Big changes are coming to the intersection of North Montana Avenue and Last Chance Gulch here in Helena.

That corner will be the home of an all-new Farmers State Bank, tentatively scheduled to open in 2020. It is being touted as a "bank of the future;" a nontraditional space with a community vibe, designed by SMA Architects of Helena. Jackson Contractor Group has been retained to build the new facility. This full-service location will include drivethrough banking, safe deposit boxes and ATM. A groundbreaking ceremony will take place at the site in late spring 2019.

FSB's vision is that their new location will not simply be a financial institution, but also become a gathering center for the community. The new structure will include ample open seating and tenant space for a coffee shop and taproom/dram shop. Farmers State Bank has been Montana owned and locally operated since they opened their doors in Victor, Montana in 1907. Since that time they've continued to grow, never losing sight of their philosophy of **putting the customer first.**

The Bank has already embraced a nontraditional approach at their Missoula location on North Reserve Street, which houses a coffee shop complete with free wi-fi, as well as indoor and outdoor seating, making for a much livelier space than a typical stand-alone branch bank.

Farmers State Bank opened a Helena

branch at 1040 Partridge Place in December of 2017, headed by Montana native Travis Brazill as Market President.

Odegaard Miller Law opens office in Helena

Odegaard Miller Law provides legal counsel in cases of personal injury and workers compensation matters.

against Odegaard and his colleague A.J. Miller. Both Dufrechou and Wallace are anchored in Helena so in order to bring them on board, Odegaard had to go to them.

"It's not an overstatement to say that anybody in the work comp world in Montana knows who Jay is," Odegaard said. "They know how smart he is, how good he is. He is universally recognized with respect and admiration. When we had the opportunity to expand and bring him under the tent, so to speak, it was a no-brainer.

"When we heard (Wallace) was relocating to Helena, it made sense to see if he wanted to fight for justice on the right side of the fight. To work with them is amazing."

The firm has grown to be one of the largest in number of staff, as well as number of caseloads.

In February 2019, Odegaard made Miller partner and they formed Odegaard Miller Law.

The nation's leader in small assisted living has a place in Helena for retired folks who no longer are able to be or wish to be on their own.

BeeHive Homes offers living space for people that allows them to age in place with category A B and C facilities on the same campus. The residential setting is owned by Jeff Humphrey and his wife Dori, they purchased the business one and a half years ago when it was Aspen Gardens.

Under new ownership and operating under a new concept, there is space for 65 residents in a variety of arrangements. There is a fourplex of independent living space, assisted care apartments and a memory care facility.

There are numerous couples apartments and suites for people who wish to live together or room together to save on cost. And the categories of care, levels A B and C, allow people to age in place.

"We're not a nursing home," Humphrey said. "But this means they can stay through the end of their life."

A-level care means residents don't need much assistance while C-level care means they require much more assistance and memory care.

BeeHive is a home-like setting with more amenities than are available at home.

"We want it to feel like a home," Humphrey said. "Not a hospital and it's not institutional living. It's small for a purpose, we offer everything."

There is a staff dietician who prepares three meals a day, a full-time nurse, on-site beauty salon, transportation, organized outings and activities.

The owners are involved daily and interact and care about the residents. Humphrey takes the gentlemen out for what they have dubbed Romeo days. This stands for really old men eating out. His wife takes the ladies out for pie. There is something called a spotlight dinner, during which a resident is the guest of honor and their family and friends are invited over for a special meal and drinks. The highlight is a biographical story about that resident after dinner.

The owners are local and the residents are treated as neighbors. Humphrey is a physical therapist by trade. While he still practices on a limited basis, his focus is on BeeHive. Everyone is hands on and the staff ratio to residents is higher than at most residential care facilities. This is something of which he is most proud. He feels that in many cases seniors have given their time and care, probably changed a few diapers, and this is their time to get back some of what they have given over their lifetime.

"We know the residents by name and we want them to have great care," Humphreys said. "We did this because we feel seniors get the short end of the stick. So many people don't have time to take care of their mom or dad; we want people to come here and be recognized and treated well."
