JACK CREEK PRESERVE FOUNDATION OUTDOOR SKILLS CAMPS

We host summer camps for youth ages 11-16 to learn a variety of outdoor skills in a wilderness setting. The camps include classes like archery, fly fishing, elk ecology, wildlife tracking, water ecology, mapping and orienteering, outdoor cooking, photography, shelter building, and other activities to enhance their enjoyment of the outdoors. Special speakers provide discussion and activities on topics such as astronomy, Montana raptors, being bear aware, and noxious weeds. Campers bring their own camping equipment and stay in tents for the duration of the camp. All classes and activities are held outside. Scholarships are available through our scholarship application. Archery Skills Camp

During the Archery Skills Camp, campers will pursue their Bowhunter Education Certification. Campers will learn skills such as shot placement, equipment care, tree stand set up, and safety. Campers also learn about the importance of ethics, wildlife and natural resources management,

and field dressing techniques. This camp is perfect for future hunting conservationists or those who are looking to build on their existing outdoor skills. MONTANA NATURAL RESOURCES YOUTH CAMP

July 13-18

We invite youth ages 14-18 and 13 (if graduated



from eighth grade) to spend one week in the rustic setting of Lubrecht Experimental Forest east of Missoula and learn about Montana's natural resources. The accommodations are comfortable, the food is great, and the instruction and friendships are the best.

Campers learn about forests, streams, soils, geology, range land, wildlife, and recreation, and spend a half-day rafting the Alberton Gorge of the Clark Fork River. In between the field sessions, taught largely by professionals that volunteer from a variety of natural resources based agencies and industries, specialty evening programs, guest speakers, hands-on learning-through-

discovery, and campfires provide for a lasting summer camp experience. Student teams also compete in a Land-Use-Game where they manage a 3,800 acre ranch for 20 years. As in real life teams must make hard choices between profits and conservation ethics, especially if they face poor commodity prices.
