety threat, please report it immediately to a school official or law enforcement.

Lock in Place

Students and staff stay in their current locations within a building, with interior and exterior doors locked.

Activated For:

Suspicious persons, hallway disturbances or medical emergencies to ensure that emergency responders can access the affected individual without disruption.

Shelter in Place

Students and staff take immediate shelter and exterior doors are locked.

Activated For:

Potentially dangerous situations outside the school such as police activity in the school area.

Evacuation

Building is evacuated in instances where conditions are safer outside.

Activated For:

Fire, earthquake or other situations jeopardizing interior building safety.

Severe Weather

Conditions warrant keeping students inside and/or implementing alternate transportation plans.

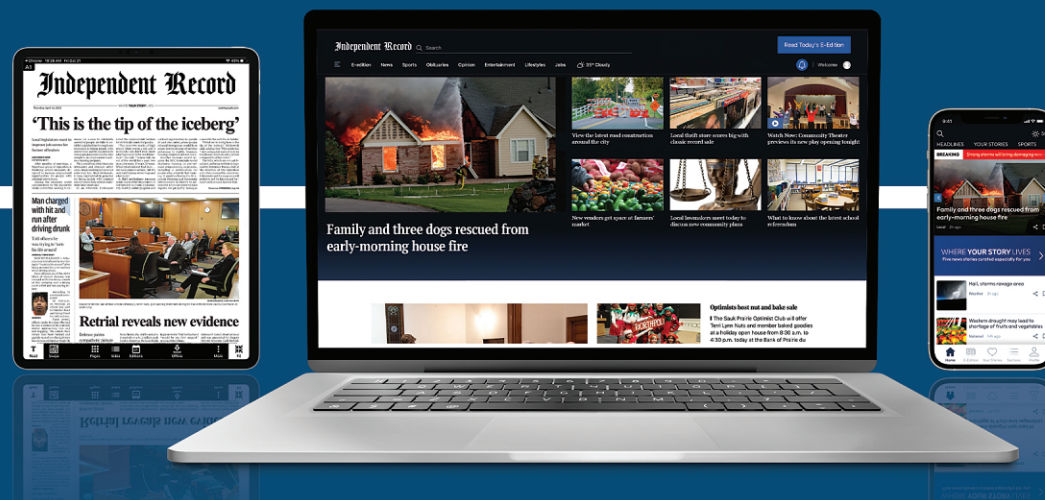
