

# Arntson brothers grateful to play together at Carroll

Troy and Ryan Arntson have done a lot together.

The 22- and 19-year-old grew up in Helena, cultivated a love of the outdoors, and played nearly every sport they could.

Yet, something remained.

The two never played on the same football team together — until this season.

“The season hasn’t exactly gone how we wanted,” Troy

Arntson said, referring to the Saints’ 1-5 record. “It’s still special being out there every day with him, having the privilege to play with him.”

Getting on the field together this season wasn’t a guarantee, for a few reasons.

Freshmen playing at Carroll is abnormal. That meant Ryan Arntson might be redshirting, especially considering Carroll had two successful and talented running backs in Ryan Walsh and Major Ali.

Ryan Arntson worked his

way into the rotation.

Many folks around Carroll College caught a glimpse of Ryan Arntson in the fall scrimmage when he ripped off an 80-yard run. It was the biggest play on the day and many people thought then that the freshman would see playing time.

Troy Arntson knew earlier. He saw it in practice.

Ryan Arntson started like most, if not all, freshman do at Carroll: on the scouting team. The Carroll

upperclassmen’s No. 2s matched up with the scouts’ No. 1s, which included Ryan Arntson.

“They gave him the ball and he got the edge and took it,” Troy Arntson said. “He could get five or six yards a pop. It was all things kind of combined that they probably said there was no way they could redshirt him.”

Since Arntson earned his way into the backfield,

alongside the veterans, the older Arntson has helped his younger brother expedite the learning curve. Ryan says he's made plenty of mistakes, a part of being a freshman.

"I screw up a lot because I'm a freshman," Ryan said. "(Troy's) always there to support me and explain things I could do better."

Troy Arntson redshirted his freshman year, giving him ample time to learn the playbook, practice habits and a new college schedule. Ryan had to pick up the playbook, jump in and get on the field and have an immediate impact.

"The hardest part for him, just like it was for me, was learning everything," Troy said. "He proved himself."

Troy's dropped tidbits of advice for his younger brother, but also admitted Ryan has been studious and mature all on his own too.

"I really encourage him when it's not his turn (in practice) to really pay attention so he can learn," Troy Arntson said. "I really have encouraged him to still pay attention and see what Major and Walsh are doing."

The fact the two brothers are playing on the same football team for the first time ever is serendipitous. The two had played on the same hockey team together four years ago, and had nearly reunited on the ice last season when Carroll started a club hockey team, but an injury kept Troy out during one of Carroll's game when Ryan played.

Troy knew Ryan deserved to go through the recruiting process – visiting schools, analyzing majors – without brotherly intervention. Ryan would arrive at his own decision without family or peer

# Freshman, redshirt freshman to guide their respective teams

On the heels of their most complete game of the season, the Carroll College Saints will look to break back into the win column this week against the Rocky Mountain College Battlin' Bears in Billings.

Rocky annihilated the Saints in the first go-round. Rocky came into Helena, bell

and all, and rang the Saints repeatedly, leaving with a 40-14 win. The Battlin' Bears were rewarded with their first win in Helena since 2000. In that game, Rocky built an early lead off of Carroll turnovers, and Jacob Bakken and Mason Melby started piling up rushing yards.

Bakken is out for the remainder of the season after suffering an ACL injury he

endured against Southern Oregon a few weeks ago.

Rocky's called on Drew Korf and in his first start last weekend against MSU-Northern, Korf led the Battlin' Bears to a 52-3 win, though most of the offensive fireworks came from running back Sam Sparks.

When Carroll and Rocky meet, a freshman and a red-shirt freshman quarterback

— both forced into action due to injuries to upperclassmen — will be guiding their respective teams.

Carroll gave redshirt freshman quarterback Reece Hiibel his first start of the season last weekend against No. 11 Montana Tech. Hiibel played well and helped rejuvenate a Carroll offense that sputtered

a weekend prior when Hiibel was originally forced into action. With a week of practice under his belt last weekend, Hiibel helped Carroll's offense pick up 19 first downs, compared to just six the game prior against the College of Idaho.

Though the Saints didn't find the end zone as much as they would have liked, they had opportunities, which is encouraging for a 1-5 team.

Other aspects to watch for the Saints will be the continued development of true freshman running back Ryan

Arntson. Arntson has been mixed into a backfield that divvies up carries between himself Major Ali and Ryan Walsh. Last weekend against Montana Tech, Arntson led the Saints in rushing yards with 61 on nine carries. His long of 15 yards was the longest run in the game.

Carroll's run defense and pass rush came alive against Montana Tech, though the Orediggers still finished with 398 yards passing. Carroll held Tech to 41 total yards rushing, and sacked quarterback Quinn McQueary five times, two of those coming from Craig Kein.

Carroll defensive back Drew Melton continues to put together an impressive season. Melton is No. 3 in the

nation with passes defended per game with 2.2 per contest. Last week against Tech, Melton batted down a game-high three balls.

Rocky meanwhile is looking for its first winning season since 2013 when it 7-3, finishing runner-up to the Saints. The Battlin' Bears are currently about plus 16 in points scored versus how much they give up, which is second only to Montana Tech's plus 20. The Bears score 34 points per game and allow 18. In its two losses, Rocky has lost by a combined seven points.

All of this is coming in the first year under head coach Jason Petrino, who played and coached at Carroll College for years.

While Carroll isn't interested in spoiling Rocky's season — the Saints simply want to put some wins together — Carroll finds itself in unfamiliar territory entering the game: as an underdog and looking for its first road win of the season.

The Bears' defense is led by Keegan Fagan's five interceptions, which ranks No. 2 in the NAIA, and Terrance Williams' four picks, ranking No. 7 in the nation. Ryder Rice adds 6.5 sacks to the defense, which is No. 8 in the NAIA.

Rocky enters the game with the Top rushing offense in the conference, averaging 238 yards per game. Rocky also owns the best defense in the conference, giving up an average of 21 points per game.

pressure. Ryan visited Carroll Montana Tech and Montana Western, giving each school its due diligence.

After all, the brothers said, they've never been in a sibling fight. They weren't about to argue over college choices. They didn't need to.

Ryan signed his letter of intent to Carroll College last December, and the two brothers were reunited.

The pair had never played football together before. Troy was a senior at Helena High when Ryan was a freshman, meaning the pair didn't get a chance to play for their father Tony. Troy was firmly entrenched as a wide receiver for the Bengals by then – rotating to the position after playing quarterback most of his life – and Ryan was beginning to work his way up through the freshman team.

Troy knew his little brother would be good. Ryan, after all, had been faster than his age group most steps of athletic competition. Whether it was football, baseball, basketball, hockey or track, Troy knew his little brother was really, really good. The first season Ryan competed against the rest of the state in AA for the Bengals really stood out for Troy.

"When he was on the varsity team that first year, it was very impressive," Troy said. "He's so explosive. That's when I knew he had a chance to play college football at running back."

The reunion has been bittersweet, at least early on this season. Troy has nursed a hamstring injury he suffered during two-a-days. He endured the injury, took a week off, and came back to play against Montana Tech. In the second series of the game, it flared up. Two more weeks on the sideline, Troy tried his

bum leg again against MSU-Northern, but once again it tightened on him. After the bye week, with extra time off, Arntson has worked back into a healthy lather, and the Arntsons have finally been on the field together.

They've played enough snaps together that it's hard for them to put a number on how many they've shared.

Troy has been one of a handful of major contributors who have lost part of all of their seasons to injuries. Arntson and his cohort at receiver, last year's top target Connor Fohn, both have worked through hamstring injuries, but Fohn's hasn't healed like Arntson's did, causing the Saints and Fohn to shut the playmaker down for the season. The Saints have lost other receivers and players on defense.

Two weeks ago, the Saints lost starting quarterback Tanner Gustavsen after he broke his left hand. The injuries, in part, have pushed the Saints out to a 1-5 record this season.

"This has been one of those years," Troy Arntson said. "A lot of people look around

and wonder what's going on. Our team is great and we're going to stick together. I'm thankful for everyone we have on our team. We're going to battle through it and I think everyone is buying in. That's awesome to see."

While it may not be the perfect reunion, it's still been special for the Arntsons to share the field.

"I love it," Troy said.

Troy thought, paused, and couldn't quite recall when it was Ryan took a serious interest in sports. He knows this for sure: "Ry Ry" – as Troy and many call him – did not humor his brother's requests to have a toss when the pair was younger. Troy Boy, or T-Cat, as Ryan calls Troy, loved sports and took them seriously from a very young age. It wasn't until middle school that Ryan felt the same passion.

"He could get on my nerves," Troy said, laughing. "He never really was into it at that time. I can't remember the turning point, but he did flip the switch. He really bought in. I think that was the greatest part to see. It's much more than sports with

the relationship we have. I love going out and hunting and doing a bunch of stuff with him."

Watching his brother go from relatively ambivalent toward sports, to dominating games and setting records at Helena High left Troy feeling a sense of pride.

Ryan remembers the exact moment that proverbial switch flipped.

In 2010, Tony Arntson coached his Helena High Bengals into the state AA championship game. Those Bengals fell to Bozeman in a matchup pitting the No. 1 Hawks against the No. 2 Bengals, but it resonated with Ryan, who watched the game and says he remembers the exact moment. Ryan pondered what it took for the Bengals to get to the championship game, and realized he wanted to help them get back there some day.

"I liked that feeling," Ryan said. "I wanted to get there. I wanted to be successful in sports."

Now, together with Carroll College, the Arntsons share the field – Troy Boy and Ry Ry and the fightin' Saints.

the Frontier this season, with its closest contest coming in week one against Rocky Mountain College. Last weekend, though, the Battlin' Bears showed week one may have been an anomaly, romping to a 52-3 win over the Lights. Aside from the first two weeks of the season, and a non-conference win over Mayville State, the Lights have not scored 14 points or more in the last month, and have not scored more than a single touchdown in those same games.

Last time meeting: MSU-N got out to a lead back on Sept. 9, but Montana Tech came storming back to win 70-27. The Lights will need a nearly flawless scheme to pull off the upset in Butte this time around.

## College of Idaho (3-4) at No. 7 Southern Oregon (6-0)

Recent games: College of Idaho is coming off an encouraging 59-27 win over Montana Western, the only team in the conference to defeat Montana Tech this season. The win also gave the Coyotes their first win streak of the season, as they had defeated Carroll 21-6 the week prior. The Coyotes' 59 points were by far the most points they had scored this season. The next highest total came in a 28-20 win against Eastern Oregon on Sept. 16. Southern Oregon, for the second time this season, played a tight battle against Eastern Oregon, needing three touchdowns in the fourth quarter to pull out the rally. The Raiders

have been in close contests the past two weeks, narrowly defeating the Mountaineers after barely knocking off Rocky Mountain College, 24-23.

Last time meeting: Southern Oregon went into Caldwell and took a 20-14 lead after halftime, and then put up 21 more points in the second half to come away with a 41-25 win. Both of those wins relied heavily on Raiders quarterback Tanner Trosin, whose 347 passing yards per game ranks No. 5 nationally.

## Eastern Oregon (2-4) at Montana Western (3-4)

Recent games: Western is perhaps the most peculiar team in the Frontier over the past two weeks. The Bulldogs knocked off the top team in the conference two weekends ago, defeating Montana Tech 42-35. Then, last weekend, Western fell 59-27 to College of Idaho, a team that had not scored that many points this season. Last weekend's result spoiled what looked like the beginning of a run for the Bulldogs. Eastern Oregon hasn't been able to string consecutive wins together this season, falling last weekend to Southern Oregon 31-27. The encouraging part of the loss for the Mountaineers is they stayed within a touchdown of the best team in the conference, but it's little consolation for a team that made the playoffs a season ago. Eastern Oregon now possesses wins over Montana Western and Montana State-Northern, muddying the waters of how good the Mountaineers are.

Last time meeting: Eastern prevailed over Montana Western 27-24 back on Sept. 10.
