

# How drivers can stay safe in bright conditions

Weather often contributes to motor vehicle accidents. Snow, rain and other factors that compromise drivers' vision can make driving hazardous, but there's a dark side to sunny skies as well.

Glare from the sun can compromise drivers' vision and lead to driving mishaps, regardless of drivers' experience or skill level. The sun can pack a powerful punch any time during the day, but can be especially hazardous in the early morning sunrise and lateafternoon sunset.

A 2017 study published in the journal Medicine titled, "Life-threatening motor vehicle crashes in bright sunlight" looked at the risks posed by bright sunlight. Researchers found that the risk of a life-threatening crash was 16 percent higher during bright sunlight than during normal weather. Researchers concluded that bright sunlight may create visual illusions that lead to driver error, including poor distance judgement.

Plentiful sunlight is often a hallmark of spring and summer, but sun-blindness is a real concern for drivers. As anyone who has turned into blazing sun only to discover their windshield has been rendered opaque by sun glare can attest, driving on sunny days can be challenging. Unfortunately, the sun might create substantial glare during rush hour, making driving during these times more dangerous and accidents more likely.

While there might be no way to prevent glare, drivers can take steps to make driving safer during times of day when glare is prevalent.

- · Make sure the windshield is clean. Water marks, dead insects, cracks, and road grime can make it even harder to see out of the windshield when the sun is blazing. Clean windshields regularly, and don't wait until you're head-on into the sun to engage the windshield washer spray. Doing so may only further compromise visibility.
- · Observe speed limits. When glare is present, slow down and keep more space between your vehicle and the vehicle in front of you. If someone in front of you needs to brake suddenly, the greater distance between vehicles can give you more time to react and avoid accidents.
- $\cdot$  Change your route. Try changing your commute so you're not

driving head-on into eastern sun in the morning and western sun in the afternoon.

- · Invest in new sunglasses. Special lenses that mitigate glare, UV rays and blue light can make it easier for drivers to handle glare when behind the wheel.
- · Make sure the visor is functioning. Sun visors are there for a reason. Use it to the best of your ability, angling as needed.
- · Pull over. If the glare is especially bad, Plymouth Rock Assurance suggests playing it safe and pulling over until the sun rises or sets. You also may want to change your driving time to avoid the glare.

Motor vehicle accidents can happen on bright, sunny days. Glare can compromise drivers' visibility, and drivers may need to take steps to protect their vision on sunny days.




### PUT AWAY THE DEVICE

last minute to swerve into a left lane. They may see the emergency vehicle at the last minute and be forced to make a quick decision. Be mindful of how other drivers may react to certain situations and you'll increase your chances of staying safe on the roads.

# Distracted Driving By the Numbers

In 2016, the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration reported 3,450 people died in distraction-affected crashes. Here are other key stats from the NHTSA's study — remember them when you take the wheel to ensure the safety of yourself and your passengers.

More than 90% of car crashes involve human error.

About 391,000 additional people were injured in dis-tractionaffected crashes in 2015, down from 431,000 in 2014.

Some of the study's data showed an improvement in driver safety, specifically in the category of accidents caused by distracted driving:

The percentage of drivers likely to be on either hand-held or hands-free cell phones decreased from 11% in 2007 and 2008 to 9% starting in 2009 and continuing through 2012 before steadily declining to 5.3% in 2017.

The corresponding hand-held cell phone use estimate also has

dropped from 5.2% of drivers in 2012 to 2.9% of drivers in 2017. The percent of drivers manipulating hand-held electronic devices has increased 900%, from 0.2% in 2005 to 2.0% in 2016, how-

ever, the manipulation of hand-held devices has now decreased for two consecutive years.


### STAYING SAFE

The key to maintaining your safe driving record is focus. The more alert and attentive you can be on the road, the better your chances of arriving to your destination in one piece.

Don't forget, devices are just one of many driving distractions. Interacting with passengers, reading directions or eating food are all examples of activities that take your eyes off the road. The safest drivers are those who pay attention to their surroundings and take their driving responsibilities seriously.

### **FOLLOW THE SIGNS**

It's not enough to simply follow speed limits and be aware of the vehicles in front of and around you. To enhance your safety, you also need to pay close attention to the road signs and local traffic rules in the area. Speed limit signs are there for a reason. Going over them can cause you to lose control of your vehicle when maneuvering through sudden, sharp curves, uneven surfaces or construction hazards.



# Pets and Cars

As fun as a good pet road trip can be, there are certain measures to remember as you try to be the safest driver possible.

Many states have laws in place that could lead to a citation if you're found driving with your pet in your lap. According to Parade magazine, Hawaii has a law that against it.

Other states like New Jersey also fine drivers for operating a vehicle with an unrestrained animal aboard. Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Hampshire and Rhode Island have language in various laws that prohibits driving with an animal in your lap.

#### **NEVER LEAVE** YOUR PET PARKED

Hundreds of pets die each year from heat exhaustion because they are left in parked vehicles. According to the American Veterinary Medical Association, the temperature inside your vehicle can rise almost 20 degrees Fahrenheit in just 10 minutes. In 20 minutes, it can rise almost 30 degrees.

If you are delayed in a store or run into someone you know, this time can add up quickly for your pet. All of a sudden, a quick run into the store turns

into a longer time period that could potentially harm your pet. If it's too hot for you to comfortably sit in a parked car with no air conditioning, it's too hot for your pet.

#### BUCKLE THEM UP

Just as you should always wear your seatbelt, your pet should always be properly restrained while in the vehicle. That means using a secure harness or a carrier.

Why is this so important? A loose pet can be a major distraction to your driving or get stuck under a seat. They could also be injured or killed by the airbag if sitting in your lap during an accident. Unrestrained pets could also be thrown through windows or windshields in a collision.


#### **AVOID PICKUP** TRUCK BEDS

There are many dangers associated with letting your pet ride in the bed of a pickup truck. Dogs can fall or jump from the truck bed and be injured or killed on impact. They could also be struck by another vehicle if they fell out of the bed.

The American Veterinary Medical Association recommends using a secured and appropriately sized and ventilated dog kennel if you must travel with them in the bed of your truck. This will keep them secure as you drive around

# Fluids to check before your next road trip

For many traveling enthusiasts, few things are more enticing than the open road. Road trips have long been popular, and that popularity appears to be on the rise.

According to a report from MMGY Global, a travel and hospitality marketing firm, road trips represented 39 percent of vacations taken by United States travelers in 2016. Road trips also remain popular in Canada, where vast, rugged terrain makes for idyllic trips.

Before embarking on road trips, motorists would be wise to inspect their vehicles to ensure their getaways are not derailed by car troubles.

• Brake fluid: Squeaky brakes are not the only potential indicator of brake problems. Brake fluid, which should always be

topped off before beginning a road trip, also might shed light on potentially serious problems. According to the National Motorists Association, brake fluid looks honey-like and translucent when fresh. A puddle beneath a vehicle that is clear to brown and slick indicates a brake fluid leak, which can ultimately lead to a complete failure of the brakes. The NMA recommends brake fluid be changed at least once every three to four years.

• Transmission fluid: When fresh, transmission fluid is red

• Transmission fluid: When fresh, transmission fluid is red, darkening over time. However, transmission fluid should never appear brown or black, which indicates potential internal damage to the transmission. To determine if there are any issues with the transmission fluid, the NMA recommends drivers wipe a cool dipstick between their thumb and index finger. If even the slightest bit of grit is felt when wiping the dipstick, the transmission is likely in need of work.

• Oil: Drivers should change their vehicles' oil before embarking on road trips, especially if such trips will be lengthy. The NMA notes that fresh oil is light to dark amber and translucent, and that is how oil typically looks immediately after an oil change. Oil darkens over time, and that is natural (black oil indicates it's time for an oil change). However, oil that appears cloudy or milky indicates that coolant is getting into the oil, perhaps due to gasket problems. Drivers who are not getting their vehicles' oil changed before a road trip should at least check their oil before leaving to inspect the color of the oil and ensure the vehicle has enough oil.

• Windshield washer fluid: The unknown of the open road is part of what makes it so appealing. While many road trippers plan their trips during the summer and fall when the weather tends to be both pleasant and predictable, there's no guarantee inclement weather won't rear its ugly head. Filling the windshield washer fluid reservoir before embarking on a trip ensures drivers' visibility won't be adversely affected by unforeseen issues that can soil windshields.

Checking fluids before embarking on a road trip can help drivers avoid breakdowns and ensure a safe, fun trip.
